said State GREETING: You, and each of you, are hereby commanded, without Delay, to attach the Bod y of —

*Jampson Simons otherwise called Jampson Simons
of the City of Charleston in the State of South-Carolina Merchant*

wheresoever *he* may be found, within your and each of your respective Districts, so that you compel *him* to be and appear
before the Justices of the said State, at the Court of Common Pleas, to be holden at Charleston, on the ~~fourth~~ *fourth* of ~~the~~ *the* Tuesday
in ~~the~~ *July* ~~Month~~ *March* next, to answer to —

Sho. P. W. J. Jr.

*Jacob Cohen and Abraham Alexander otherwise called Mess^{rs} Cohen
& Alexander Indue-masters of the City of Charleston in the State
aforesaid in a plea of debt that he render unto them Three
hundred and six pounds Lawful money of Great-Britain which
to them he owes and from them unjustly detains and soforth.*

And have you then and there this WRIT.

WITNESS the Honourable *James Heyward Jun^r Esq^r* one of the Justices of the *S^c* Court
at Charleston, the ~~fifteenth~~ *fifteenth* Day of *March* — in the Year of Our LORD One Thousand Seven Hundred and
Eighty: *five* and in the ~~fourth~~ *fourth* Year of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America.
