Wofford's Richard Johnson will be coaching his final regular season game. Promoted to athletic director on Dec. 3, Johnson is coaching the Terriers through the conclusion of the season. At that point, longtime assistant Mike Young will become head coach. Johnson is a 1976 graduate of The Citadel and a former four-year starter for the Bulldogs. Upon his graduation, he served nine years as an assistant under then coach and now Athletic Director Les Robinson. He left his alma mater in 1985 when current SoCon Commissioner and then Wofford Athletic Director Danny Morrison hired him to be the Terriers' coach.

•The Terriers defeated the Bulldogs, 73-64, in overtime on Jan. 7 in Spartanburg. With Lee Nixon being limited to just two minutes due to injury, Wofford freshmen Justin Stephens and Adrien Borders each played 42 minutes in posting career-high scoring games of 20 and 17 points, respectively. Mike Lenzly added 20 points, eight rebounds, and a single-game school record five blocks while playing all 45 minutes.

•Since beginning SoCon play in the 1997-98 season, Wofford holds a 6-3 series lead over The Citadel.

•Lenzly is the only player in the SoCon to rank in the Top 13 in scoring, rebounding, and assists. He is also fifth in the league with six double-doubles (points and rebounds).

•Stephens ranks third among SoCon rookies in scoring at 12.6 points per game with that mark increasing to a team-best 14.3 in league action. Stephens tops all SoCon freshmen in assists while placing 10th overall (3.4 apg). He's also 12th in steals (1.6 spg).

The Game

Richard Johnson will coach his final regular season game as Wofford travels to The Citadel.

Promoted to athletic director on Dec. 3, Johnson is coaching the Terriers through the conclusion of the season. At that point, longtime assistant **Mike Young** will become head coach.

The Terriers defeated the Bulldogs, 73-64, in overtime on Jan. 7 in Spartanburg. With **Lee Nixon** being limited to just two minutes due to injury, Wofford freshmen **Justin Stephens** and **Adrien Borders** each played 42 minutes in posting career-high scoring games of 20 and 17 points, respectively. **Mike Lenzly** added 20 points, eight rebounds, and a single-game school record five blocks while playing all 45 minutes.

Since beginning SoCon play in the 1997-98 season, Wofford holds a 6-3 series lead over The Citadel.

Worth Noting

•Point guard **Mike Lenzly** is the only player in the SoCon to rank in the Top 11 in scoring, rebounding, and assists. He is also fifth in the league with six double-doubles (points and rebounds).

•Justin Stephens ranks third among SoCon rookies in scoring at 12.6 points per game with that mark increasing to a team-best 14.3 in league action. Stephens tops all SoCon freshmen in assists while placing 10th overall (3.4 apg). He's also 12th in steals (1.6 spg).

Meet The Head Coach

•**Richard Johnson** is in his 17th season at Wofford College. The 6-foot-8 head coach has a 100 percent graduation rate for all players who have completed their eligibility under him.

The Blue Island, Ill., native officially began his new duties as Wofford's athletic director on Dec. 3. He is coaching the Terriers through the conclusion of the season.

Johnson has been the runner-up for SoCon Coach of the Year honors twice in the Terriers' four seasons of league play. He ranks second all-time at Wofford in victories and fifth in winning percentage with a 236-228 mark (.509). His 200th win was a 79-74 victory at Clemson during the 1999-00 campaign.

A 1976 Citadel graduate, Johnson came to Wofford after serving nine years as an assistant at his alma mater under then coach and now Athletic Director **Les Robinson**.

During his Wofford tenure, Johnson has guided the Terriers from NAIA membership to NCAA Division II in 1988, Division I Independent status in 1995, and the Southern Conference in 1997.

Wofford-Clemson Battles

•The last three meetings between Wofford and Clemson have seen a total of 12 points separate the teams.

•The Terriers built a 14-point first-half lead before the Tigers fought back and then held off a late Wofford charge for an 85-82 victory at Littlejohn Coliseum on Nov. 24.

Trailing by eight with 1:38 left, the Terriers closed within two points and had the ball with 34 seconds remaining before committing a turnover. Wofford missed a 3-pointer at the buzzer that would have forced overtime.

•Last year, Wofford rallied from a 20-point deficit to take a one-point lead with less than two minutes to play before Clemson came back for a 78-74 victory.

•In the 1999-00 campaign, the Terriers rallied from 17 points down in the final 10:43 for a 79-74 win at Clemson.

Making a Run in the Polls

Wofford was recently listed for two weeks under "others receiving consideration" in the College Insider Mid-Major Top 25 poll by www.collegeinsider.com.

Law School Bound

Starting center **Kenny Hastie** took the Law School Admission Test (LSAT) in October and is currently undergoing law school interviews.

Due to a family emergency, he had to cancel a scheduled interview at Duke on Jan. 25.

Hastie did interview at the University of South Carolina Law School on Jan. 31, the morning after posting a career-best 15 rebounds at Davidson.

He has also applied to law schools at the University of Georgia and the University of Miami (Fla.).

Same Five

Prior to Grant Sterley's injury, Wofford had the same starting five of Mike Lenzly, Justin Stephens, Lee Nixon, Sterley, and Kenny Hastie in its opening 20 games.

Sam Daniels then started the next six contests before Sterley returned to the lineup Monday against Western Carolina.

Keys to Victories

Wofford shoots 44.3 percent from the field, including 35.8 from 3-point range, in its victories this season. The Terriers are at a 37.5 clip (27.5 behind the arc) in their defeats.

Wofford also averages 42.0 rebounds in its wins compared to 32.9 in the losses.

Schedule Difficulty

The tradition continued this season when it came to Wofford facing one of the toughest schedules in the nation for a mid-major Division I program. In their opening 12 games, the Terriers played at Memphis, Clemson, Nebraska, NC State, and Georgia Tech. Wofford also played host to South Carolina on Nov. 28.

The RPI rankings, which take into account Division I games only, determined that Wofford's pre-Christmas schedule last season was the most difficult in the nation. The Terriers had road games at Georgia Tech, South Carolina, Boston College, Alabama, Clemson, and Vanderbilt. Wofford was also home for William & Mary.

According to the Sagarin Ratings in the 1999-00 campaign, Wofford played the nation's third toughest pre-Christmas schedule. Only Iowa and Temple faced more difficult slates.

Preseason Honors

Wofford point guard **Mike Lenzly** received preseason All-SoCon honors from *Basketball Times*.

Lenzly was an All-SoCon selection from the league media last year after averaging 18.1 points, 6.7 rebounds, and 4.3 assists over the final seven games.

He posted Wofford's first-ever triple-double with 21 points, 12 assists, and 10 rebounds in a 105-69 victory over Chattanooga.

Chasing Triple-Doubles

Mike Lenzly has flirted four times this season with his second career triple-double:

and a Point Guard

•Mike Lenzly ranks second on the Terriers and ninth in the SoCon in rebounding with his average of 6.9 boards per game.

•Lenzly tops the nation in blocked shots for players 6-foot-3 and under with 23 rejections in 26 games (0.9 per contest). He tied a single-game school record with five blocks in the 73-64 victory over The Citadel.

Wofford point guard **Mike Lenzly** earned SoCon Player of the Week honors (Jan. 2-7) after averaging 18.0 points and 8.3 rebounds while playing all 125 minutes in leading the Terriers to three victories and first place in the South Division.

Lenzly added eight blocked shots, seven assists, and two steals. He posted a double-double of 13 points and 11 boards in a 66-64 win at the College of Charleston while tying a single-game school record with five blocked shots in the 73-64 overtime victory against The Citadel.

The following is an inside look at Head Coach Richard Johnson's two assistants:

•Associate Head Coach Mike Young is in his 13th year at Wofford and will take over the head coaching duties at the conclusion of the season. He has been with the Terriers through their rise from NCAA Division II to Division I Independent and the Southern Conference.

•Alex Peavey joined the Terriers two years ago after working with the basketball program at Virginia Commonwealth.

He is the son of Marion Peavey, a 1965 Wofford graduate and current Executive Director of the NCAA Foundation.

The Trickle Down

The SoCon hiring a new commissioner resulted in Wofford naming a new head basketball coach.

With Danny Morrison leaving his Wofford senior vice-president position to become the SoCon commissioner. David Wood was promoted from athletic director to Morrison's vacated role.

Head Basketball Coach Richard Johnson was then promoted to athletic director on Dec. 3 with the announcement that he would coach the Terriers just through the remainder of the 2001-02 season.

In his first official day as athletic director, Johnson made his first coaching hire. He tabbed longtime assistant Mike Young to take over the head coaching duties effective at the close of the campaign. Young is in his 13th year at Wofford.

Morrison hired Johnson to be Wofford's basketball coach in 1985.

Winning The Battle

As reported in the Memphis Commercial-Appeal, Wofford freshman Justin Stephens won the head-to-head battle with 2001 National High School Player of the Year Dajuan Wagner in the Nov. 13 opener at Memphis:

Crowd Watch

•The Nov. 28 home game with South Carolina represented the first sellout in the 21-year history of the Benjamin Johnson Arena (3,500).

•The crowd of 13,586 for the season opener at Memphis was the largest to ever see a Wofford basketball game, bettering the previous mark of 13,548 at UNLV on Feb. 7, 1998.

Fashion Statement

Wofford Associate Head Men's Basketball Coach Mike Young was named the best dressed assistant coach in Division I basketball last year by www.collegeinsider.com.

Young was nominated for the honor by graduated All-SoCon guard Ian Chadwick, who wrote a weekly journal for the web site. In his nomination, Chadwick referred to Young as a "pretty spiffy guy."



Freshman Impact

The Terriers' nine-man rotation features four freshmen (Justin Stephens, Sam Daniels, Adrien Borders, Jeff Tarr).

Those four rookies combined to score 45 of Wofford's 76 points in the 76-67 win over Georgia Southern (Feb. 9).

Masic to Graduate Early

Backup center Edvin Masic, a junior with two seasons of eligibility remaining but troubled by chronic knee problems, is in his final year of playing as he will graduate a semester early in December 2002.

Streak Over

Listed below are notables from Wofford's 66-64 win at the College of Charleston (Jan. 2).

Dating back to last season, each of the last four games between Wofford and the College of Charleston have come down to the final possession in regulation.

•Wofford became just the second SoCon team to win at the John Kresse Arena in CofC's four seasons of league play.

·Wofford nearly didn't make the trip to Charleston that day due to a statewide snowstorm.

•The Terriers had dropped 16 straight games to the Cougars dating back to Feb. 17, 1979.

•Wofford hadn't won at Charleston since Nov. 29, 1974, representing a stretch of 13 games. Head Coach Richard Johnson was in his junior year at The Citadel at the time.

Priorities

The 66-64 win at the College of Charleston (Jan. 2) was big for Wofford.

However, it ranked second on the priority level that day for Terrier Associate Head Coach Mike Young.

On the bus ride returning from Charleston, Young was beaming for a different reason. His two-year-old daughter, Cooper, used the potty for the first time back home in Spartanburg.

Wofford assistant coach Alex Peavey has been named by www.collegeinsider.com as one of the "50 Most Eligible Bachelors" in the Division I coaching ranks.

A Look Ahead

Following the game at The Citadel, Wofford will return to Charleston on Wednesday for the SoCon Tournament.

The Terriers are locked into the No. 6-seed in the South Division and the second game Thursday at approximately 2:30 p.m.

Wofford's opponent is most likely UNC Greensboro. ETSU is also a possibility if the Bucs are upset Saturday at Appalachian State.

The Terriers and Spartans were tied in the final minute of a Jan. 26 contest in Spartanburg before UNCG posted an 81-76 victory. Wofford starting forward Grant Sterley played just 13 minutes that night before leaving the game with a knee injury.

The Ironman

Point guard Mike Lenzly has played the entire game, including two overtime contests, in eight of Wofford's 15 SoCon games. On two occasions, he played 39 minutes.

He's averaging 38.6 minutes in SoCon action and 35.6 overall.

Lenzly was limited to 23 minutes against Chattanooga (Feb. 4) due to an eye injury.

The Ironman Speaks

On frequently playing the entire game, Mike Lenzly said, "It's no big deal. Practice is two hours. A game is only 40 minutes."

Future Terriers

The Wofford basketball program has announced the signing of two players to National Letters-of-Intent:

•**Tyler Berg** is a 6-foot-9, 225-pound center from East Gaston High School in Mt. Holly, N.C.

Berg is in his third year as a starter for East Gaston. As a junior, he was named team Most Valuable Player after averaging 19 points, 12 rebounds, and 2.6 blocks per game. He was selected to the All-Conference team and was honored as the Player of the Year by the *Gaston Gazette*. Berg was also named second-team All-Piedmont.

"Tyler possesses a rare combination of size, good hands, and the ability to run the floor," said Wofford Head Coach **Richard Johnson**. "Almost more importantly, he has a real passion to be a great player."

As a sophomore, Berg averaged 11.2 points and 9.8 rebounds per game while being the recipient of a team rebounding award.

"I chose Wofford because of the atmosphere of the students and people on campus," Berg said. "Wofford is a good fit for me. The players and coaches were a big influence in my decision."

During the past two summers, Berg has played for the AAU Charlotte Royals. His team captured the 16-and-under national championship and placed third in the 17-and-under division. He was also a four-year cross country athlete for East Gaston.

•Howard Wilkerson is a 6-foot-6, 225-pound forward from Morehead High School in Eden, N.C.

Wilkerson is playing this year for Fork Union (Va.) Military Academy.

He averaged 22 points and 12 rebounds in earning Conference Player of the Year and All-Northwest North Carolina honors as a senior last year at Morehead. He was also on the All-Greensboro Area team and a selection to the East-West All-Star Game.

"Howard possesses a rare blend of athleticism, strength, and raw ability," Wofford Associate Head Coach **Mike Young** said. "He has long arms and is a relentless rebounder.

"He will be a very good player in the Southern Conference. We expect big things from him right away."

Wilkerson was an All-Conference football player as a wide receiver and defensive end in high school. He also earned Conference Player of the Year honors in track while competing in the discus and shot put.

"I'm looking forward to coming to Wofford and the opportunity to play right away," Wilkerson said. "I love the schedule that Wofford faces each year.

"I also love the players and coaches. It's a real good atmosphere on campus."

Double-Doubles

Stephens' scoring average improves to a team-best 14.3 points in SoCon play to rank 15th overall for league games only.

The 6-foot-2 native of Newnan, Ga., is scoring at a higher clip than former Wofford guard **Ian Chadwick** (12.0 ppg) when he earned SoCon Freshman of the Year honors in the 1997-98 campaign.

Sterley Returns

Wofford starting forward **Grant Sterley** returned to the lineup Monday after missing the previous six games with a torn meniscus in his right knee suffered against UNC Greensboro (Jan. 26).

Sterley provided an immediate spark to the Terriers with an offensive rebound on their first possession of the game. His eight boards in just 19 minutes were just one shy of a career-high nine set earlier this season in the 73-64 victory over The Citadel (Jan. 7).

Prior to the injury, Sterley was playing the best basketball of his Wofford career. He had averaged 9.7 points and 5.5 rebounds in the previous six games, including a career-best 17 points at ETSU (Jan. 23).

Quick Starts

Wofford opened this season with a 9-6 record for its best start to a campaign in seven years of Division I play.

The Terriers open each season with arguably the toughest nonconference schedule for a Division I mid-major, averaging six games per year against major conference competition.

Following a 73-64 overtime victory against The Citadel (Jan. 7), Wofford was three games above .500 for the first time in Division I.

Wofford's "Lethal Weapon 3"

Wofford guards **Mike Lenzly** (14.2 ppg), **Lee Nixon** (13.7 ppg), and **Justin Stephens** (12.6 ppg) all place in the SoCon's Top 19 in scoring.

Lenzly is 13th while Nixon ranks 15th and Stephens 19th. Wofford's "Lethal Weapon 3" combines for 40.5 points per game, representing 59.6 percent of the Terrier offense (68.0 ppg).

Terriers or Puppies?

Wofford's roster features just one seasoned senior (Kenny Hastie) with six of the 12 players in their freshman or sophomore year.

The Terriers entered the campaign with just four players (Hastie, **Mike Lenzly**, **Lee Nixon**, and **Grant Sterley**) who had played more than one season on the collegiate level.

Defensive Stops

•Wofford tops the SoCon by limiting its opponents to a 30.1 shooting percentage from 3-point range.

•Wofford is also fifth in the league in scoring defense, holding the opposition to 68.9 points per game.

The Terriers are 8-2 when their opponents score 64 points or fewer.
Wofford's 56-46 win over Sacramento State in the Guardians Classic (Nov. 14) represented the lowest point total allowed by the Terriers in a win over a Division I team since joining those ranks in 1995-96.

•Jan. 2 - Edvin Masic hit an eight-foot baseline jumper at the final buzzer to give Wofford a 66-64 victory at the College of Charleston.

•Jan. 7 - Travis Cantrell of The Citadel misses a 15-foot jumper at the buzzer in regulation that would have won the game for the Bulldogs. The Terriers go on to a 73-64 overtime victory.

•Jan. 12 - College of Charleston's Jeff Bolton hits a 12-foot jump shot with 0.8 seconds left to force overtime before CofC pulls away for a 73-61 win.

•Jan. 14 - Justin Stephens sees his reverse layup fall off the rim as the final buzzer sounds in a 79-77 Terrier loss at Chattanooga.

•Jan. 26 - Mike Lenzly misses a 3-pointer with three seconds left that would have tied the UNC Greensboro game. The Terriers drop an 81-76 decision.

Handling the Ball

The Terriers top the SoCon in committing the fewest turnovers per game (13.0), including just 50 in their last five contests (10.0 avg).

Wofford's Rudy

Team Manager **Brett Myers** scored four points in six minutes of action while becoming the only Wofford player to ever be carried off the court at the Benjamin Johnson Arena as he made his collegiate debut in an 87-59 win over Virginia Intermont (Dec. 15).

A senior from Greer, S.C., and a four-year letterman in basketball at St. Joseph High School, Myers entered the game with 7:54 to play and the Terriers holding a 71-42 lead.

He made an immediate impact as he took part in Wofford's next five points.

Myers picked up an assist when he fed **Grant Sterley** for a layup. Myers then hit a 3-pointer to extend the Terrier margin to 76-44 with 5:35 left. He later added a free-throw to finish with four points.

Wofford came very close to a pair of wins over ACC opponents this season.

The Terriers built double-digit leads at Clemson (Nov. 24) and Georgia Tech (Dec. 21) before falling 85-82 and 79-70, respectively.

Wofford held a 14-point first-half lead and led by 11 at the intermission against the Tigers. The game ended with the Terriers missing a 3pointer at the buzzer that would have forced overtime.

The Terriers led the Yellow Jackets by 11 points with 17 minutes left before Georgia Tech used its depth to rally for the win.

Stifling Defense

Wofford's 59-49 win over Furman (Jan. 5) represented the Paladins' lowest point total against the Terriers in 64 games, dating back to a 49-46 Wofford victory in the 1946-47 season.

Not Bad Company

Six of Wofford's losses are to three ACC teams (Clemson, N.C. State, Georgia Tech) and members of the Big 12 (Nebraska), Conference USA (Memphis), and SEC (South Carolina).

Versus The SoCon

With a 36-46 record (.439), Wofford has played nearly .500 ball in its brief SoCon history which began with the Terriers in just their third year in Division I.

•Founded in 1854, Wofford has an enrollment of 1,100, making it the smallest school in NCAA Division I-A or I-AA football.

•With 1,100 students, Wofford is the second smallest school in Division I. Only Centenary (La.) is smaller with 850 students. However, the Gentlemen do not field a football team.

•Famous Wofford graduates include Carolina Panther owner and founder **Jerry Richardson** and Air Force Head Football Coach **Fisher DeBerry**.

•Wofford ranks No. 1 among national liberal arts colleges in "operating efficiency," providing a quality education while spending relatively less.

Wofford built an 11-point halftime lead before seeing Clemson rally and then hold off a late Terrier charge in an 85-82 Tiger victory at Littlejohn Coliseum.

Lee Nixon scored a game-high 25 points while Mike Lenzly added 20, including six 3-pointers, and freshman Justin Stephens scored 18 to pace a Wofford attack that saw the Terriers hit 15-of-32 3-pointers (46.9 percent).

Wofford's biggest margin of the night came when Lenzly scored on a layup to give the Terriers a 41-27 lead with 3:02 left in the first half. It capped a 26-9 Wofford run.

Clemson's size advantage inside began to wear Wofford down in the second half. A **Chey Christie** layup allowed the Tigers to regain the lead at 61-60 with 10:04 to play. After a long 3-pointer from the wing by Nixon tied the game at 67-67 with 7:58 remaining, Clemson went on a 12-4 run to take its largest lead of the night at 79-71 on a **Ray Henderson** 3-point play with 1:38 left.

However, Wofford chipped away at the deficit. Another deep three by Nixon pulled the Terriers within 81-79 with 55 seconds to play. After Clemson's **Chris Hobbs** missed a layup on the other end, Wofford came down the court trailing by two with 34 seconds remaining. **Dwon Clifton** then made a key steal for Clemson, setting the stage for a pair of **Ed Scott** free-throws which gave the Tigers an 83-79 lead with 24 seconds remaining.

Nixon hit an off-balance bank shot from the top of the key to pull Wofford within 83-82 with seven seconds to play. Christie was then fouled and hit a pair of free-throws to provide the final margin of 85-82 with six seconds left. Wofford had a last chance to force overtime, but Lenzly missed a 3-pointer at the buzzer.

Kenny Hastie equaled a career-high with 13 rebounds, the third time in four games he reached double figures in boards.

The Terriers shot 45.7 percent on the night after a 54.5 mark in the first half. The Tigers shot 57.6 percent in the second half to finish at 52.3.

On the final possession, Lenzly again brought the ball downcourt and found Masic open on the baseline for the game-winner.

Charleston shot 57.1 percent in the first half and took a 32-24 lead at the intermission. The Terriers controlled the second half, outscoring CofC 42-32 and hitting on 53.3 percent of their shots.

Charleston stretched its lead to 10 points at 34-24 with 19 minutes left on a dunk by **Mike Benton**.

Nixon's 3-pointer with 13:58 left capped a 12-2 Wofford run and tied the game at 36-36. Nixon finished with a game-high 25 points, including 21 in the second half.

With 3:50 to play, **Justin Stephens** made an alley-oop pass to Nixon who converted it into a spectacular reverse dunk while being fouled on the play. His subsequent free-throw tied the game at 58-58 and gave the Terriers momentum down the stretch.

Lenzly finished with 13 points and 11 rebounds, the fourth doubledouble on the year for the Terrier point guard.

Wofford dropped its second straight heartbreaker as a tough night at the free-throw line resulted in a 79-77 defeat at Chattanooga.

The Terriers missed an opportunity to force overtime at the final buzzer when a reverse layup attempt by **Justin Stephens** hung on the rim before falling out.

The see-saw game had 21 lead changes and 11 ties.

Wofford was just 20-of-35 (57.1 percent) at the charity stripe, including 13-of-24 (54.2 percent) in the second half.

Trailing 73-70 with 2:07 to play, the Terriers took a 76-73 lead with 57 seconds remaining when **Lee Nixon** and **Grant Sterley** hit back-to-back 3-pointers. Nixon topped both teams with 27 points for the second-best game of his Wofford career.

After a **Tim Parker** bucket pulled the Mocs within 76-75 at the 49-second mark, Nixon had a short jumper go in-and-out with 32 seconds left. Parker then hit the go-ahead basket for Chattanooga with 14 ticks remaining to put the Mocs on top 77-76.

Following a Wofford turnover, **Petie Spaulding** was fouled with eight seconds remaining and made both free-throws to give UTC a 79-76 lead. Stephens hit one of two free-throws with 7.4 seconds left to pull Wofford within 79-77.

UTC then had a chance to ice the game at the line, but Parker missed both attempts. **Mike Lenzly** grabbed the defensive board and fed Stephens who raced down the court, but his layup attempt missed and Chattanooga kept its home record perfect at 9-0.

Wofford nearly came back from a seven-point deficit in the final minute before Western Carolina, behind a career-high 29 points from **Cory Largent**, held on for a 77-71 victory.

The contest represented the final home game in the 17-year tenure of Wofford Head Coach **Richard Johnson**.

The Terriers faced their largest deficit of the night at 72-65 before **Justin Stephens** hit a 3-pointer to close the margin to 72-68 with 42 seconds to play. After **Willie Freeman** made 1-of-2 free-throws to build the Catamount lead back to 73-68, **Kenny Hastie** converted a 3-point play with 32 seconds left to cut the Terrier deficit to 73-71.

Following a **Kevin Martin** free-throw to extend the Western Carolina lead to 74-71, Wofford had a chance to tie the game but **Sam Daniels** missed a 3-pointer from the corner with 17 seconds to play.

Stephens topped Wofford with 23 points while **Lee Nixon** added 17. Starting forward **Grant Sterley**, who had missed the previous six games with a knee injury, returned to the lineup and contributed seven points and eight boards in 19 minutes.

The game was deadlocked 31-31 at the intermission with the second half seeing seven ties and six lead changes.

Joining Stephens on the squad are Jason Conley (VMI), Kevin Martin (Western Carolina), Tony Mitchell (College of Charleston), Tiras Wade (East Tennessee State), and Terry Williams (Georgia Southern).

Stephens is the third-leading scorer among SoCon freshmen with a 12.6 points per game average. His scoring mark increases to 14.1 in SoCon play. Stephens tops all league rookies with 91 assists while his 42 steals place second.

The Game

The Wofford basketball team (No. 6-seed, South) opens SoCon Tournament play against defending league champion UNC Greensboro (No. 3-seed, North).

The winner of this contest will face Chattanooga (No. 2-seed, South) at approximately 2:30 p.m. on Friday.

The first meeting this season between the Terriers and Spartans went down to the wire as UNCG held off a gutsy Wofford effort for an 81-76 victory (Jan. 26, Spartanburg, S.C). The game featured 10 ties and 11 lead changes.

The Terriers were plagued by foul trouble and lost starting forward **Grant Sterley** after just 13 minutes to a knee injury. Wofford played stretches of the second half with four freshmen on the court.

Worth Noting

•Wofford Head Coach **Richard Johnson** was promoted to athletic director on Dec. 3. He is coaching the Terriers through the close of the season. Associate Head Coach **Mike Young**, in his 13th year at Wofford, will then take over as head coach.

•Point guard **Mike Lenzly** is the only player in the SoCon to rank in the Top 12 in scoring, rebounding, and assists. He is also fifth in the league with six double-doubles (points and rebounds).

•Justin Stephens, who scored 20 points in the first meeting with UNC Greensboro, ranks third among SoCon rookies in scoring at 12.6 points per game with that mark increasing to 14.1 in league action.

Meet The Head Coach

•**Richard Johnson** is in his 17th season at Wofford College. The 6-foot-8 head coach has a 100 percent graduation rate for all players who have completed their eligibility under him.

The Blue Island, Ill., native officially began his new duties as Wofford's athletic director on Dec. 3. He is coaching the Terriers through the conclusion of the season.

Johnson has been the runner-up for SoCon Coach of the Year honors twice in the Terriers' five seasons of league play. He ranks second all-time at Wofford in victories and fifth in winning percentage with a 236-229 mark (.508). His 200th win was a 79-74 victory at Clemson during the 1999-00 campaign.

A 1976 Citadel graduate, Johnson came to Wofford after serving nine years as an assistant at his alma mater under then coach and now Athletic Director **Les Robinson**.

During his Wofford tenure, Johnson has guided the Terriers from NAIA membership to NCAA Division II in 1988, Division I Independent status in 1995, and the Southern Conference in 1997.

Wofford-Clemson Battles

•The last three meetings between Wofford and Clemson have seen a total of 12 points separate the teams.

•The Terriers built a 14-point first-half lead before the Tigers fought back and then held off a late Wofford charge for an 85-82 victory at Littlejohn Coliseum on Nov. 24.

Trailing by eight with 1:38 left, the Terriers closed within two points and had the ball with 34 seconds remaining before committing a turnover. Wofford missed a 3-pointer at the buzzer that would have forced overtime.

•Last year, Wofford rallied from a 20-point deficit to take a one-point lead with less than two minutes to play before Clemson came back for a 78-74 victory.

•In the 1999-00 campaign, the Terriers rallied from 17 points down in the final 10:43 for a 79-74 win at Clemson.

Making a Run in the Polls

Wofford was listed for two weeks this season under "others receiving consideration" in the College Insider Mid-Major Top 25 poll by www.collegeinsider.com.

Law School Bound

Starting center Kenny Hastie took the Law School Admission Test (LSAT) in October and is currently undergoing law school interviews.

Due to a family emergency, he had to cancel a scheduled interview at Duke on Jan. 25.

Hastie did interview at the University of South Carolina Law School on Jan. 31, the morning after posting a career-best 15 rebounds at Davidson.

He has also applied to law schools at the University of Georgia and the University of Miami (Fla.).

Masic to Graduate Early

Reserve center Edvin Masic, a junior with two seasons of eligibility remaining but troubled by a chronic left knee problem, is in his final year of playing as he will graduate a semester early in December 2002.

Schedule Difficulty

The tradition continued this season when it came to Wofford facing one of the toughest schedules in the nation for a mid-major Division I program. In their opening 12 games, the Terriers played at Memphis, Clemson, Nebraska, NC State, and Georgia Tech. Wofford also played host to South Carolina on Nov. 28.

The RPI rankings, which take into account Division I games only, determined that Wofford's pre-Christmas schedule last season was the most difficult in the nation. The Terriers had road games at Georgia Tech, South Carolina, Boston College, Alabama, Clemson, and Vanderbilt. Wofford was also home for William & Mary.

According to the Sagarin Ratings in the 1999-00 campaign, Wofford played the nation's third toughest pre-Christmas schedule. Only Iowa and Temple faced more difficult slates.

Postseason Honors

•Wofford point guard Mike Lenzly has received All-SoCon honors for the second straight year from the league media.

Lenzly was a preseason All-SoCon pick by Basketball Times.

•Justin Stephens has become the first Terrier since Ian Chadwick in 1997-98 to be selected to the All-SoCon Freshman team.

•Mike Lenzly ranks second on the Terriers and ninth in the SoCon in rebounding with his average of 6.9 boards per game.



•Associate Head Coach **Mike Young** is in his 13th year at Wofford and will take over the head coaching duties at the conclusion of the season. He has been with the Terriers through their rise from NCAA Division II to Division I Independent and the Southern Conference.

•Alex Peavey joined the Terriers two years ago after working with the basketball program at Virginia Commonwealth.

He is the son of **Marion Peavey**, a 1965 Wofford graduate and current Executive Director of the NCAA Foundation.

The Trickle Down

The SoCon hiring a new commissioner resulted in Wofford naming a new head basketball coach.

With **Danny Morrison** leaving his Wofford senior vice-president position to become the SoCon commissioner, **David Wood** was promoted from athletic director to Morrison's vacated role.

Head Basketball Coach **Richard Johnson** was then promoted to athletic director on Dec. 3 with the announcement that he would coach the Terriers just through the remainder of the 2001-02 season.

In his first official day as athletic director, Johnson made his first head coaching hire. He tabbed longtime assistant **Mike Young** to take over the head coaching duties effective at the close of the campaign. Young is in his 13th year at Wofford.

Morrison hired Johnson to be Wofford's basketball coach in 1985.

Streak Over

Listed below are notables from Wofford's 66-64 win at the College of Charleston (Jan. 2):

•Wofford became just the second SoCon team to win at the John Kresse Arena in CofC's four seasons of league play.

•Wofford nearly didn't make the trip to Charleston that day due to a statewide snowstorm.

•The Terriers had dropped 16 straight games to the Cougars dating back to Feb. 17, 1979.

•Wofford hadn't won at Charleston since Nov. 29, 1974, representing a stretch of 13 games. Head Coach **Richard Johnson** was in his junior year at The Citadel at the time.

Dating back to last season, each of the last four games between Wofford and the College of Charleston have come down to the final possession in regulation.

Fashion Statement

Wofford Associate Head Men's Basketball Coach **Mike Young** was named the best dressed assistant coach in Division I basketball last year by www.collegeinsider.com.

Young was nominated for the honor by graduated All-SoCon guard **Ian Chadwick**, who wrote a weekly journal for the web site. In his nomination, Chadwick referred to Young as a "pretty spiffy guy."



Freshman Impact

The Terriers' nine-man rotation features four freshmen (Justin Stephens, Sam Daniels, Adrien Borders, Jeff Tarr).

Those four rookies combined to score 45 of Wofford's 76 points in the 76-67 win over Georgia Southern (Feb. 9).

The Ironman

Point guard **Mike Lenzly** has played the entire game, including two overtime contests, in nine of Wofford's 16 SoCon games. On two occasions, he played 39 minutes.

He averaged 38.4 minutes in SoCon action and 35.8 overall.

Speaking of the Ironman

•On frequently playing the entire game, **Mike Lenzly** said, "It's no big deal. Practice is two hours. A game is only 40 minutes."

•Wofford Head Coach **Richard Johnson** on Lenzly frequently playing 40 minutes, "If there was a union for players, he would have every right to file a grievance for overwork."

Keys to Victories

Wofford shoots 44.3 percent from the field, including 35.8 from 3-point range, in its victories this season. The Terriers are at a 37.3 clip (26.7 behind the arc) in their defeats.

Wofford also averages 42.0 rebounds in its wins compared to 33.1 in the losses.

Priorities

The 66-64 win at the College of Charleston (Jan. 2) was big for Wofford.

However, it ranked second on the priority level that day for Terrier Associate Head Coach **Mike Young**.

On the bus ride returning from Charleston, Young was beaming for a different reason. His two-year-old daughter, Cooper, used the potty for the first time back home in Spartanburg.

Does Peaking Matter?

Prior to making a run to the semifinals at the 2000 SoCon Tournament, Wofford had concluded the regular season with a three-game losing streak and losses in four of its last five games.

The Terriers were supposedly peaking before going one-and-out at the 1999 and 2001 tournaments.

Wofford had won 5-of-6 heading into the 1999 tournament while being victorious in 4of-6 prior to last year's SoCon tourney.

Future Terriers

The Wofford basketball program has announced the signing of two players to National Letters-of-Intent:

•**Tyler Berg** is a 6-foot-9, 225-pound center from East Gaston High School in Mt. Holly, N.C.

Berg is in his third year as a starter for East Gaston. As a junior, he was named team Most Valuable Player after averaging 19 points, 12 rebounds, and 2.6 blocks per game. He was selected to the All-Conference team and was honored as the Player of the Year by the *Gaston Gazette*. Berg was also named second-team All-Piedmont.

"Tyler possesses a rare combination of size, good hands, and the ability to run the floor," said Wofford Head Coach **Richard Johnson**. "Almost more importantly, he has a real passion to be a great player."

As a sophomore, Berg averaged 11.2 points and 9.8 rebounds per game while being the recipient of a team rebounding award.

"I chose Wofford because of the atmosphere of the students and people on campus," Berg said. "Wofford is a good fit for me. The players and coaches were a big influence in my decision."

During the past two summers, Berg has played for the AAU Charlotte Royals. His team captured the 16-and-under national championship and placed third in the 17-and-under division. He was also a four-year cross country athlete for East Gaston.

•Howard Wilkerson is a 6-foot-6, 225-pound forward from Morehead High School in Eden, N.C.

Wilkerson is playing this year for Fork Union (Va.) Military Academy.

He averaged 22 points and 12 rebounds in earning Conference Player of the Year and All-Northwest North Carolina honors as a senior last year at Morehead. He was also on the All-Greensboro Area team and a selection to the East-West All-Star Game.

"Howard possesses a rare blend of athleticism, strength, and raw ability," Wofford Associate Head Coach **Mike Young** said. "He has long arms and is a relentless rebounder.

"He will be a very good player in the Southern Conference. We expect big things from him right away."

Wilkerson was an All-Conference football player as a wide receiver and defensive end in high school. He also earned Conference Player of the Year honors in track while competing in the discus and shot put.

"I'm looking forward to coming to Wofford and the opportunity to play right away," Wilkerson said. "I love the schedule that Wofford faces each year.

"I also love the players and coaches. It's a real good atmosphere on campus."

Double-Doubles

The Terriers have seen eight double-doubles recorded this season after posting just three last year. Wofford is 6-1 in games in which a Terrier posts a double-double:

Stephens' scoring average improves to 14.1 points in SoCon play to rank 17th overall for league games only.

The 6-foot-2 native of Newnan, Ga., is scoring at a higher clip than former Wofford guard **Ian Chadwick** (12.0 ppg) when he earned SoCon Freshman of the Year honors in the 1997-98 campaign.

Sterley Returns

Starting forward **Grant Sterley** returned to the lineup the final two regular-season games after missing the previous six contests with a torn meniscus in his right knee suffered against UNC Greensboro (Jan. 26).

Sterley is averaging 7.5 rebounds in his two contests back in the lineup. The Dean's List student had hit a pair of 3-pointers for six points in addition to grabbing two rebounds in his 13 minutes against the Spartans before being sidelined.

Prior to the injury, Sterley was playing the best basketball of his Wofford career. He had averaged 9.7 points and 5.5 rebounds in the previous six games, including a career-best 17 points at ETSU (Jan. 23).

Wofford's "Lethal Weapon 3"

Wofford guards **Mike Lenzly** (14.4 ppg), **Lee Nixon** (13.7 ppg), and **Justin Stephens** (12.6 ppg) all place in the SoCon's Top 20 in scoring.

Lenzly is 12th while Nixon ranks 15th and Stephens 20th. Wofford's "Lethal Weapon 3" combines for 40.7 points per game, representing 60.0 percent of the Terrier offense (67.8 ppg).

Quick Starts

Wofford opened this season with a 9-6 record for its best start to a campaign in seven years of Division I play.

The Terriers open each season with arguably the toughest nonconference schedule for a Division I mid-major, averaging six games per year against major conference competition.

Following a 73-64 overtime victory against The Citadel (Jan. 7), Wofford was three games above .500 for the first time in Division I.

Terriers or Puppies?

Kenny Hastie is the lone senior (other than team manager Brett Myers) with six of the 12 players in their freshman or sophomore year.

The Terriers entered the campaign with just four players (Hastie, **Mike Lenzly**, **Lee Nixon**, and **Grant Sterley**) who had played more than one season on the collegiate level.

Defensive Stops

•Wofford tops the SoCon by limiting its opponents to a 30.2 shooting percentage from 3-point range.

•Wofford is also fifth in the league in scoring defense, holding the opposition to 69.0 points per game.

The Terriers are 8-2 when their opponents score 64 points or fewer.
Wofford's 56-46 win over Sacramento State in the Guardians Classic (Nov. 14) represented the lowest point total allowed by the Terriers in a win over a Division I team since joining those ranks in 1995-96.

A Nailbiting Team

Five of Wofford's 16 SoCon games went down to the final three seconds:

•Jan. 2 - Edvin Masic hit an eight-foot baseline jumper at the final buzzer to give Wofford a 66-64 victory at the College of Charleston.

•Jan. 7 - Travis Cantrell of The Citadel misses a 15-foot jumper at the buzzer in regulation that would have won the game for the Bulldogs. The Terriers go on to a 73-64 overtime victory.

•Jan. 12 - College of Charleston's Jeff Bolton hits a 12-foot jump shot with 0.8 seconds left to force overtime before CofC pulls away for a 73-61 win.

•Jan. 14 - Justin Stephens sees his reverse layup fall off the rim as the final buzzer sounds in a 79-77 Terrier loss at Chattanooga.

•Jan. 26 - Mike Lenzly misses a 3-pointer with three seconds left that would have tied the UNC Greensboro game. The Terriers drop an 81-76 decision.

Handling the Ball

The Terriers top the SoCon in committing the fewest turnovers per game (12.8), including just 59 in their last six contests (9.8 avg).

Wofford's Rudy

Team Manager **Brett Myers** scored four points in six minutes of action while becoming the only Wofford player to ever be carried off the court at the Benjamin Johnson Arena as he made his collegiate debut in an 87-59 win over Virginia Intermont (Dec. 15).

A senior from Greer, S.C., and a four-year letterman in basketball at St. Joseph High School, Myers entered the game with 7:54 to play and the Terriers holding a 71-42 lead.

He made an immediate impact as he took part in Wofford's next five points.

Myers picked up an assist when he fed **Grant Sterley** for a layup. Myers then hit a 3-pointer to extend the Terrier margin to 76-44 with 5:35 left. He later added a free-throw to finish with four points.

Wofford came very close to a pair of wins over ACC opponents this season.

The Terriers built double-digit leads at Clemson (Nov. 24) and Georgia Tech (Dec. 21) before falling 85-82 and 79-70, respectively.

Wofford held a 14-point first-half lead and led by 11 at the intermission against the Tigers. The game ended with the Terriers missing a 3pointer at the buzzer that would have forced overtime.

The Terriers led the Yellow Jackets by 11 points with 17 minutes left before Georgia Tech used its depth to rally for the win.

Stifling Defense

Wofford's 59-49 win over Furman (Jan. 5) represented the Paladins' lowest point total against the Terriers in 64 games, dating back to a 49-46 Wofford victory in the 1946-47 season.

Not Bad Company

Six of Wofford's losses are to three ACC teams (Clemson, N.C. State, Georgia Tech) and members of the Big 12 (Nebraska), Conference USA (Memphis), and SEC (South Carolina).

Versus The SoCon

With a 36-47 record (.434), Wofford has played nearly .500 ball in its brief SoCon history which began with the Terriers in just their third year in Division I.

•Located in Spartanburg, S.C., Wofford is one of only five independent colleges and universities to have a Phi Beta Kappa chapter in the Carolinas (Davidson, Duke, Furman, and Wake Forest are the others).

•Wofford is one of just three Division I colleges or universities to have the nickname Terriers. The others are Boston University and St. Francis (N.Y.).

•Founded in 1854, Wofford has an enrollment of 1,100, making it the smallest school in NCAA Division I-A or I-AA football.

•With 1,100 students, Wofford is the second smallest school in Division I. Only Centenary (La.) is smaller with 850 students. However, the Gentlemen do not field a football team.

•Famous Wofford graduates include Carolina Panther owner and founder **Jerry Richardson** and Air Force Head Football Coach **Fisher DeBerry**.

•Wofford ranks No. 1 among national liberal arts colleges in "operating efficiency," providing a quality education while spending relatively less.

In the 2000 NCAA Division I Graduation Rate Report, Wofford is the only school in the nation to rank in the Top 10 in all four categories: overall student-athlete graduation rate as well as those for the football, men's basketball, and women's basketball teams.

Game 4 -- Clemson 85, Wofford 82 November 24, 2001

Clemson, S.C.

Wofford built an 11-point halftime lead before seeing Clemson rally and then hold off a late Terrier charge in an 85-82 Tiger victory at Littlejohn Coliseum.

Lee Nixon scored a game-high 25 points while Mike Lenzly added 20, including six 3-pointers, and freshman Justin Stephens scored 18 to pace a Wofford attack that saw the Terriers hit 15-of-32 3-pointers (46.9 percent).

Wofford's biggest margin of the night came when Lenzly scored on a layup to give the Terriers a 41-27 lead with 3:02 left in the first half. It capped a 26-9 Wofford run.

Clemson's size advantage inside began to wear Wofford down in the second half. A **Chey Christie** layup allowed the Tigers to regain the lead at 61-60 with 10:04 to play. After a long 3-pointer from the wing by Nixon tied the game at 67-67 with 7:58 remaining, Clemson went on a 12-4 run to take its largest lead of the night at 79-71 on a **Ray Henderson** 3-point play with 1:38 left.

However, Wofford chipped away at the deficit. Another deep three by Nixon pulled the Terriers within 81-79 with 55 seconds to play. After Clemson's **Chris Hobbs** missed a layup on the other end, Wofford came down the court trailing by two with 34 seconds remaining. **Dwon Clifton** then made a key steal for Clemson, setting the stage for a pair of **Ed Scott** free-throws which gave the Tigers an 83-79 lead with 24 seconds remaining.

Nixon hit an off-balance bank shot from the top of the key to pull Wofford within 83-82 with seven seconds to play. Christie was then fouled and hit a pair of free-throws to provide the final margin of 85-82 with six seconds left. Wofford had a last chance to force overtime, but Lenzly missed a 3-pointer at the buzzer.

Kenny Hastie equaled a career-high with 13 rebounds, the third time in four games he reached double figures in boards.

The Terriers shot 45.7 percent on the night after a 54.5 mark in the first half. The Tigers shot 57.6 percent in the second half to finish at 52.3.

Game 12 -- Georgia Tech 79, Wofford 70 December 21, 2001

The Wofford basketball team built an 11-point second-half lead at Georgia Tech before dropping a 79-70 decision.

After the Yellow Jackets scored the game's opening four points, Wofford stormed back to take its largest lead of the afternoon at 29-17 when **Mike Lenzly** hit back-to-back 3-pointers just 23 seconds apart with 8:10 left in the first half. Lenzly finished the game with 22 points, seven assists, and six rebounds.

The Yellow Jackets closed to within 35-32 at the intermission when **B.J. Elders** knocked in a 3-pointer at the halftime buzzer.

The Terriers came out strong in the second half. A 3-pointer by **Grant Sterley** and a pair of Lenzly free-throws built the Wofford lead back to 45-34 with 17:05 to play. However, Georgia Tech's press sparked a 24-5 run. In the middle of the spurt was a 3-pointer by **Halston Lane** to give the Yellow Jackets the lead for good at 51-50 with 9:42 remaining.

With Georgia Tech on top 58-50, the Terriers countered with two **Kenny Hastie** free-throws and a **Lee Nixon** layup to close within 58-54 with 7:31 left. Nixon topped Wofford with 24 points and a team-high and career-best seven rebounds.

However, a 3-pointer by Elder began a run of 11 straight Yellow Jacket points to put Georgia Tech in control at 69-54 with 3:38 remaining.

Edvin Masic's eight-foot jumper from the left baseline as time expired lifted Wofford to a 66-64 win at the College of Charleston.

Lee Nixon tied the game at 62-62 on a slashing floater with 57 seconds left. Charleston's **Jeff Bolton** then missed a shot in the lane, **Mike Lenzly** grabbed the rebound and went the length of the court for a layup to give Wofford a 64-62 lead with 18 seconds left. Charleston's **Shannon Chambers** hit a pair of free throws with 10.8 seconds remaining to tie the game at 64-64.

On the final possession, Lenzly again brought the ball downcourt and found Masic open on the baseline for the game-winner.

Charleston shot 57.1 percent in the first half and took a 32-24 lead at the intermission. The Terriers controlled the second half, outscoring CofC 42-32 and hitting on 53.3 percent of their shots.

Charleston stretched its lead to 10 points at 34-24 with 19 minutes left on a dunk by **Mike Benton**.

Nixon's 3-pointer with 13:58 left capped a 12-2 Wofford run and tied the game at 36-36. Nixon finished with a game-high 25 points, including 21 in the second half.

With 3:50 to play, **Justin Stephens** made an alley-oop pass to Nixon who converted it into a spectacular reverse dunk while being fouled on the play. His subsequent free-throw tied the game at 58-58 and gave the Terriers momentum down the stretch.

Lenzly finished with 13 points and 11 rebounds, the fourth doubledouble on the year for the Terrier point guard.

Borders then opened the scoring in overtime with another layup while **Grant Sterley** added two free-throws to put the Terriers on top for good.

Trailing 51-39 with 10:50 to play, Wofford went on a 23-5 run over the next 6:57. Lenzly had 12 points during the spurt, including three 3pointers and a breakaway dunk to give the Terriers a 62-56 lead with 3:53 remaining.

A 3-pointer by freshman **Adrien Borders**, who scored 12 points off-the-bench, gave Wofford its first lead of the game and the lead for good at 55-54 with 6:36 remaining.
