BE IT REMEMBERED, That on the fourth
Day of March in the Year of our LORD One Thousand Seven
Hundred and Ninety Three, before me, RICHARD VARICK,
Esquire, Mayor of the said City, personally appeared Elizabeth
Prinner _____ of the
seventh Ward of the said City, Grocer
and acknowledged himself to be indebted to the People
of the State of New-York in the Sum of Fifty Pounds, lawful
Money of the said State, to be levied of his Goods and Chat-
tles, Lands and Tenements, for the Use of the People of the
said State, if Failure shall be made in the Performance of the
Condition following:

WHEREAS the said Elizabeth Prinner on the
Day of the Date hereof
hath obtained a Licence to keep an Inn or Tavern for retailing strong or
spirituous Liquors in his Dwelling-House, in the said City, from the
Date of the said Licence until the first Day of March next.

Now, the Condition of this Recognizance is such,
That if the said Elizabeth Prinner do not, during
the Time that he shall keep an Inn or Tavern, keep a disorderly
Inn or Tavern, or suffer or permit any Cock-fighting, Gaming, or Playing
with Cards or Dice, or keep any Billiard-Table, or other Gaming-Table,
or Shuffle-Board, within the Inn or Tavern by him to be kept, or
within any Out-House, Yard or Garden belonging thereunto ; then this
Recognizance to be void, else to remain in full Force.
