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This Indenture made this 20th Day of Jan: in the
Year of Our Lord one Thousand seven hundred & sixtynone between
Silas Dean of Hartford in the County of Hartford on the one part
and Humphry & Solomon Avery of the other part of New England
abovesd Silas Dean as Administrator to the Estate of Dea Silas Dean
late of Groton dec'd hath leased and to farm let by the p'r prfessor to both
leas and to farm let unto the abovesd Humphry and Solomon
Avery and their Assigns. All the Lands, Buildings, Couthardings
Inplements & Appurtenances therunto belonging of which Dea Silas
Dean late of Groton dec'd did possess of his holding in s: Groton to
have and to hold the same for the full Term of one Year and three
Months from the Day of the date hereof with free and full Liberty
of improving the P: Lands, Buildings, & Appurtenances with all
Privileges therunto belonging for the space aforesaid. P: Lands
being by Estimation upwards of two hundred Acres, about Ninety of which
being a part of a tract of Land known by the Name of Wasthurtugat
now in dispute & lying beyond the Con: of the Gen: Assembly the aforesd
Silas Dean doth covenant & agree to defend the same and that forwards
the abovesd Leases to be made of Assembly or otherwise by a Course of
Law dictated in the peaceable and quiet possession and improvement
of P: Lands aforesaid or any part thereof that he the P: Silas
Dean will make them good by satisfaction such as indifferent Free-
holders shall judge and determine just and equitable. Further
the aforesd Silas Dean doth declare himself持有 with the sole right of
leasing as aforesd all the Lands aforesaid & to warrant & defend
the same against all Claims & demands whatsoever. In Considera-
tion whereof the aforesd Humphry & Solomon Avery do on their
part Covenant & agree & bind themselves their Heirs, Executors &c.
at the expiration of P: Terms of Time will and truly to pay unto
the P: Silas Dean his Heirs Executors &c the full and quiet sum
of thirty five pounds in lawfull Money of this or publick Credit of the
Colony of Connecticut Also that the P: Lands, Buildings and their
Appurtenances shall then be delivered up in good and tenable
Repair as they now are except necessary wear in P: Terms
Further

Further that all the Hay & fodder which is now on P. Farm
shall be used on the same also all that shall grow during P. Term
of Lease. That the P. Elles Dean shall have free Liberty of
entering, securing and harvesting for his own Usages Benefit all the
Wheat and Peas now growing on P. Land which Land shall not be
entred on by the lessors untill the Harvest is past

Further that the P. Lessee Humphrey Sol. Avery shall on no
pretensions commit Waste of Timber themselves or permit it by
others nor shall they cut or destroy any Timber but such as shall be
necessary for fuel Wood & repairing of Fences

Further that if within P. Term of Term the aforesd. Lessor shall
sue fit to sell or dispose of P. Farm &c he shall have free Liberty to
do the same & to putt the purchasees ^{to} possession of the same
on making good whatever may be apprized damage thereby occ-
curring to the lesse the Damages to be apprized by indifferent
Householders as aforesd.

Anno Domini 1761 and in the first Year of his Majestys
Reign George the third King &c &c
