Day of *March* in the Year of our LORD One Thousand Seven  
Hundred and Ninety Three, before me, RICHARD VARICK,  
Esquire, Mayor of the said City, personally appeared *Elizabeth*  
*Prinner* \_\_\_\_\_ of the  
*seventh* \_\_\_\_\_ Ward of the said City, *Grocer*  
and acknowledged *himself* to be indebted to the People  
of the State of *New-York* in the Sum of *Fifty Pounds*, lawful  
Money of the said State, to be levied of *his* Goods and Chat-  
tles, Lands and Tenements, for the Use of the People of the  
said State, if Failure shall be made in the Performance of the  
Condition following :

WHEREAS the said *Elizabeth Prinner* on the  
*Day of the Date hereof*  
hath obtained a Licence to keep an Inn or Tavern for retailing strong or  
spirituous Liquors in *his* Dwelling-House, in the said City, from the  
Date of the said Licence until the first Day of *March* next.

Now, the Condition of this Recognizance is such,  
That if the said *Elizabeth Prinner* do not, during  
the Time that *he* shall keep an Inn or Tavern, keep a disorderly  
Inn or Tavern, or suffer or permit any Cock-fighting, Gaming, or Playing  
with Cards or Dice, or keep any Billiard-Table, or other Gaming-Table,  
or Shuffle-Board, within the Inn or Tavern by *him* to be kept, or  
within any Out-House, Yard or Garden belonging thereunto ; then this  
Recognizance to be void, else to remain in full Force.
