In June of 2011 local Spartanburg County teachers, writers, ENVIS professor Kaye Savage, and ENVIS students Jacob Godwin and Andrea Kelsey, gathered at the Goodall Center for a 4-day workshop with writers-in-residence Janisse Ray, Drew Lanham, and John Lane. The writers-in-residence led the group in a series of walks, discussions, a late afternoon reading (in town at the Hub City Bookshop and open to the public), and on-site workshops that explored the village of Glendale and damaged Piedmont landscape that surrounds it.

Through personal essays, poetry, and fiction the group

explored how nature writers contribute to our understanding and appreciation of imperfect landscapes, places that have been utilized, abused and altered by centuries of human activity.

A selection of the essays, poems, and stories completed by the group will be gathered for an anthology to be edited by John Lane and published in the first issue of a new digital magazine to be premiered on The Southern Nature Project web site (www.southernnature.org) in spring 2012.

“Imagination in the Ruins” is the second outreach workshop funded by Wofford College’s M.A. Cargill Foundation grant.
