Pompton Oct 3. 1787

I have just sent to Mr. Robert Randall
of Virginia a single order for 5 Guineas he being on the
Ladulation & his Credit ^{by} Mr. Constable of N. York on whom
I have given a like order to Billy Ferguson who has leave
to go to N. York upon a short Visit. I hope you will
pardon this Liberty as we could get no hard Money
here & it will be precisely the same thing in the Act

Genl. Pookery passed this place yesterday to whom
I showed a letter I had just received from Mr. Gardner
allowing me if John Ferguson is not likely to profit upon
consulting with the General to send him home by Allegheny
The General is desirous that he should stay if any thing
can be made of him but left it to me to judge of that
I will therefore have a very particular conversation with
him & then determine whether any further Travel
should be made I have the Honour to be
