MEMORANDA.

Wofford College was chartered 16th December, 1851; Faculty elected 24th November, 1853; opened for Students 1st August, 1854.

NEW ENDOWMENT.

The old Endowment of the College having been lost by the war, the Alumni Society resolved, 25th June, 1872, to raise at least \$50,000 by the first of January, 1874, towards its restoration. By the hearty co-operation of the members of the South Carolina Conference, (the preachers themselves giving \$10,000,) this amount was raised in bonds, stocks and subscriptions, and the papers transferred by the Society to the care and management of the Trustees of the College. The board resolved, 12th December, 1873, to make an effort to add to this endowment, and at the same time authorized and directed the President of the College to prepare and distribute among the friends of the Institution a form of Bond suitable for this purpose. The following form is therefore now directed to be used, viz:

THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA, }  
COUNTY OF \_\_\_\_\_ }

Know all men by these presents, That I, \_\_\_\_\_, am held and firmly bound unto the Trustees of Wofford College, their successors in office, or assigns, in the full and just sum of \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars, for the establishment of an endowment fund for the purposes of said College, to be paid in five equal annual installments, the first installment to be paid on the first day of January, A. D. 1874, with interest on amount remaining unpaid on said first day of January, A. D. 1874.

The condition of the above obligation is such, that my estate shall not be held liable for any part of the said principal sum, and interest, which shall not be due at the time of death.
