New Orleans April 25th 1845

Albert Pike Esq

My dear Sir

your favor of the 23 ult.
came safe to hand, and I have delayed
answering it waiting on Beard &c. I am much
more ~~informed~~ informed by B.-L.-L.C. that they have
applied to the Rotts, who refuses to do any
thing in relation to the matter. He denies
I understand that the slaves sold you
are subject to the rules and directs you
charge upon them. If you can prove
sufficiently the rules violated, especially
that of theft - you can maintain an
action without difficulty upon the
masterly. Should you choose to do so
let me know the names of your witnesses
evidence &c. so that I can obtain their
testimony, and I will attend to the matter
for you with pleasure. I presume Beard
has written fully on the subject.

In the mean time believe me
