My dear Wife

I understand there is a probability
of a flag of truce boat passing tomorrow, I am well
& getting along as well as I could expect except as to
food the rations are very scanty & I am hungry all the
time. I have received but one letter from you, & no mon-
ey yet though I am sure you have tried to get it to me
send me money & provisions if possible particularly
bread. also send me a fine flat file a fine half round
file a three cornered file a hand rice a pair of plow
oil stone, two other very fine small files & small
very hammer. I want them to pass the time working
also send me a overcoat two blankets or counterpane
& straw. I want Jacket & pants. Two undershirts two
outside. Two pair drawers & socks I can get boots
I have here if I get money. I write you very short un-
satisfactory letters. but think it best to do so. I know
very little of our prospects of being exchanged but think
from what little I know that it is very bad. I bear
it in the proper spirit & would like to express myself
more fully but can not do so. May God bless you &
my dear children as my daily prayer
