COURSE OF STUDIES.

FOR ADMISSION TO THE FRESHMAN CLASS.

WE would impress upon Parents and Teachers the necessity of a thorough preparation in the following requisites. It is known to every Teacher, that a Pupil may read over the entire Preparatory course and yet be totally unfit to begin the College studies. Very great care should be taken to insure accuracy in the elementary studies—the Grammar, Prosody, Ancient Geography, Arithmetic, &c. The Student who is compelled, in addition to the College course, to make up the deficiencies existing in his Academical course, has a very difficult task. It is perhaps not absolutely impossible, but very few young men have the patient industry necessary to accomplish it.

A candidate is required to be at least fourteen years of age, to have studied carefully the English, Latin and Greek Grammars, including Prosody ;

Ancient and Modern Geography ;
 Arithmetic ;
 Algebra, through Equations of Second Degree ;
 Cæsar's Commentaries, four books ;
 Virgil's *Æneid*, six books ;
 All of Sallust ;
 Four of Cicero's Orations ;
 All of Jacobs' Greek Reader ;
 Xenophon's *Anabasis*, six books.

Candidates, for a more advanced Class, will be examined on all the studies already pursued by the Class they wish to join.

FRESHMAN YEAR.

FIRST TERM.

Three Books of Livy, (Lincoln's); Latin Prose Composition;*
Two Books of Herodotus; Arnold's Greek Prose Composition;
The Bible;* Greek and Roman Antiquities, (Fisks); Algebra;
Ancient History.

SECOND TERM.

Horace, (to Satires); Homer's Iliad, six books; Latin and Greek
Prose Composition; Ancient Geography and Mythology; Ge-
ometry; Ancient History.

SOPHOMORE CLASS.

FIRST TERM.

Horace completed; Demosthenes or Æschines; Latin and Greek
Exercises; Plane Trigonometry and its Application, (Loomis');
Ancient History.

SECOND TERM.

Tacitus; Terence or Plutus, (one Play); Euripides or Sophocles;
Latin and Greek Prose Composition and Antiquities; Spherical
Trigonometry; Surveying; Analytical Geometry, (Loomis');
Ancient History; Blair's Rhetoric.

* Continued throughout all the College course.

JUNIOR CLASS.

FIRST TERM.

One of Cicero's Rhetorical or Philosophical Works; Thucydides
or one of Plato's Dialogues; Greek and Roman Antiquities;
Natural Philosophy; Chemistry; History.

SECOND TERM.

Juvenal and Persius or Lucretius; Æschylus or Aristophanes,
Chemistry; Lectures on Agricultural Chemistry; Logic; Mo-
dern History; Natural Philosophy.

SENIOR CLASS.

FIRST TERM.

Moral Philosophy; Evidences of Christianity; Astronomy; Na-
tural Philosophy; Mineralogy; Modern History; Kames'
Elements of Criticism.

SECOND TERM.

Mental Philosophy; Political Economy; Evidences of Christian-
ity; Astronomy; Geology; Modern History; Kames' Ele-
ments of Criticism.

Compositions and Declamation required throughout the course,
and the Senior Class deliver Original Speeches.
