**T**HE STATE OF SOUTH-CAROLINA. To all and singular the Sheriffs of the  
said State, GREETING: You, and each of you, are hereby commanded, without Delay, to attach the Body of

Charles Drayton Esquire Executor of the last Will and Testament of William Henry  
Drayton otherwise lately called William Henry Drayton of St. Andrews Parish Esquire

wherefoever he may be found, within your and each of your respective Districts, so that you compel him to be and appear  
before the Justices of the said State, at the Court of Common Pleas, to be holden at Charleston, on the Second Tuesday  
in September next, to answer to James Grant of a Plea that he render unto him

Two thousand and four hundred Pounds lawful money of great Britain of the value  
of Two thousand and four hundred Pounds Sterling current money of the State  
aforesaid which to him he owes and from him unjustly detains and so forth

*W. H. Drayton*

And have you then and there this Writ.

WITNESS the honorable Thomas Keyward Junior one of the associate Justices of the said State  
at Charleston, the Third Day of July in the Year of our Lord, One Thousand Seven Hundred  
and Eighty-Seven and in the Twelfth Year of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America.
