Whereas at the Court of Common Pleas held at Charles Town this present second Tuesday of May 1722 James Junbon & Magdalen his Wife did implead James Atin in an plea of Trespass on the Case ad. Damnum. fifty pounds

To which according to the Def^{ts} made Default and thereupon the Court gave Judgem^t for the said

*James Junbon & Magdalen his Wife and
Francis de Brajue Ep^{us} of Beaufort
James Junbon & Magdalen his Wife & Francis*

but because it is unknown to the Court what Damages the said hath sustained by reason of the premises Therefore it is

Comanded you immediately to summons Thirty men Drawn by Balloes pursuant to the acts of Assembly in that case made & provided then & there forthwith to enquire what Damages the said *James Junbon & Magdalen his Wife and* sustained in the said acc^{on} & that you

make due & true return at the said Court & have you then & there this Write Witness
