**General Edwin G. Lee - Confederate Military Commissions
A Complete Set of Commissions from 1st Lt. to Brig. General**

2 Gen. Edwin G. Lee - 7 Confederate Military Commissions - complete. Extremely rare, documenting a Confederate general's rise in ranks as follows:

Virginia Militia commission as 1st Lt. of the 55th Virginia Regiment, signed by Governor John Letcher.

Virginia Volunteer Forces as Major of the 10th Virginia Regiment,

Confederate States commission as Lt. Col. of the 33rd Virginia Regiment, signed by James Seddon - Secretary of War,

Confederate States commission as Lt. Col. in Adj't. Gen'l's Department to report for duty to Brig. Gen'l Rains,

Confederate States commission as Major - Assistant Adjutant General,


Confederate States commission as Colonel of Cavalry assigned to Maj. Gen'l Elzey's Command,

Confederate States commission as Brigadier General to command Reserve Forces in the Valley District of Virginia.

Accompanied by three manuscript directives, as follows: July 27, 1861 to report for duty to Gen. J.E. Johnston at Manassas; December 31, 1862 resignation as colonel of the 33rd Virginia is accepted by the President; July 21, 1863 CS Navy Department resignation as Acting Master in the Navy of the Confederate States is accepted by the Secretary of the Navy.

Also accompanied by his calling card 'Brig. Gen'l Lee - C.S. Army' (for use in Canada), as well as his pay voucher as a brigadier general, signed and dated at Staunton, Va. Oct. 31, 1864 by the paymaster. Altogether 12 items, consecutively documenting Gen. E.G. Lee's rise in rank, most with notations on verso by Gen. Lee. I can find no record of another consecutive run of a Confederate general's commissions ever having been offered before. Unique - Historical (12)

Know You, That from special trust and confidence reposed in your fidelity, courage and good conduct, our GOVERNOR, in pursuance of the authority vested in him by the Constitution and Laws of this Commonwealth, doth commission you a First Lieutenant of Light Infantry in the 5th Regiment of the 16th Brigade and third Division of the VIRGINIA MILITIA, to rank as such from the ninth day of June 1860

In testimony WHEREOF, I have hereunto signed my name as Governor, and caused the seal of the Commonwealth to be affixed, this 18th day of June 1860.
