TO ALL TO WHOM these Presents shall come, GREETING: KNOW YE, That by virtue of a Law before Existing Warrant Number
fifteen hundred and one hundred and fifty two, issued the nineteenth day of February one thousand and eight hundred and eighty three,
there is granted by the said Commonwealth, unto Captain Johnson

A certain Tract or Fareel of Land, containing one hundred and ninety nine Acres lying and bearing at the County first day of April
thousand seven hundred and ninety four, lying and bearing in the County of Roanoke on a bearing of the South East
River and bounded as follows to wit. Beginning at a white oak corner to Jonathan Bishop's land and with a course
the same of 19 E. 66 poles to a dogwood and white oak, 155 W. 139 poles to a large white oak 165 W. 97 poles to two white
oaks corner to Isabell Mann and Williams land and with the said Williams land at 24 W. 164 poles to a
Spaniard Oak and black Walnut corner to Thomas Smock's land; thence leaving Smock's corner at 768 1/2 poles
a white oak and black Walnut corner to the said Bishop and hence forth 84 degrees at 183 poles to the
place where it began.
