From Professor Bill DeMars - On Religious Freedom

Regarding the possibility of persecution of Muslims in America in the aftermath of Tuesday's attacks:

Whoever the attackers turn out to be, one of the generic goals of terrorism is to divide the target group against itself. This is a political consequence of yesterday's violence over which we--individually and communally--can exercise some choice. Any American who turns against other citizens or residents on the basis of religious belief is handing the terrorists a small political victory, and is squandering our own traditional and principled commitment to religious freedom as a human right.

We need to understand that our loyalties are among the main targets of Tuesday's attack. In light of this, I believe we would be well-served to fashion our responses to this attempted manipulation on the basis of principles informed by emotions, rather than on a purely emotional basis.

There will be a campus network outage on Thursday, September 27th, 2001, from 10:30PM until, approximately, 01:00AM (the following morning).

- e.. the Sandor Teszler Library's card catalog (BEN)
- f.. the Sandor Teszler Library's other electronic resources
- g.. Many networked printers in the Olin Building and most other printers on campus
- h.. on-campus and off-campus Domain Names Service (DNS)
- i.. INTERNET ACCESS <for emphasis>

It should not be necessary to change or modify the network configuration of any computers and printers on campus. After the outage is over, web browsers, chat clients, e-mail programs, and all other network applications should behave just like they always did.
