Elizabeth Town Feb 7<sup>th</sup> 1787

Dear Sir

A long Absence from home, prevented the Receipt of your Letters relative to Sir Rob Barkers of fair title about Ten days ago - A multiplicity of more important Business, necessarily engaged my attention on my Return, till within a few days, I embraced the first Opportunity, of considering the Papers sent me -

I have spent three Days on it and have given it a full Consideration, and have weighed every Objection ag<sup>t</sup> the Title, and am convinced of the Propriety of requiring an Ejectment - Enclosed you have the Result of my Reflections on the Subject -

I keep the Papers you sent me as I suppose they are copied made out for the Purpose - if not I will return them on Notice -

Mr Franklin proposes me to bring an Action on your Note I mentioned to you - Do Endeavour to settle it before Court, so as to prevent such a disagreeable consequence -

Will you be so kind as to forward me all Lord Drummonds Surveys, or rather Captain Drummonds that remain in your Office, also an account of what Rights he is entitled to under the new Decree and with a certified Copy of the Warrants -

When you get Mess<sup>r</sup> Patterson of Cogden's

Opinions you had better Exchange Copies with each  
after which, will be the Time for a Meeting —
