My dear Sir:

I have never yet had  
influence with any Federal  
Admiral, Captain, and my base  
no better with the next than  
with the last. I never wrote  
a letter to a President  
elect nor to a nominee of  
my party for that post. This is a  
government of Congress, and  
I was not educated to their  
profession. I will not be of  
use, nor tender unsolicited ad-  
vice. I do not think it at all  
probable that I shall be in a  
position next year to help any  
one, and I will not trouble my-  
self to ask favors. So I close  
thinking it at all probable that I  
will be up you in any contingency.
