TO ALL MEN IN UNIFORM:

THIS TIME WE'LL BEGIN WITH NEWS OF THE CAMPUS. FIRST OF ALL, YOU'LL WANT TO KNOW WHAT HAPPENED TO THE REGULAR WOFFORD STUDENTS (LESS THAN THREE HUNDRED OF THEM NOW) WHEN THE ARMY AIR FORCE TOOK OVER THE FACILITIES OF THE COLLEGE FOR ITS SPECIALIZED TRAINING COURSE. WELL, THE FRESHMEN AND SOPHOMORES ARE AT SPARTANBURG JUNIOR COLLEGE (FORMERLY T.I.I.). DR. SNYDER (AMERICAN LITERATURE), DR. WALLER (CHEMISTRY), DR. CHILES (GERMAN), PROFESSOR TRAWICK (BIBLE), AND PROFESSOR SALMON (SPANISH). ARE TEACHING THE WOFFORD STUDENTS THERE. THE JUNIORS AND SENIORS ARE AT CONVERSE COLLEGE (THEY ARE ROOMING IN PRIVATE HOMES). BOTH GROUPS ARE ADJUSTING THEMSELVES TO THEIR NEW ROUTINES, THOUGH THEY ARE A LITTLE LONESOME FOR THE OLD CAMPUS, EVEN (AS ONE BOY PUT IT) FOR THE CONSTANT TRAIN SMOKE AND THE NOISE OF THE SHIFTING ENGINES! THE ROTC IS STILL IN OPERATION WITH LT.-COL GRIMMER, LT. CULLER, AND SERGEANT STEWARD IN CHARGE.

FACULTY MEMBERS — THOSE THAT LIVE ON THE CAMPUS — ARE LEARNING SOME NEW SONGS — SOMEWHAT EARLIER IN THE MORNING THAN THEY ARE ACCUSTOMED TO! YOU KNOW WHAT THE SONGS ARE AND WHO SINGS THEM: "THE ARMY AIR CORPS SONG", "ROLL OUT THE BARREL", "I'VE GOT SIX PENCE" (OR IS IT "TUPPENCE"), "ALOUETTE", AND A NUMBER OF OTHERS. WE MISS THE REGULAR STUDENTS HERE ON THE CAMPUS, JUST AS WE MISSED YOU WHEN YOU LEFT US, BUT THE AAF GROUP IS A BRIGHT-EYED, EAGER LOT WHO COME TO US FROM AS FAR SOUTH AS MISSISSIPPI, AS FAR NORTH AS MICHIGAN, AND AS FAR EAST AS NEW YORK.

#### PHYSICAL CHANGES ON THE CAMPUS

THE "JOLLY" CANTEEN IN THE BASEMENT OF THE ROTC BUILDING HAS BECOME THE "PX", THE INFIRMARY HAS BEEN MOVED TO THE BRICK HOUSE NEXT TO CARLISLE HALL (PROFESSOR AND MRS. SALMON WILL MOVE TO THE OLD INFIRMARY), VOLLEY BALL COURTS ARE BEING CONSTRUCTED ON THE OLD TENNIS COURTS, OUTDOOR BASKETBALL COURTS ARE BEING CONSTRUCTED BACK OF THE FIELD HOUSE, NEW EQUIPMENT IS INSTALLED IN THE FIELD HOUSE, PROFESSOR SHULER'S MECHANICAL DRAWING ROOM HAS BEEN CONVERTED INTO A PHYSICS LABORATORY, THE OLD Y.M.C.A. BUILDING MAY BE USED AS A RECREATION HALL, AND THE BACK PART OF THE SECOND AND THIRD FLOORS OF SNYDER HALL IS BEING CONVERTED INTO BARRACKS-STYLE ROOMS (THE PARTITIONS ARE BEING TORN OUT SO THAT FOUR ROOMS ARE MADE INTO ONE). THAT, IN A NUTSHELL, IS WHAT HAS HAPPENED THUS FAR.

THAT'S RIGHT; HE'S THE SONE OF A METHODIST MINISTER AND UNTIL RECENTLY WAS HEAD OF THE HISTORY DEPARTMENT AT COLUMBIA COLLEGE, HE IS AN ALUMNUS OF WOFFORD.

MR. R. M. COOPER, OF THE PHYSICS DEPARTMENT, HAS BEEN TEACHING THE CPT GROUP HERE FOR SEVERAL MONTHS.

MR. W. E. TURNER, ALSO OF THE PHYSICS DEPARTMENT, IS AN ALUMNUS OF WOFFORD AND FOR TWO YEARS HAS BEEN TEACHING THE CPT GROUP.

MR. W. F. MOBLEY, OF THE MATHEMATICS DEPARTMENT, WAS SUPERINTENDENT OF THE FAIRFOREST HIGH SCHOOL UNTIL HE RECENTLY JOINED THE FACULTY OF THE AVIATION UNIT.

MR. FRANK MCCULLOUGH, OF THE PHYSICAL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT, IS WILL KNOWN TO SPORTS FOLLOWS OF THIS SECTION.

#### THE ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF

MR. J. K. DAVIS ("J.K." TO YOU) HAS BEEN APPOINTED COLLEGE REPRESENTATIVE TO WORK WITH THE GOVERNMENT IN ALL NON-ACADEMIC MATTERS. MISS EDNA BLAKE, FORMERLY AT CLEMSON COLLEGE, HAS BEEN ADDED TO THE TREASURER'S STAFF. MR. P. D. SMITH, FORMERLY MANAGER OF THE GRESHAM HOTEL AND LATER CONNECTED WITH THE CLEVELAND HOTEL, WILL BE SUPERINTENDENT OF BUILDINGS, GROUNDS, AND SUPPLIES, WITH SERGEANT P. K. FULLERTON (RETIRED) AS MESS SERGEANT.

#### THE LAST CHAPEL FOR THE REGULAR STUDENTS

DR. A. M. DUPRE, HEAD OF THE MATHEMATICS DEPARTMENT AND FORMER DEAN, SPOKE TO THE STUDENTS BY SPECIAL REQUEST AT THEIR LAST FORMAL CHAPEL ON THE 20TH OF FEBRUARY BEFORE THEY MOVED TO CONVERSE AND THE JUNIOR COLLEGE. HIS ADDRESS: "THE WOFFORD HERITAGE", HAD A PROFOUND EFFECT UPON THOSE WHO HEARD IT. WE WISH WE HAD ROOM TO QUOTE ALL OF IT, BUT WE HAVEN'T. HERE IS HIS CONCLUSION. AFTER LISTING AND DISCUSSING THE QUALITIES THAT OUGHT TO DISTINGUISH WOFFORD MEN, DR. DUPRE CONCLUDED WITH THESE WORDS: "BY ALL THE YEARS OF WOFFORD'S HISTORY, YOU ARE COMMITTED TO A LOVE FOR A HIGH STANDARD OF SCHOLARSHIP, TO COURTESY AND GALLANT, GENTLEMANLY CONDUCT, TO THE HIGH MOTIVE OF SERVICE TO OTHERS, TO A WILLINGNESS TO TAKE WHATEVER FALLS TO YOU IN YOUR LINE OF DUTY, AND ENDURE TO THE END. YOU WILL NOT FORGET, YOU WILL BE MINDFUL OF YOUR ALMA MATER."

THE WHOLE CHAPEL SERVICE WAS VERY MOVING. WHEN THE STUDENTS MARCHED OUT AT THE CLOSE OF THE SERVICE, THERE WAS NO JOSTLING IN THE AISLES, NO MURMUR OF VOICES — ONLY THE MEASURED FOOTFALLS OF THE STUDENTS AND THE STRAINS OF THE ALMA MATER, PUNCTUATED AT REGULAR INTERVALS BY THE TRADITIONAL WORDS: "THE SENIORS MAY GO", "THE JUNIORS MAY GO", "THE SOPHOMORES MAY GO", "THE FRESHMEN MAY GO".

#### THE FIRST CHAPEL FOR THE AVIATION CADETS

MARCHING IN DOUBLE FILE UP THE HISTORIC STONE STEPS ON THE MAIN BUILDING AT WOFFORD COLLEGE, APPROXIMATELY 250 AVIATION CADETS COMPRISING THE FIRST CONTINGENT OF MEN TO BE SENT TO THE COLLEGE UNDER THE ARMY'S WAR SPECIALIZED TRAINING PROGRAM ENTERED THE CHAPEL FOR THE FORMAL OPENING EXERCISES AT TEN O'CLOCK ON THE MORNING OF MARCH 9. DR. GREENE PROCEEDED AND INTRODUCED THE VARIOUS SPEAKERS, INCLUDING GENERAL DUNWOOD S. WILSON, COMMANDING OFFICER AT CAMP CROFT; CAPT. A. N. HEXTER, COMMANDANT OF THE WOFFORD AVIATION UNIT; MAYOR THOMPSON, REPRESENTATIVES OF THE VARIOUS CHURCHES; AND DR. SNYDER, WHO SPOKE FOR THE FACULTY. IN CONCLUSION, DR. GREENE WELCOMED THE CADETS AND TOLD THEM THEY WERE NOW A PART OF WOFFORD COLLEGE AND THAT THE COLLEGE WAS HERE TO SERVE THEM AND THE NATION.

HE HAD PREVIOUSLY BEEN PROMOTED FROM FIRST TO SECOND LIEUTENANT FOR GALLANTRY IN ACTION. (CLASSMATES WILL REMEMBER "WES" AGGRESSIVE PLAYING AT END ON THE FOOTBALL TEAM, AS WELL AS THE TIME HE MADE THE FRONT PAGE OF THE HERALD BY KNOCKING OUT A BURGLAR WITH A FLYING TACKLE).

FIRST LT. RICHARD S. SMITH, 41G., WAS RECENTLY AWARDED THE ARMY AIR MEDAL FOR HIS PART IN THE AIR-BORNE INVASION OF NORTH AFRICA. LT. SMITH WAS A NAVIGATOR ON ONE OF THE TRANSPORTS USED TO FERRY TROOPS INTO THE WAR ZONE ON NOVEMBER 7 AND 8. THE RELEASE ON THE EXPLOIT CALLED IT "THE LONGEST MASSED, UNSCORTED NON-STOP TROOP CARRIER FLIGHT EVER SUCCESSFULLY PERFORMED BY AMERICAN AIR FORCES". (SOME OF YOU WILL REMEMBER THAT LT. 1ST LT. JOEL E. ROBERTSON WRITES FROM CALIFORNIA, SENDS A SIZABLE CHECK TO HELP FINANCE THE NEWS LETTERS, MENTIONS THE "SWELL JOB" CHAPLAIN T. H. VICKERY IS DOING, AND SPEAKS OF HIS "FEELING OF PRIDE" OVER HAVING BEEN THE FRIEND AND ASSOCIATE IN COLLEGE OF SO MANY BRAVE MEN .....JAMES L. SWITZER (LT. MARINES), WRITING FROM THE SOUTH PACIFIC, EXPRESSES HIS INTEREST IN WOFFORD'S FUTURE .....1ST LT. TOM EPTING WRITES FROM ICELAND ABOUT THE SCENERY THERE .....CARLTON A. GILFILLAN (F 2/C, NAVY) FROM THE DEEP SOUTH: "MY PRAYERS ARE THAT WOFFORD COLLEGE WILL STAND DURING THIS WAR SO THAT SHE MAY PRODUCE MORE GREAT MATERIAL TO MAKE THIS A BETTER WORLD TO LIVE IN." .....FIRST LT. GUY E. CARR TELLS US HE RECEIVED THE OCTOBER NEWS LETTER ON CHRISTMAS DAY AFTER A PERIOD OF NOT HEARING FROM HOME, SPEAKS AFFECTIONATELY OF HIS FORMER PROFESSORS, WISHES THAT HE HAD STUDIED FRENCH A LITTLE HARDER NOW THAT HE IS IN NORTH AFRICA, AND MENTIONS THE FACT THAT CAPT. JONES (PROBABLY GILBERT JONES OF SPARTANBURG) IS WITH HIM IN THE AFRICAN VENTURE..... BRIG-GEN. JOSEPH C. HUTCHISON FROM CAMP SHELBY, SAYS, "ALL THE WOFFORD MEN I HAVE SEEN IN THE SERVICE ARE GIVING A GOOD ACCOUNT OF THEMSELVES", AND MENTIONS THE FOLLOWING WOFFORD MEN HE HAS RECENTLY COME IN CONTACT WITH, MOST OF WHOM HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED TO OTHER CAMPS AND PARTS OF THE WORLD: FIRST LT. MOODY WRITES FROM IDAHO: BEING A LONG WAY FROM WOFFORD AND STILL DOING HER, I CAN HARDLY TELL YOU HOW MUCH YOUR NEWS LETTER MEANT TO ME".....CHAPLAIN BEN. W.
