C. graduates.

Dr. Greene's first baccalaureate address to the Senior class at Bethel Church was something "to go home with," everybody agreed. Speaking on the subject, "Where Do You Live?" President Greene said that we exist in a world of actuality, in a physical, intellectual, spiritual, and moral universe. But, he said, we live in a world of our own creation, which consists of things we appropriate from the world that exists. Dr. Greene, in the nature of a challenge, asked his hearers four questions: (1) Do you live in a world of open-mindedness? (2) Do you live in a world of symbolism? (3) Do you live in a world of great literature, which is the life blood of master spirits? (4) Do you live in a world of spiritual power and reality?

Mr. H. B. Carlisle, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, formally conferred upon President Greene the office of the Presidency of Wofford College with all its rights, privileges, and "difficulties."
