Comanded you immediately to summon Thirty men Drawn by Ballots pursuant to  
the acts of Assembly in that Case made & provided ther<sup>e</sup> & here forthwith to enquire  
what Damages the said <sup>Francis Ld Brafield Esq: of John Ld Danvers Esq:</sup> James Hunter Magdalene his wife and <sup>Sustained in the said account that you</sup>  
make due & true return at the said Court & have you then & there this Writ witness  
Charles Hill Esq: our Chief Justice at Charles Town the eighth day of  
May — anno Dom<sup>r</sup>. 1722
