PA 1823 D.C. Slave Deed for "... a woman & Betsy Baker (55); Nelly (36) + son Timl (12) & daughter Jane (7) +
NASHVILLE, TENN" Henny (40) & son Washington (5) + girl named Polly (21)

Know all men I William Orteal of the City of
Washington for and in consideration of Eight hundred
Dollars to me in hand paid, the receipt of which is here
acknowledged have & by these presents doth bargain sell
and convey to John Henry Eaton of this the State of Tennessee
the following negroes to wit. a woman commonly called
Betsy Baker aged about fifty five years - & telly aged
thirty six and her son Tim about twelve years, and her
daughter Jane about seven years old; also Henny aged
forty and her son Washington five years of age; also
a negro girl named Polly Quander aged twenty
one; to have & hold the said negroes to the said
John A Eaton his heirs & assigns forever. in witness
whereof I have set my hand seal &
consid said negroes to be delivered the

(10th) day of April 1823
