

FIRST DAY—MORNING SESSION.

Camden, S. C., November 28, 1907.

Conference met in 102d session, (since re-organization the 43rd) at Trinity Methodist Episcopal Church, Camden, S. C., at 10 A. M. Thursday on the above date.

By instructions of Bishop D. H. Moore, D. D., LL. D., a Thanksgiving service was had. The Rev. A. S. J. Brown conducted devotional services. B. G. Frederick led in a fervent prayer. After the singing of the first hymn, "O for a thousand tongue etc" the Thanksgiving Psalm was read responsively. A service of songs of Thanksgiving was held and the Conference was led in a very appropriate and fervent prayer by Father John Burroughs. The preaching service was led by W. G. Valentine, P. E. of the Sumter District. F. D. Smith offered prayer. R. A. Cottingham preached from John 11-28, Subject "The Divine Call to Man." The sermon was evangelic, full of pathos and divine unction and was highly helpful and comforting to believers, while the call to Mankind in general was emphasized—This call coming to the human race through Gods various providences. He said that the settlement of the race and all other human problems depend entirely upon the response to the divine call. God cannot be defeated. His plans and purposes cannot fail. He is infallible. All social, civic, and religious problems will be settled definitely and permanently by Christianity. Therefore, let us be Christians.

The closing prayer was made by C. C. Robinson.

A thanksgiving offering of \$10.22 was lifted.

Announcements made. Doxology sung. Benediction pronounced by R. A. Cottingham.

Conference met at 2 P. M. The Lord's Supper was administered by Bishop D. H. Moore, assisted by the Presiding Elders.

The Secretary called the roll by request, and (134) one hundred and thirty four were present and responded.

Conference proceeded to elect a Secretary, J. B. Middleton, was nominated by C. L. Logan, and I. E. Lowery by F. W. Vance. Result of vote, the former 40, the latter 39. J. B. Middleton was declared duly chosen. He nominated the following assistants: W. H. Jones, J. McEady, W. S. Thompson, E. B. Burroughs, D. H. Kearse, H. C. Asbury. The nomination was concurred in.

J. C. Martin was elected Statistical Secretary. His assistants chosen by him were I. L. Hardy, L. L. Thomas, J. C. Gibbes, C. C. Scott. Concurred in.

W. R. Jervay was unanimously elected Treasurer. His assistants are R. A. Cottingham, B. S. A. Williams, C. K. Brown. Concurred in.

The Conference bar was fixed to include the space from the chancel to and including the fourth window therefrom.

The time for meeting and adjourning the sessions was fixed at 9 A. M. to 1 P. M. The first half hour for devotional services.

The special committees were nominated by B. F. Witherspoon for the Presiding Elders as follows, and was adopted. See list.

A motion by B. G. Frederick that the report of the Conference Stewards be exclusive of revision by Conference was laid upon the table.

Dividends from the Book Concern for \$1,255, and from the Chartered Fund for \$22 was presented to the Conference by Mr. W. C. Price, who was introduced and who spoke effectively in behalf of that great institution.

Bishop Moore spoke in high commendation of Byron Palmer's great book, "God's White Throne," and requested the Conference to appoint a member to solicit subscribers therefor. The Conference appointed C. C. Scott.

Resolutions by B. G. Frederick touching the division of conference in two or more conferences as deemed best were offered.

A motion by G. W. Cooper to table the same did not prevail. See resolutions.

On motion a statistical session of conference was ordered for 5 P. M. C. C. Jacobs was appointed to preside by the Bishop. C. C. Jacobs proceeded to explain the nature of the new statistical blanks.

EDUCATION

Your committee on Education begs leave to present the following report.

Education is the greatest theme of the day. What is education? We answer briefly, education is to know something, to do something, and to be somebody.

We note with pleasure that there is now a greater educational interest in this country and within the limits of the South Carolina Conference than ever before.

We are convinced that ignorance, vice, superstition and immorality must and will be overthrown by education. The enlightened and cultured mind elevates a people upon higher planes of usefulness and activity.

Better prepared and qualified teachers are now being chosen by the public school trustees of the counties of this state to teach our boys and girls, in preference to the incompetent and in some instances immoral teachers. We trust that the day is not far distant when the public school term will be lengthened all over this State so that the teachers, especially those in the rural schools, will have more time in laying a better foundation upon which to instruct the boys and girls in the rudimentary branches. We do earnestly request that the outlined plan for the Board of Education, Freedman's Aid and Sunday Schools, a copy of which is already in the hands of the preachers, be not laid aside, nor thrown into the waste basket, but carefully and faithfully

studied so that all of its features may be fully carried out as far as practicable at the proper time in every congregation of each charge of the South Carolina Conference. We shall ask God's blessings upon Drs. Anderson, Mason and McFarland, corresponding Secretaries of said consolidated Societies and also upon their assistants.

Claffin University at Orangeburg, S. C., our great church (chch), still lies close to our hearts and we are more determined to stand by her and her cause than ever before.

The excellent report presented by Dr. L. M. Dunton, the able president of the school, to this conference, fills us with joy and shows that the school is steadily growing in educational, industrial and Christian interest. We regret very much to learn through that report that there is a present debt of about \$6000, hanging over the institution, brought upon it because of the recent erection of several very large brick buildings, long needed on the grounds of the University, and other improvements made as stated in the report.

We, the members of this conference, do solemnly pledge ourselves again, to put forth every effort on our charges to raise the \$12,000, that the the conference voted unanimously for Claffin in 1908. Dr. and Mrs. Dunton shall have our continued prayers that God may spare their lives among us for years yet to come.

Browning Home, Camden, S. C., under the wise management of the Woman's Home Missionary Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church is doing good work in this section of the state in preparing our girls for service and the responsible duties of life. We commend this school to the further patronage of the members of the conference.

Sterling College, Greenville, S. C. and Providence Normal, Agricultural and Industrial school, Cowpens, S. C., are good schools and doing commendable work in the Piedmont section, and we also ask the brethren to stand by these schools as far as they possibly can.

Gammon Theological Seminary, Atlanta Ga. We welcome Dr. Tiever one of the Professors of Gammon in our midst, and his address to us was one of inspiration indeed. We are glad to know that this school is at this time enjoying one of the best years in its history. That its present attendance is nearly a hundred students. Gammon shall have our continued co-operation as well as prayers for greater success in preparing men for the Christian ministry of this day.

We heartily endorse the communication sent to us by the President of Drew Theological Seminary, Madison, New Jersey, showing the excellent condition the school is in. A very large body of students is now in attendance and the school has a library comprising more than ninety-five thousand

and volumes, and the buildings are in splendid condition for the comfort of the students.

EPWORTH LEAGUES AND SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

Mr. President, we, your committee on Epworth League and Sunday Schools, beg leave to make our report. We hail with joy the onward march of our young people in the great work of the church. We are ready to admit that the Epworth League is and must be a powerful factor in the uplift of our young people. But, Mr. President, we are not getting proper results in League work. The first reason is for lack of organization. Second, we are in need of hearty co-operation on the part of the Pastors and Presiding Elders.

We recommend that we do here in this session organize a State League with a President and Vice-President from each Presiding Elder's District. And that we hold a State Convention at such a time and in such a place as the Cabinet may direct.

Resolved 1st, That the Presiding Elders be ex-officio members of the Convention.

Resolved 2nd, That we thank Dr. Herben, the Editor of the Epworth Herald for the Epworth Herald, and we do recommend that at least the President of each Chapter should take the Epworth Herald.

SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

We have 434 Schools, 2735 Officers and Teachers, 28,900 Scholars in this state. While the above numbers are gratifying to us, it is not as it should be. Why? Because in nearly all of our charges may be found enough non-members of our Sunday Schools to supplement these numbers sufficiently to nearly double them. This can be done and should be done. Why? Because we should look more carefully after the youths of our congregations in order that in the future, when the children of today become the adults of tomorrow they may be already trained for further usefulness in the church.

Paragraph 349 in the Discipline says that it shall be the duty of the pastor, aided by the superintendent and committee on Sunday Schools, to decide as to what books and other publications should be used in the Sunday Schools. Too much praise cannot be given to Dr. McFarland, Corresponding Secretary of the Sunday School Union, for what he has done in giving strength to the schools of our church, mentally, financially, and spiritually. Dr. C. C. Jacobs deserves a kind word of praise from all for his words of encouragement and uplift. Dr. J. W. Moultrie, our International Agent,

should be cheerfully received. The President of each Sunday School in each district is urged to hold Institutes in each charge where it is possible.

STERLING COLLEGE.

To the South Carolina Conference of the M. E. Church.

Dear Brethren:—It is with great pleasure that I present unto you my annual report as President of Sterling Industrial College. The present scholastic year has been the greatest in the history of the institution in the way of obtaining recognition and prestige for the school. The State Board of Education has made it a Normal Institute to prepare the Colored teachers of the Piedmont Belt for the public school work. And the Board of Trustees of the John F. Slater fund have made an appropriation to it, and her claims are now being presented to other Boards and men of national reputation are taking hold of it. We have the Kindergarten, the primary, the English, the normal, the Licentiate of Instruction, and the college preparatory courses, together with agricultural, the carpentry, the brick masonry, the sewing, the cooking, the basketry, and the millinery depart-

ments. These departments are all under the instruction of eight competent teachers who are endeavoring to prepare the boys and girls of our race for useful and intelligent citizenship. We are now putting forth an effort to raise \$1000, so as to secure \$2,500 which has been offered to us in case we raise the \$1000, which amount will pay the entire indebtedness upon the property and put the college on a permanent basis. This school is much needed here for the moral and religious uplift of our people, and we ask your help and cooperation in the work.

TEMPERANCE.

This is where persons purchase the poisonous, alcoholic liquors from the Christian State of South Carolina and repoinson the already poisoned draughts and then at an extortious price deal it out to the men and youths of our Country.

We are of the opinion that the closing of the dispensary in our cities and towns would lessen the intense desire for human blood, give men, constituting angry mobs, more time and patience to wait for the just punishment of criminals by the law and also lessen the provocations however slight they may be, which cause the angry furious mobs to reist.

Seeing the importance (during these critical moments of our lives) of each individual's using all of their God-given intellectual powers and realizing as we do that there is no agency so well equipped to benumb, weaken and destroy the intellectual powers of individuals as the agency above mentioned. Your committee recommends that this Conference urge all pastors of the churches in the bounds of our Conference to preach at least two sermons each year using the word "Temperance" as their subject.

SABBATH OBSERVANCE AND TEMPERANCE.

We your committee beg leave to submit the following: We realize that our people do not fittingly obey that particular Law which stands out so prominently among the ten. "Remember the Sabbath and keep it holy." We fear that our

church people are to some extent losing many precious blessings that they might obtain from the Lord, due to the fact that they have not due regard to the day that He has hallowed, set apart, for holy worship and called his own. During the six days given, we are to rid ourselves of the burdens and cares of life in order that on the seventh and holy day we may present ourselves before the Lord with our souls, mind, heart and body unfettered by the distressing cares of life and wait at the altar until the Spirit of burning comes and all our sins consumed. Many take great pleasure in congregating themselves on the Lord's day in some secluded spot, to gamble, hold unchristian conversation and allow themselves to spend the day with nothing done to draw them closer to the bleeding side of the blessed Christ, but rather to darken the already dark picture of their moral lives. Others take great pleasure in driving long distances on the Sabbath, seeking curiosities leaving their homes, their Church and those dependent upon them, entirely in the hands of others. Many take great pleasure in visiting from house to house, carrying with them nothing but idlesome conversations, discussing the topics of the day.

Your committee recommends more (carefully planned) visits by the pastors of the churches till the entire Church become more and more in touch with this class and seek to renew in their minds once more that great Law of our God. "Remember the Sabbath day to keep it Holy."

Bishop and Brethren of the S. C. Conference:

I rise to make a request of the Bishop which I think will be somewhat of a surprise to all of the brethren of this Conference—only two of the members being apprised of the step about to be taken.

During the year 1867, that prince of preachers, Rev. Dr. J. B. Middleton, entered the South Carolina Conference, and forty long years has been in labors more abundant, and up to this time his mind is still vigorous and is acceptable and in demand as a pastor in all parts of the State; but not a single member of brother Middleton's class of forty years ago remains to answer the roll call. They have all gone to higher appointments, and today receive the reward of their labors.

During the year 1870, after first being appointed class leader and exhorter by Dr. Middleton, and having been instructed by him in the preparation of sermons, I entered the South Carolina Conference and thirty-seven years I have tried to do what I could for the upbuilding of my Master's Kingdom on earth, have, in a measure, been successful.

Not another member of my class is living to-day, and I alone am left to tell the story of those days which tried

men's souls. Having been burning the candle at both ends for thirty-seven years, I am reminded by failing health that I am human, and that unless I am given lighter work, that I too, very soon will join my comrades, who have gone to their reward; I therefore stand before you this afternoon with my mind full of beautiful memories of the past achievements for God and humanity, to plead for lighter work, that I may for the benefit of my family remain longer to serve the Church, which has done so much for me.

This request, coming as it does so close upon my failure to be elected to the General Conference, might be construed by some to mean that I am disgruntled over my defeat, and by some it might be said that I am forced to do so by the appointing power, but I must assure you dear brethren, that I feel pleasant toward you as a "May Morning," and assure you that this step is taken by me of my own free will and accord and only in the interest of a longer lease upon life.

I feel to-day greatly indebted to the South Carolina Conference for the many honors which have been bestowed upon me during my ministerial life. I have heard ministers, who have advanced in years and who failed to get from the Conference what they ought to have received, speak boastfully and complainingly about what they had done for the Conference, but I am here to-day, my brethren, not to boast of what I have done for the Conference but to tell you that the little I have done for it is as nothing compared with what the Conference has done for me. I owe all my success in life to the South Carolina Conference.

Bishop, I say here to-day without the fear of successful contradiction that there is no man in Methodism who has been as highly honored as I have been during the same period of service. Here is my record Mr. President.

I have been sent to seven General Conferences, appointed by the Bishops as fraternal messenger to both the African Methodist and Zion African Methodist General Conference was appointed as delegate to the Christmas Conference at Baltimore and have been a presiding elder for twenty-five years out of the thirty-seven years I have been in the service of the church. Is not that a history that any man may feel proud of?

I thank you most heartily for all of these honors and though it gives me pain to make this request, I assure you that all of you have a warm place in my heart only to be perpetuated through the long ages of eternity. I bid you all an affectionate farewell as presiding elder, and assure you that under God I will try to be as faithful in my new sphere of work as I have been in the pastorate, and at last receive from our Heavenly Father the well done, good and faithful servant, enter thou into the joy of thy Lord.
