Boston 13th Oct 1796

My dear Sir

Your long, constant, and kind attention to me have had their proper influence on my mind and I feel myself bound therefore before I leave town to add to the observations I made to you this morning - That I have been for some time engaged to a North Carolina friend who has had a son at school in Hingham. The lad leaves this on Sunday next & Hingham to morrow. It is important that I see him there to close a number of accounts he has for board clothing &c and that my acct which are in Hingham should be copied & sent on - The propriety of settling matters of this kind in time is a measure the importance of which you will as a man of business you will admit with esteem & affection
