Boston 13<sup>th</sup> Oct 1796

My dear Sir

Your long, constant, and kind  
attention to me have had their proper  
influence on my mind and I feel my  
self bound therefore before I leave town  
to add to the observations I made to you  
this morning - That I have been for some  
time agent to a North Carolina friend who  
has had a son at school in Hingham  
The lad leaves this on Sunday next &  
Hingham to morrow. It is important  
that I see him there to settle a number  
of accounts he has for board & clothing  
and that my Aunt which are in Hingham  
should be copied & sent on - The propriety  
of settling matters of this kind in time  
is a measure the importance of which  
you will as a man of business you will  
admit
