JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS.

FIRST DAY--MORNING SESSION.

The eighty-fourth session (since re-organization, the twenty-fifth) of the South Carolina Conference met at Bethel M. E. Church, Marion, South Carolina, Thursday morning, January 30th, 1890, at 9.15 o'clock. The presiding Bishop, Rev. Thomas Bowman, D. D. appointed Dr. J. S. Chadwick, Assistant Secretary of the Freedman's Aid and Southern Education Society, to conduct the devotional exercises. He read the 1st chapter of the 1st Epistle to Timothy, and announced and sung Hymn No. 1, of the Hymnal, and led in an appropriate prayer for general and special blessings, and in thanksgiving and praise for the continued mercies of God, and for His future blessings.

By request, the Secretary of the last session called the roll. [See Roll.]

On motion, J. B. Middleton was elected Secretary by acclamation, and nominated as assistants: E. H. Coit, I. B. Smith, B. F. Witherspoon, and J. N. Carter. Concurred in. C. C. Scott was appointed Statistical Secretary.

J. E. Wilson was elected Conference Treasurer. The Conference voted to meet daily at 9:30 o'clock, A. M., for the business session, this to be preceded by one-half hour of devotional exercises. It was also voted that the Conference adjourn at one o'clock P. M. The Presiding Elders were appointed a Committee to prepare the list of Standing Committees.

A report from the Book Concerns was read to the Conference, which was ordered filed. Drafts on the chartered fund for \$30, and one on the Book Concerns for \$775.00, were authorized and ordered. E. B. Burroughs was appointed reporter for *The News and Courier*, and C. C. Jacobs for the *Charleston World and Plain Speaker*. The Rev. J. S. Chadwick, D. D., was introduced to the Conference. The Presiding Elders, as a Committee, nominated the following Committees, which were confirmed. (See List.) The Bishop gave notice of the election of two ministers and two laymen from which the delegates to the Ecumenical Conference are to be selected. Also, that a vote to change Section 2 of Paragraph 63, Discipline 1888, would be taken during this sitting of the Conference. A communication from the Board of Education was read to the Conference, and referred to the Conference Treasurer. A communication from Eaton and Stowe on the Episcopal Fund was read, and referred to the Presiding Elders. The accounts of the Book Concerns were referred to J. E. A. Keeler and James H. Johnson for collection. Communications from the Sunday School Mission and Tract Society, also a communication from the *Gospel in All Lands* were read; the former was referred to the Presiding Elders. S. S. Lawton was appointed to take charge of the latter.

Communications from Dr. C. A. Payne were read, and referred to A. G. Townsend. Rev. J. H. Hunt, of the A. M. E. Church, was introduced to the Conference.

Dr. J. S. Chadwick, Assistant Secretary of the Freedman's Aid and Southern Education Society, addressed the Conference in the interest of the Society. The bar of the Conference was fixed at the fourth window from the chancel.

Rev. E. N. Gregg, of the A. M. E. Church, was introduced to the Conference.

The Rev. A. J. Stokes, Presiding Elder, of the Marion District of the M. E. Church, South, was introduced to the Conference.

A lengthy discussion arose over the administration of affairs of Claflin University.

On motion of E. M. Pinckney, it was voted that a Committee be appointed to wait on the Trustees of the Agricultural College in connection with Claflin University.

On motion of J. B. Middleton, this motion was laid on the table.

On motion of Burrel James, Dr. Dunton was summoned by a telegram; also inviting Dr. Parkhurst, of Boston, Mass., to visit the Conference while in session.

The Rev. W. A. Rogers, of the M. E. Church, South, was introduced.

The Minutes were read and approved.

A. Middleton was appointed to open the exercises to-morrow morning.

On motion of F. D. Smith, it was voted that when we do adjourn, we adjourn to meet at 3.30 P. M., for the purpose of receiving the statistics.

The list of Committees was called and notices given.

An address of welcome is to be delivered by the Pastor and responses by A. Middleton, at 7 o'clock, P. M.

At 7.30 P. M., Dr. Chadwick is to address the public in the interest of the Freedman's Aid and Southern Education Society.

J. E. Wilson was appointed to preside at the afternoon session.

The long metre doxology was sung, and the benediction pronounced by Rev. A. J. Stokes, of the M. E. Church, South.

FIRST DAY—SECOND SESSION.

The Conference opened at 3.30 o'clock, P. M., pursuant to adjournment; the Rev. J. E. Wilson, D. D., presiding by appointment of the Bishop.

Devotional exercises conducted by A. E. Quick.

The Roll of Conference was called for the reception of reports and the benevolent and other contributions which were handed in.

Adjourned with long metre doxology and benediction by E. H. Coit.

SECOND DAY—MORNING SESSION.

The Conference opened at 9.30 o'clock, A. M. Bishop Thomas Bowman, in the Chair.

Devotional exercises conducted by A. Middleton.

The Roll call was dispensed with.

The 20th Question was taken up, and the Charleston District was called.

A. C. Dutton, Presiding Elder, was called and his character passed. He presented the report of his District.

On motion, it was voted to admit only members of the Conference, supplies and visitors from other Conferences. On motion it was voted that speakers be allowed only ten minutes, excepting by unanimous consent. The resolution of E. M. Pinckney, which was laid on the table, was called for, and discussed. The previous question was called, and sustained.

The following resolution was adopted as a substitute:

Resolved, That the Conference do appoint a Committee to wait upon the Board of Trustees of Claflin University and request them to see the Board of Trustees of the State Agricultural College, and pray them to take into consideration the advisability of allowing them to have some voice in naming the professors to fill the several chairs accredited to the State Agricultural College at Claflin University.

The resolution endorsing the administration of Claflin University, offered by Bro. J. B. Middleton, was laid upon the table.

Resolved, That we heartily endorse the present administration of Claflin University in all of its details and its present management, and cordially recommend the Institution to the patronage and support of our people.

3.30 o'clock, P. M. Sermon by J. B. Middleton. Text: Acts 4, 12. This was followed by the ordination of Elders.

7.30 o'clock, P. M. Annual Missionary Sermon, by N. T. Bowen. Text: Luke 23, 26. Two persons joined the Church on probation.

FIFTH DAY—MORNING SESSION.

The Conference met at 9.30 o'clock, A. M. The Bishop, Rev. Thos. Bowman presiding. The devotional exercises were conducted by Benj. Robinson.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE STATE OF THE COUNTRY.

Your Committee on the State of the Country, beg leave to report:

The scope given us is exceedingly broad in its nature. The interests assigned us for consideration are numerous and of great import. It cannot therefore be expected that in this paper justice will be given to the subject in hand. We shall, however, in as concise a manner as possible, discuss such points as we believe to have claims upon our concern.

We are truly grateful to our Heavenly Father, for the many blessings which we as recipients have had bestowed upon us during the past year. We rejoice for the part that the grand old Methodist Episcopal Church has taken in the spiritual, moral and material advancement of our country. We have also been spared from the calamities of war, pestilence and famine. Disasters from flood and storm with terrific force have swept away life and prosperity, but the nation has been spared, and our hope still remains firm and secure.

Such is the relation of the Church to the State, such are the responsibilities of the gospel ministry, that notwithstanding the fact that the Government is intrusted to the management of the statesman and the politician, we are duty bound to take cognizance of the various phases of the affairs in our common country.

With our influence pledged against all manner of evil, our work for the spread of righteousness, we recognize the truth, that the condemnation of wrong must not only be expressed in the strongest terms, but every possible agency must be applied for the removal of the same. Silence on the part of those whose duty it is to vindicate right, would be a violation of our solemn obligations to God and to man. It would be a sign of negligence to those whom we should lead in the conflict against error, and to triumph and enjoyment of greater blessings and higher privileges than those we now experience.

Many and peculiar are the obstructions to this desired advancement. Numerous and ready are the votaries of iniquity, who by persecution, fraud, robbery, murder, unjust discrimination, mob law, intemperance, bribery, ostracism, and open hostility against the sympathizer, and philanthropist, swear upon the high altar of caste prejudice that the negro has no rights which a white man is bound

to respect. Great unrest is realized by those who contributed in the midst of great sufferings, untold privations, indescribable oppression, their toil and sweat, and groans, and blood, yea, and their lives for the development of this South-land, from which their enemies would rather have them driven, than yield to them the God-given, purchased upon countless fields of battle.

There is no problem in the South, but an inconceivable amount of perversion of justice. The foreigner, with the instincts of time, liberty burning in his breast rather than suffer oppression, leaves the home of his birth and seeks refuge in our native land, and finds an obstructed path to eminence and power. Should not this provoke jealousy? Should not this excite prejudice; and will not this bring down wrath from millions of hands which we would rather uplift for the defense of those who should be our friends?

These are times for wise council, when broad, unbiased, and statesmanlike consideration should be accorded the vital questions of the day. Strong men need stand firm upon the foundation principles upon which the Republic is founded. The watchword:

"Right is right, since God is God,
And right the day must win."

should pass clear all along the line of God's great army, and vigorous steps be taken to trample under foot the erroneous aspersions against the fatherhood of God and the brotherhood of man. Be it therefore

Resolved, 1st. That we rejoice in the loyalty of the M. E. Church to the principles of our Republican form of government, and the noble work thus far prosecuted by her for the abolition of ignorance and caste prejudice.

Resolved, 2d. That we deeply deplore the recent cold blooded and atrocious murders committed within the bounds of our State upon the helpless and defenseless members of our race, and commend to the sympathy of all people their widows and orphans.

Resolved, 3d. That we deplore the silence of so many pulpits from which gospel missiles of condemnation should have been hurled against the false and prevailing ideas that might make her right.

Resolved, 4th. That we highly appreciate the indomitable and repeated efforts of the Hon. H. W. Blair in Congress for the passage of his invaluable education bill, the passage of which would bring light and progress, wealth and recognition of our yet needy people.

Resolved, 5th. That we hereby earnestly entreat the friends of our race to use all the possible and justifiable means necessary to assist in the passage of this great measure, and that we devoutly pray God's blessings upon the same.

Resolved, 6th. That we condemn the professed concern recently manifested in the halls of Congress by certain men thereof, relative to the exportation of the negro, and that we regard it as a subterfuge and inconsistent with the relations that should exist between representatives and their constituents.

At Camden three sturdy missionaries are at work, and the excellent school is well patronized and flourishing under efficient management. We heartily commend these enterprises and fully appreciate their importance to our people.

Memoir.

REV. JAMES WOFFORD WHITE, the subject of this memoir, was born at Lynchburg, Sumter County, South Carolina, October 20th, 1856, and peacefully fell asleep in Jesus, January 7th, 1890, in the 34th year of his age.

In early life he was religiously trained; both of his parents and they to whom he was so early committed were exemplary Christians.

His mother and father died when he was quite young.

At an early age he embraced religion and joined the Methodist Episcopal Church.

His early education was received in the public schools of Charleston.

He was among the first students of Claflin University, which he attended for several scholastic years. From Claflin he went to the State University of South Carolina at Columbia.

Circumstances, well known to all, prevented him in 1876 from graduating.

He was in 1880 used as a supply at Yorkville Station. In 1881 he was admitted on trial into the South Carolina Conference. Until his death he filled acceptably many of the best appointments in the Conference.

He was an indefatigable, fearless temperance advocate.

In the pulpit and on the floor of the Conference his arguments were convincing, his eloquence powerful and logical, and he never failed to make the desired impressions and carry his points.

He was a truly pious Christian gentleman, a warm-hearted brother, a friend in need, a successful gospel minister and Master-builder.

Every Church he served since his admission into the Conference was materially improved, more or less, as well as spiritually edified and built up in the most holy faith.

He was a reserve delegate to the General Conference of 1888, which met in New York city.

The closing hours of his life were filled with praises of Him whom he had faithfully preached for ten years.

He raised his emaciated hand toward heaven and waved a salute, saying: "Yes, Master Jesus, we are coming!"

Just before he expired he said: "It is beautiful before the sun goes down."

Many other interesting sayings and quotations from the Bible were spoken and made by him.

He lies buried in Charleston, between the two Churches he last served by appointment.

Though young, we mourn the loss of no ordinary man. Truly, "there is a prince and a great man fallen this day in Israel."

He died not as Abner died, thank God.

He desired to die and be with Christ. Said he: "I have interests in both worlds."

Devout men have carried him to his burial. His voice is hushed, his hands rest quietly at his side, his feet are drawn up, and never more shall walk the dusty earth in search of the sick, poor and needy, nor to the house of God, nor to the Conference room.

Yet he lives among us in the works that he has done, in our memory and in the memory of thousands to whom he endeared himself, in unbroken, undying ties of love.

He lives with his Master, Christ, and with Him he shall come, when, "the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God; and the dead in Christ shall rise first; then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air. And so shall we ever be with the Lord."
