Dear Sir

30th June 1829

In my last letter inclosing my note to you
and my power of attorney to Saml Elliot Esq^r I
desired you to apply to Beatty to know how many
barrells of my flour unsold and the present
price of flour

Mrs Parker has been dangerously
ill owing to an inflammation of her bowels, the
Doctor was sent for and he bled her
copiously, which has saved her life she is
now in a fair way of recovery

There has been ^{but} one hot day
since I came to the Manor, which brought in
the grub; this weather is favourable to
the wheat & harvest, but unfavourable to
the corn
