JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS.

FIRST DAY.

THURSDAY, JANUARY 12th, 1882.

The Seventy-Sixth Session (since the re-organization, the seventeenth) of the South Carolina Annual Conference, Methodist Episcopal Church, convened at Spartanburg, in Annual Session, in Silver Hill Methodist Episcopal Church, January 12th, 1882, at 10 o'clock, A. M., Bishop R. S. Foster, D. D., L. L. D., presiding.

The sacrament of the Lord's Supper was administered, after devotional exercises, conducted by Rev. S. Hunt, D. D., of the Book Concern, New York.

I. E. Lowery, Assistant Secretary of the last Conference, was requested to call the roll. A quorum being present, on motion, J. B. Middleton was elected Secretary and I. E. Lowery and A. G. Townsend, Assistants. W. R. Jervay, Statistical and Financial Secretary.

The time of meeting and adjourning the Conference was fixed as follows: To meet at 8½ o'clock A. M.; the first hour to be devoted to religious exercises, and to adjourn at 1 o'clock, P. M.

The Bar of the Conference was on motion of F. D. Smith, fixed at the third window from the chancel.

Local Preachers, doing regular itinerant work, were invited to seats within the bar.

Remarks of brotherly recognition were made by the Bishop, and references to his visit to the State and Conference six years ago. He expressed his real pleasure in meeting with us now, and expressed regret at missing from the Secretary's table the Christian gentleman now in heaven—B. L. Roberts, A. M. He regards the Conference as model, in some respects, and expressed the hope that the session would be pre-eminently a religious one.

Rev. S. Hunt was introduced and proceeded to address the Conference in the interest of his special work. The address was well received.

The address of the Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer of the Episcopal Fund was read to the Conference and remarks made by Brother Hunt.

The amount of \$30.00 from the Chartered Fund and \$104.00 from the Book Concern, was received, and on motion of A. Webster, referred to the Conference Stewards for distribution among needy brethren.

On motion of E. J. Snetter, the Presiding Elders were requested to give any information of needy cases in their possession, to the Conference Stewards.

Took up 20th question, and the character of J. E. Wilson, of the Orangeburg District, passed. He proceeded to represent the spiritual and temporal condition of the District. The condition of the Church is excellent, and intellectually, as well as otherwise, the improvement is marked. The style of church buildings is in keeping with the times. The financial condition of the District is improving, notwithstanding the severe drought of the past summer. The footprints of ignorance still linger, especially in the

rice fields section of the work, where the people live in communities. The camp-meetings, as at present conducted, are failures, and the time has arrived when some means should be devised by the Conference, by which the conduct of such meetings be improved. There has been one death on the District among the preachers, that of B. L. Roberts, who, after a short and painful illness, passed away, to sing God's praise in endless day. The educational work on the District needs improvement outside the cities and Claffin University. Educational facilities are quite limited. We need well equipped and thoroughly prepared teachers to instruct the children. The temperance work is receiving new impetus, owing to the efforts of friends of the cause, backed by the stringent laws enacted by the Legislature.

A verse of the Hymn, "Blest be the tie that binds," &c., was sung.

E. Cooke made explanation of certain matters touching the report.

E. Q. Fuller, D. D., Editor of the *METHODIST ADVOCATE*, was introduced, and offered remarks touching the advancement made by the Conference, and also with reference to the Publications at Atlanta and other points in the connection. The *METHODIST ADVOCATE* is well sustained, and has doubled its circulation since the General Conference. This has been done by the increased activity of the brethren. The sale of books has also increased very largely. The influences inducing this especially, were Bishops Foster and Warren.

On motion, a communication from Dr. Fuller to the Conference, was, with other documents, appropriately referred.

Notices were given of the night and morning services; also, by the Committee of Examination.

The doxology was sung and the benediction pronounced by E. Cook.

SECOND DAY.

FRIDAY, JANUARY 13th, 1882.

The Conference opened with a sermon by S. Hunt of the Book Concern, New York, from the text Hebrews 12-2. The interest was profound, deep and lasting. At 10 o'clock Bishop R. S. Foster called the Conference to order. The Journal of the preceding session was read and confirmed. The roll of absentees was called, five of the brethren being present and answering. Resumed the 20th Question, and the characters of the following brethren were examined and passed:

E. Cooke stated that 250 students have entered school this term and more are coming. There are 150 scholars in the Sunday School. One class is run on the Chautauqua plan and one is instructed in Binney's Theological Compend. They are both succeeding admirably. Missionary money collected is included in Brother Bulkley's report.

Dr. Cook proceeded to correct a misstatement made in Boston at the Preachers' Meeting during the summer of 1881, that he (Cook) had slandered the colored people of the South. Remarks touching the matter were made by Bishop Foster, Dr. Webster and others. Dr. Cook was fully vindicated and exonerated.

Columbia District was called, A. C. Dutton's character passed, and the District was represented.

Death has visited the families of some of the preachers, and loved ones are taken from them to a better world. A severe drought has seriously affected the crops, and necessarily our finances. Large repairs have been made on the Churches, notwithstanding this condition of affairs. Our Church debts are not troubling us; they are quite small, and but few churches are in debt.

We raised in the District for expenses of Delegates to the Ecumenical Council the sum of \$91.59. My stay in the District was quite pleasant. Brethren received me pleasantly and even cordially. The tone of the official members in the District is evidently improving, as seen from the intelligent reports made by them in the Quarterly Conferences. There were many revivals of religion, and one thousand and seven souls have been converted to God. The Sunday Schools are prospering as a rule and are continued during the entire year. Camp-meetings are not all they should be; but we have reason to rejoice at the order and success attending them. The people are certainly improving in every way.

The Conference was addressed by Mr. Kynett in the interests of Church Extension. The funds of the Society have largely increased since its organization, and is destined in the future to contribute largely in making this par excellence a Christian nation.

R. C. Oliver and J. F. Smith of the M. E. Church South, were introduced.

The name of Lisbon Johnson was called, and, on motion of A. Webster, his case was submitted to a Judicial Court to be appointed by the Bishop.

On motion of A. Middleton the Conference voted to hold the anniversary of the Conference Missionary Society on Sunday night.

Notices were given of meetings to-night and to-morrow morning. Drs. E. Cook and J. B. Ford, and Rev. I. E. Lowery, to deliver addresses on Education, and Dr. Fuller to preach the morning sermon.

The usual notices were given.

THIRD DAY.

SATURDAY, JANUARY 14th, 1882.

The Conference was opened by Bishop Foster, after a sermon by A. S. Hunt, D. D., of New York Bible House.

Bishop H. W. Warren, A. S. Hunt, D. D., and Rev. E. O. Thayer, President of Clark University, were introduced to the Conference.

D. Minus was appointed Assistant Secretary, at the request of the Secretary.

Twentieth Question resumed:

A. Webster, Presiding Elder of Port Royal District was called; character passed. He represented the District: The year was unusual for sickness and death, owing to malarial fever; also very unpropitious in finances. A disastrous storm, in the Combahce section, very materially damaged the crops and seriously injured two Church buildings. The building destroyed at Walterboro, by the cyclone, is now rebuilt. Two new and substantial Churches were erected and dedicated in the section of the District where the Phosphate Mines are located, and are now used as places of worship. One Camp-ground purchased at Hickory Hill. The Exodus is in a small measure depleting our membership in the District. There

has been one suspension during the year from Ministerial work. The Common School privileges are apparently diminishing and we fear will not accomplish much for the elevation of the masses. There were four hundred and fifty-seven conversions during the year. There is general improvement among the people, notwithstanding many embarrassments. The conduct of Camp and other meetings are, on the whole, well conducted.

J. H. Vincent, D. D., Corresponding Secretary of the Sunday School Union, A. J. Fletcher of Tennessee Conference, and J. A. West of Blue Ridge Conference, were introduced.

Resolutions from the Brethren of the Port Royal District in behalf of Dr. Webster were adopted.

A. S. Hunt, D. D., of the American Bible Society, addressed the Conference in the interest of the cause he represents.

J. T. Wightman, D. D., of the Church South, and J. H. Carlisle, L. L. D., of Wofford College, were introduced.

On motion, F. L. Baxter, B. F. Witherspoon, William T. Ford, Henry F. McElwee and Martin V. Gray were admitted into full connection and elected to Elders' Orders, (excepting Baxter, elected as Local Elder, January, 1881, not eligible,) Secretary. The Bishop addressed the class in substance, as follows: God calls men to preach. The method of the Church to find out who are called is

by fully testing them as to their success, character and deportment. This test is a mutual one—the Church and the candidate. In the abstract, the Bishops nor the Presiding Elders cannot and do not say who are to be Pastors. The Conference alone is responsible. An encouraging feature of our work is the great advancements made and required in mental attainments as a pre-requisite to an entrance into the Conference. The problem the Church is solving, is, whether a people can be created out of nothing to-day. With one united voice we can say of the work in its present condition, *progress*. The work to be done is to raise the masses of the people to the highest possible state of Christian perfection and enjoyment, and therefore Preachers should be typical men. A prime necessity of Ministers is to load themselves *up* with thought, in order that they may load the people *down* with it. The requisites in order are: First, manly men; second, studious men; third, practical knowledge of men and things; fourth, our ambition as a Church should be to elevate the masses to be true citizens of the Government and worthy members of the Church; fifth, exercise charity towards all Christians, and let our competition be to elevate men and make them Christ-like. The Bishop emphasized the instruction that the examiners appointed should be acquainted thoroughly with the subjects upon which they examine.

Took up the Tenth Question and Isaac Gamble and Paul D. Gamble were elected to Local Deacons' Orders.

Voted to adjourn to meet at 4 o'clock P. M. Adjourned with benediction by J. T. Wightman, D. D.

AFTERNOON SESSION,

The Conference met at 4 o'clock P. M., pursuant to adjournment. Devotional exercises conducted by A. Middleton, Bishop R. S. Foster presiding. The Journal of the morning session was read, and after corrections, adopted. A. F. Cresswell, of the Blue Ridge Conference, one of a Committee of three appointed by said Conference to secure if possible the transfer of the white members of the Spartanburg Circuit was introduced. He addressed a few remarks to the Conference.

Took up the Third Question. Evander McDaniel and Edward H. Coit were called. Absent from the Conference room.

The Eighteenth Question was taken up, and P. Witherspoon remained in the same relation. N. T. Bowen was made effective.

The Nineteenth Question was taken up and S. Weston, S. Jett, and W. Darrington were continued in the same relation.

Bishop Warren was called to the Chair.

On motion of L. M. Dunton, a Committee of five was appointed by the Chair to act in conjunction with the Committee from the Blue Ridge Conference Committee; L. M. Dunton, W. F. Parker,

A. Middleton, A. Webster, V. H. Bulkley. The law in the case was stated by the Bishop clearly.

Dr. Vincent being introduced, addressed the Conference in the interest of the Sunday School Union and the instruction of children. The address was unique.

Rev. True Whittier of Maine Conference was introduced.

Notices of the night and Sabbath services were given, doxology, and benediction pronounced by Bishop Warren.

SABBATH SERVICES.

A well attended and impressive Lovefeast at 9½ o'clock, A. M., conducted by A. C. Dutton, opened the services of the day. At the close the Deacons were ordained by Bishop Foster, assisted by Bishop Warren and L. M. Dunton, viz.: M. V Gray, H. F. McEllwee, B. F. Witherspoon, W. T. Ford and P. D. Harris, Local Deacon. At 11, A. M., Bishop Foster preached from 1st Timothy, iii:16. Subject—"The mystery of Godliness." At 3½ o'clock, P. M., Professor E. O. Thayer, President of Clark University, preached from Ephesians xiii:4, holding closely the attention of the audience, after which the Elders were ordained by Bishop Foster, assisted by Bishop Warren, Dr. Fuller, A. C. Dutton, A. Middleton, J. A. Sasportas, L. M. Dunton and J. B. Middleton, assisting in reading the service. Elders ordained, M. F. Black, W. G. Deas, W. R. Jervay, Joseph Jenkins, W. S. Bailey, William Evans and E. J. Frederick. The Missionary Sermon was preached at night by J. E. Wilson, from Isaiah li:2-3, to a very large and attentive audience.

FIFTH DAY.

MONDAY, JANUARY 16th, 1882.

Conference convened at the usual hour. Devotional exercises conducted by J. B. Middleton. Conference called to business by Bishop Foster at 9.5 A. M.

The Journal of the last session read and confirmed.

The 20th Question resumed.

L. M. Dunton, Presiding Elder of Spartanburg District, was called, his character passed, and his work represented. Only two of the stations on the District are self-supporting, the others need Missionary aid. As a whole, the brethren in the District are not studious and are not advancing so as to keep fully abreast of the times, and to be leaders of the people.

One death in the District among the ministry in the person of J. K. Wagener, supernumerary, who has fallen on sleep.

Many Sunday School institutes have been held during the year, attended with much success. The necessity of this work demands the presence and active co-operation of the Sunday School agent for the South.

The Temperance cause have our undivided attention, and we have had success in removing this curse from two towns on the District.

Our camp-meetings, seven in number have not been successes. There have been some scenes of general disorder. To me the work has been quite pleasant, and I have been quite well entertained by the people, sometimes entertained by the whites. \$575 worth of books have been sold during the year, and 614 conversions were had. We are expecting to build churches or parsonages at every town in the District during the coming year.

The exodus is assuming alarming proportions, and if continued, will materially deplete our churches of a large amount of members. Of the benevolent collections we are heartily proud; they have increased in every instance. We have raised for expenses of delegates to Ecumenical Council, \$77.75.

There are nominally two white appointments in the District. It is a waste of our Missionary money to continue them in their present relation to the Conference. It is my judgment that they should be transferred to a white Conference or set off as a distinct mission.

On motion of L. M. Dunton, the Statistical Secretary was requested to return to the Presiding Elders the Blanks handed in by the preachers.

Devotional exercises having been conducted by E. M. Pinckney, the Conference was called to order by Bishop Foster at 3 o'clock, P. M. The Journal of the morning session was read, corrected and adopted.

Bishop H. W. Warren was called to the Chair. Reports were called for: Committee on the State of the country reported, and, on motion the report was tabled. Committees on Sunday Schools, Church Extension, Bible Cause and Memoirs, reported, and the reports adopted. In the case of the last report Hymn 991 was sung, the Conference standing.

Dr. E. Q. Fuller addressed the Conference in the interest of the METHODIST ADVOCATE and the Book Concern. Dr. Cook addressed the Conference in the interest of Claflin University.

On motion, the Secretaries were requested to purchase a Conference Roll Book out of any Conference funds in their possession, and also whatever stationery that may be necessary for their completion of the Journal and Minutes.

The following were nominated for Trustees of Claflin University: E. C. Brown, N. T. Bowen, C. J. Holloway, F. W. Sasportas.

Notices were given, and, on motion, Conference adjourned with the benediction by J. A. Sasportas.

The Conference opened with religious exercises conducted by L. Arthur, Bishop Foster presiding.

Hon. Simpson Bobo was introduced.

Bishop Warren took the Chair.

Committee on Education reported. Adopted.

Auditing Committee, Committee on Temperance, Committee on Freedmen's Aid, Committee on Books and Periodicals, reported and the several reports, on motion, were adopted.

Drs. Ford and Fuller addressed the Conference. The former

gave valuable information touching the C. L. S. C., and the Lyceum Reading Union.

Committee on Memoirs reported in the death of B. L. Roberts. Eulogies on his death were pronounced by Bishop Warren and A. Middleton. The Bishop pronounced Bro. Roberts the best Secretary he had met in his experience, as a presiding officer. A. Middleton referred to an unbroken friendship of more than forty years existence between deceased and himself. The 991st Hymn of the Hymnal was sung; the Conference standing, and the report was adopted. The Conference Stewards reported, and, on motion, the report was adopted. (See Report.)

Took up the Thirty-third Question, and, on motion, voted that the next Session of Conference be held at Yorkville, S. C.

The Report on the state of the Country was taken from the table, discussed and adopted.

Resolutions of thanks to the citizens of Spartanburg and to the Railroad Companies, thanking them for entertainment and reduced fare.

B. F. Witherspoon was, on motion, promoted to the class of the Fourth Year.

The Judicial Court decides in the case of S. S. Lawton that the charge of bigamy is sustained and that he be expelled.

Bishop Foster resumed the Chair and stated the law very explicitly in the case of ceding the white work, so called in this Conference to the Blue Ridge Conference. The following resolution concerning the question was passed. (See Resolution.)

Dr. Ford, Sunday-School Agent for the South, spoke to the Conference with reference to the appointment of an Agent for the State and Conference specially. He thinks it would not meet the views of the Corresponding Secretary of the Sunday-School Union and others in authority. It would increase the general interest to hold District Institutes at which the Presiding Elders, Preachers and others interested may assemble and be instructed.

S. S. Lawton gave notice of appeal from the decision of the Judicial Court. On motion, A. C. Dutton was made supernumerary.

Committee on Missions reported. Adopted.

Committees on Privileges, Examination and Triers of Appeal were appointed. (See List.)

Committee on Statistics reported and report adopted.

Voted that 2,000 copies of Minutes be published, on motion of A. Webster. Voted on motion of A. Middleton, that \$40.00 be asked of the Missionary Board for publishing the Minutes.

The following resolutions referring to A. C. Dutton were unanimously passed: Resolutions touching the conduct of camp-meetings were discussed and adopted. Resolutions to the Board of Bishops, requesting their influence with the Government in favor of establishment of Postal Savings Bank, were adopted.

Resolutions to the Bishops were adopted, the Conference singing, "When we assunder part," &c. Bishop Foster then addressed the Conference in substance, as follows:

EDUCATION.

Wesley said, "Our people are not better because they are not more knowing." The same remark is equally true in our day. Ignorance is the mother of superstition and crime. There may be intellectual endowments without religious attainments. But high religious culture is impossible without corresponding intellectual attainments. Agriculture and mechanical arts cannot be carried to

a high degree of perfection without a well-trained hand, guided by a well-educated brain. How much more should he whose life is given to guide others secure that training which will free him from that charge—the blind leading the blind—and will enable him to be a workman that needeth not to be ashamed. In our Claflin University, located at Orangeburg in this State, under the efficient management of Dr. E. Cooke, and an able corps of assistants, we have an institution of learning well adapted to the wants of our people. While the lower branches are effectually taught, the normal department and Agricultural College are in a flourishing condition. While this is true we are gratified to know that there are students in every class in the College Course. It is a matter of regret that the buildings are altogether too small to accommodate the growing number of students in attendance, while, from time to time, new additions are made for the accommodation of students. The increased demand is more rapid than the increased room. It is our earnest hope and prayer that God will raise up other friends in the future as in the past who will erect suitable and permanent buildings to meet our growing necessities.

Resolved, That we earnestly recommend all our people to see to it that their children are taught early in life the rudimentary branches of a good English education.

Resolved, That we urge our young men and women to make vigorous efforts to attain such a liberal education as is within the reach of nearly every one possessing a sufficient amount of energy to be a success in the higher walks of life.

Resolved, That we heartily commend Claflin University to the prayers, sympathy and patronage of our people.

Resolved, That we will take up a collection in all our charges for the cause of education.

C., which is conducted by Dr. Vincent and others, and that we will advise our wives and the young people of our charge to join the Lyceum Reading Union which is also conducted by Dr. Vincent and others.

STATE OF THE COUNTRY.

The Committee on the State of the Country have had under consideration some of the points of interest to which their attention has been called, and beg leave to submit the following report:

There are some causes of anxious thought and some of alarm and deep peril which force themselves to the front. Like Banquo's ghost, they will not go down at the bidding.

The multitudes of foreign immigrants that flock to our country

for the purpose of making it their future home, while they love our free institutions, bring, as a general rule, sentiments and customs directly at variance with the genius and institutions of our own country, as bequeathed to us by our Revolutionary Fathers.

Their whole social life and customs tend to weaken the wholesome restraints of a good family government; they tend to desecrate the Sabbath and to diminish the respect for that holy day which our fathers inculcated as one of the corner-stones of our Republic.

The Public Schools, also, which our Fathers bequeathed to us as one of the chief glories of a free country, are privately and publicly attacked, their efficiency is weakened, and, in some cases, utterly destroyed.

Intemperance stalks abroad in open day with defiance, and, with damning stealth, snatches our sons from the altars of the Church of their fathers, and, immolates them upon the altars of Bacchus in bar-rooms and gambling hells.

About midway between the stormy Capes of the Atlantic and the placid shores of the Pacific, and on the iron belt that locks the two together, now the highway of commerce, there is a deep pit-hole of iniquity, a moral cesspool reeking with all the filth and pollution of the whole world; and yet, an *imperium in imperio*, bidding defiance to both public sentiment and the laws of the country. And, moreover, her delegate in Congress with undaunted visage, boasting, we believe, that he is the husband of some six or eight wives. "Be we men and endure all this?" Now, what is the remedy for all these evils that disgrace our fair country? There must be an increased sensibility of conscience in society, beginning with the ministry and the Church, then there will be an increased activity that will permeate society and clean out that Augean stable.

About fifteen years ago, after a civil conflict, the equal of which history does not record, four millions of men, women and children came to the surface, and were soon invested with the rights of citizenship and the franchise of freemen. This was an experiment on a scale the world had never seen before. It was an upheaval of the waves, at which the oldest mariner might stand aghast.

Now, after fifteen years sailing on this stormy sea, let us take our reckoning and see where we are. There have been some mistakes and some bad legislation on both sides of this experiment, as we might expect there would be. There has been some uneasiness, and probably, just cause of complaint on the part of those so recently enfranchised from South Carolina and some other States.

There was an exodus to Liberia, another to Kansas, and now one to Arkansas. The real cause we are unable to say. The last one we should attribute to these causes: 1st. A restless feeling that sometimes takes possession of the masses. 2d. A fear, that the so-called Stock Law, will, when in force, operate against the poor man; and 3d. The unusual short crop of the last year, the election laws, and high rents charged for lands.

The colored race of to-day presents a very hopeful condition.

Probably the history of the world does not furnish a parallel to its improvement during the fifteen years of its freedom. During that period its rapid strides in acquiring education, homes, property, and all that constitutes the true elements of a higher civilization have probably equalled the achievements of the Saxon race the first hundred years of its English history.

Industry, economy, the school house, the academy, the college and the Church, we recommend as the antidote to the evils of which we now complain, and as a sure guaranty of a higher civilization to all the races and peoples of all portions of the land.

We acknowledge with devout gratitude the return of an era of good feeling between the different sections. The problems now to be solved call for all the wisdom, prudence, forbearance, and the best efforts of both races North and South, to build up the Kingdom of Christ, and strengthen the ties that bind together our common Country. All of which is respectfully submitted.

MEMOIRS.

Rev. James K. Wagoner, the subject of this Memoir, died in Yorkville, S. C., March 19th, 1881, in the 50th year of his age. He was a native of Yorkville and there lived until called away to

join the blood-washed throng on the other shore. He joined the Methodist Episcopal Church South in the year 1847, in the 17th year of his age, and was converted the same year. His marked Christian character and pious walk, observed by the Church soon after his conversion, evidenced him a suitable person for Class Leader, which office he filled until the close of the war. In the year 1853, he was appointed by Rev. Mr. Boone, his pastor at Yorkville, Collector among the colored people. He succeeded in raising \$100 for his pastor, and \$100 for the cause of Missions. In the year 1868 he determined to join the Methodist Episcopal Church, and wrote for that purpose to Hon. H. Judge Moore in the City of Charleston inquiring for the proper authorities. He received Local Preacher's License from Rev. T. Whittier in the year 1869 and joined the Traveling Connection the same year at a session of the Annual Conference held at Orangeburg. On account of ill health he was forced to take supernumerary relation after four years' active and arduous labor, but continued doing what he could for the Master. He left a devoted wife and son to mourn their loss. Brother Wagoner was fully aware of his end and met the "Grim Monstr" without fear. "What do you think of my case? Do you think I will remain here much longer?" he asked a short time before his death. "I am prepared to die, for my soul is ready." He summoned his wife and son, delivered his papers and dying counsels and then calmly resigned himself. "Glory, glory, glory, the Angels are come for me and I can not stay here longer," were his last words. And so he fell asleep in Jesus. Blessed sleep from which none ever wake to weep. A calm and undisturbed repose at Jesus' feet forever.
