Key West Apr. 17. 1843

Dear Sir,

I have concluded to continue  
my business in this place another  
year, more money than I have would  
be very convenient about the 1<sup>st</sup> May,  
to make my purchases in New York,  
Could your Bank accommodate me  
with \$1000, for 4 or 6 months payable  
in New York, please write on note of  
of this, and inform me what you can  
do for me, direct to N York. Business  
has been pretty good here this season and  
the prospect for the summer is good,  
I intend leaving here the first opportu-  
nity for New York. Mr. Brazz will remain  
during my absence. The weather  
is extremely warm & mosquitoes abundant,
