Dear Sir

I have been delayed by sickness from completing the manuscript as promised, but having it well underway hope to send it down, this week.

The Map, you送 me, is of no value in the discussion - Genl Lee had a much better line of defense than that map does, and shows upon which the Confederates retired & occupied on the 3^d July after Picketts Charge - In does the map show the proper position of the forces on either side, it seems to have omitted Mc Laws Division, and some others - I will therefore send you mine, with the understanding that it is to be returned to me.

I delivered an address, on the "Battle of Gettysburg," before the Georgia Historical Society, which incidentally discusses the question at issue, as to what means, short of force, should be now consulted Genl Lee - if you desire to read it and if it pleases,

to produce it, I will try and send you a copy,
from that in the Society's rooms.
