TO ALL TO WHOM these Presents shall come, GREETING: KNOW YE, That by virtue of a certain Office Warrant Number
fifteen the said one hundred and fifty two, issued the nineteenth day of February one thousand seven hundred and eighty three
there is granted by the said Commonwealth, unto *Charles Johnson*

A certain Tract or Parcel of Land, containing

*one hundred and ninety nine Acres by Survey bearing due the twenty first day of April
thousand seven hundred and ninety four, lying and being in the County of Stafford in a Division of the West Fork of the
River and bounded as followeth to wit. Beginning at a white oak corner to Jonathan Bishop's land and with a line of
the same of 19 E. 66 poles to a dogwood and white oak. S 55 W. 139 poles to a large white oak. S 65 W. 97 poles to two white
oaks corner to Tobias Main and William's land and with the said William's land N. 25 W. 164 poles to a
Spanish oak and Black Walnut corner to Mathias Snocks land; thence leaving Snocks corner N. 76 E. 172 poles to
a large white oak and Black Walnut corner to the said Bishop and thence South 84 degrees East 83 poles to the
said Bishop to the beginning.*
