Journal of Conference.

FIRST DAY SESSION.

The South Carolina Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church in its 104th Session, Since Reorganization the forty fourth, met at Trinity M. E. Church, Orangeburg, S. C., November 24th, 1909 at 9-30 A. M. Bishop J. W. Hamilton, D. D., LL. D., in the chair.

Hymn 798 of the church hymnal was sung and the lessons Malichi 3rd chapter and 2nd Timothy 3rd and 4th chapters were read by the Bishop, who then led the Conference in prayer in which the conference devoutly joined.

Bishop Hamilton afterward extended remarks, relating to the Ritual in relation to the administering of our Lord's Supper and proceeded to its celebration, assisted by the District Superintendents, Drs. M. C. B. Mason, S. O. Baketel, R. E. Jones and J. P. Wragg.

The offering for City Missions in San Francisco, Cal. was \$12.85. Reminiscence of the condition of our people and Conference, the Bishop drew a vivid comparison of the past and present of the Negro race, showing the advancement made, achievements secured and the hopeful outlook for the future.

The Secretary by request of the Bishop proceeded to call the roll, one hundred and sixty three responded present, twenty-six were absent and one dead. B. F. Witherspoon died during the year. Prayer for the bereaved family was offered by Bishop Hamilton, the Conference standing.

The hymn, "Servant of God well done" was sung, led by S. S. Lawton. By motion of H. H. Matthews the Conference proceeded to the election of a Secretary by ballot. The tellers appointed by the Bishop were, B. S. Jackson, W. G. White, C. K. Brown, B. S. A. Williams. J. B. Middleton was nominated by B. G. Frederick, I. E. Lowery by W. J. Smith and E. B. Burroughs by J. A. Harrall. The latter respectfully declined the nomination. Result of the ballots cast: total number of ballots 129 of which J. B. Middleton received 75, I. E. Lowery 50, J. W. Moultrie 2, J. C. Burch 1, E. B. Burroughs 1, total 129. J. B. Middleton having received a majority of 21 of the total votes cast was declared duly elected secretary. He nominated assistants R. L. Hickson, N. T. Bowen, Jr., W. H. Jones, E. B. Burroughs, and V. S. Johnson. concurred in.

J. C. Martin was elected Statistical Secretary with the following assistants, J. C. Gibbs, L. L. Thomas, I. L. Hardy, C. C. Scott, Isaac Myers, C. H. Harleston, B. C. Jackson, A. D. Brown, W. B. Romans, S. D. Williams. Concurred in;

W. R. Jervay was elected Treasurer. He nominated as his assistants J. R. Townsend, W. M. Hanna, R. A. Thomas, B. S. A. Williams. Concurred in.

J. S. Thomas District Superintendent reported the list of special committees which was on motion unanimously concurred in. The following reporters for the press were nominated and duly appointed, W. B. Romans for the S. W. C. Advocate by R. L. Hickson, A. S. J. Brown for People's Recorder by T. J. Clarke, I. E. Lowery for The Record and The Evening News by G. W. Cooper, G. W. Gantt for Times and Democrat by S. S. Lawton, H. H. Matthews for the Southern Reporter, E. B. Burroughs for News and Courier, R. L. Hickson for the Monitor by J. L. Grice.

By motion of F. D. Smith it was voted that the session of the Conference begin at 9 a. m. one half hour to be devoted to devotional services and to adjourn at 1 p. m.

On motion of W. H. Redfield the bar of the Conference was fixed to include the rear jamb of the triple windows from the chancel.

A preamble and resolutions by E. B. Burroughs in felicitious terms touching the presence and presidency of Bishop Hamilton were read and adopted harmoniously and unanimously.

E. B. Burroughs for the Board of Trustees of Claflin University presented resolutions of commendation of the work of Dr. and Mrs. L. M. Dunton during the past quarter century also outlining plans for raising a \$50,000 endowment fund for Claflin University. Bishop Hamilton spoke to the resolutions and they were adopted. By motion of S. S. Lawton it was voted to hold a statistical session at 3 p. m.

The Bishop appointed Dr. J. E. Wilson to preside. The following were introduced, Drs. L. P. McGee of the M. E. Church South, C. B. Spencer, O. S. Baketel, M. C. B. Mason, J. P. Wragg, I. W. Arnold, I. G. Penn, C. W. Bennet, R. E. Jones and J. L. Dart. Dr. C. B. Spencer spoke in the interest of the Central Christian Advocate the progress of the country and the human race inclusive of the Negro as an integral part. Mr. N. C. Price of the Methodist Book Concern was introduced. Dr. L. P. McGee of the Methodist Episcopal Church South proceeded to deliver the address of welcome on behalf of the citizens of Orangeburg.

Many beautiful tributes to the humanity and christianity of the Negro race per se and to their helpers as well were presented by the speaker which were highly appreciated.

The response by Bishop J. W. Hamilton was a pure classic in its purest interpretation and the highest characterization. By motion of G. W. Cooper the time was extended. Dr. M. C. B. Mason our own unique philosophic friend and brother was called upon to render assistance in the search by his pale face brethren for the north pole—the highest unit of brotherly love on this planet. He reached the pole and nailed the

gospel banner of "toleration" of both sections and by both races. He got there and charged the battery with, "Let brotherly love continue" as the slogan of the hour.

A. E. Quick spoke also, referring to the recent deep affliction sustained by Dr. McGee in the loss of an elder daughter. By motion of A. E. Quick a vote of deep sympathy was passed.

It was voted to hold the anniversary of the Sunday School Board at 7 p. m. and thence to meet at Claflin University at 8:30 p. m. Bishop Hamilton presented a Draft for \$14 90 from the Chartered Fund \$25.

On motion these drafts were passed to the Chairman of the Board of Conference Stewards.

A paper relating to the Freedmen's Aid Society by J. W. Moultrie was read and adopted. Notices were given and announcements made. The Conference adjourned with benediction by Dr. L. P. McGhee.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The meeting was opened with the singing of hymn, Come Ye that love the Lord etc., followed by brother B. G. Fredrick leading in a very fervent prayer. After which the statistical session proper was begun.

The Bennettsville District was called and reported, Dr. J. E. Wilson having taken the chair. Next in order the Charleston district was called and reported, the Florence district was called and reported; the Orangeburg district was called and reported; the Spartanburg district was called and reported; the Sumter district was called and reported; the Beaufort district was called and reported. The entire conference having been invited to attend a banquet at Claflin University at 7:30 o'clock in honor of Dr. and Mrs. Dunton, the Conference was directed to Claflin University, the benediction was pronounced by Dr. J. E. Wilson. R. L. Hickson, Assistant Secretary.

SECOND DAY FIRST SESSION.

Conference met at 9 a. m., Bishop J. W. Hamilton in the chair. Devotional exercises were conducted by J. S. Thomas. The first hymn having been sung, prayer was offered by J. A. Brown and by the Bishop—of thanksgiving.

The minutes of the morning session were read and approved, the minutes of the afternoon session were read and the necessary corrections having been made were approved.

Next in order the Districts were called and the following delinquents reported. D. E. Thomas, Jas. McEaddy, B. J. Edney, T. McFarlin, G. W. Beckham, and D. P. Murphy.

Dr. Baketel, of the Board of Sunday Schools represented his work, the anniversary having been interrupted by fire that broke out at the State College and The Quarto

Centennial Banquet at Claflin University in honor of Dr. and Mrs. L. M. Dunton's untiring services in the South the past 27 years. Dr. Baketel gave us an earnest plea for Sunday School work, it was careful, masterful and instructive.

At 10:40 o'clock the order of the day was called according to the program of the local committee. At this interval hymn, I shall know Him etc., was sung.

Dr. E. B. Burroughs was introduced, he selected Psalm 75:1 as his text and preached a learned and soul stirring sermon. Subject: Thanksgiving. The Thanksgiving service closed with the singing of a spiritual pathos, "By and by when the morning comes" etc.

Dr. Dunton at this interval announced that Bishop Hamilton would lecture Friday night, subject: Mexico etc., admission 25 cents, one half of the proceeds to go to the Methodist Churches in San Francisco and the other half to the church locally. Dr. Dunton also announced that a health conference would be held at Claflin University, a number of physicians having been invited from various parts of the State, some of whom came in upon us while Dr. Dunton was explaining a health chart of the comparative death rate of Charleston, S. C., from 1822 to 1900.

The comparison was alarmingly in favor of the white people, showing that from 1895 to 1900 mortality was three times as great among the colored people as among the whites. C. C. Johnson, M. D. of Aiken, S. C., was introduced and spoke, his address was brotherly and interesting.

Dr. S. C. McClellan of Charleston was introduced and spoke on the methods to be used to prevent the spread of disease. His address was brim full of information. He advised against the fly and mosquito and thanked Dr. Dunton for establishing the Health Congress. Dr. W. D. Crum of Charleston S. C. was introduced and spoke on the ravages of Tuberculosis or Consumption. His address was learned, well taken and masterly. He emphasized cleanliness as being the surest way of keeping off disease and recommended the frequent and free use of soap and water encouraging the temperature of water best suited to the nature of the user, and further laid no little stress on education and industry. The frequent patronizing of agents who sell nostrums was condemned. He left the rostrum leaving fresh air as the most paramount remedy for Tuberculosis.

On motion of W. S. Thompson a session was ordered for 8 P. M. today. A resolution was offered by C. C. Scott relative to the destruction by fire of the girl's dormitory of the State College, the same was adopted. See resolutions. A collection was taken for the Hospital and Nurse Training School of Charleston, S. C., amounting to \$13.07. After the announcement of committees the benediction was pronounced by Dr. R. E. Jones, of the Southwestern Advocate.

SECOND DAY—SECOND SESSION.

The Conference opened at 8 p. m. with singing "The Mountain Railroad." Bishop Hamilton was in the chair. Prayer was offered by I. H. Fulton and J. S. Thomas, after which the Trinity choir sang, "Beloved we are the sons of God."

The minutes of the morning session were read and approved. The 13th question was called and G. J. Davis the District Superintendent was called his character passed and he reported his district.

The report was his sixth and last and showed great progress and attention by a careful watchman.

At the conclusion of the report his brother ministers of the Beaufort District presented the retiring District Superintendent a beautiful and expensive silver service in eloquent and well chosen words by W. G. White and responded to by the retiring District Superintendent in similar terms. The scene was a most touching one.

J. S. Thomas was called, District Superintendent of the Bennettsville district. His character passed and he rendered his sixth and last annual report in well chosen, eloquent terms.

Progress was evident on all lines. He was held at the close of his report by an eloquent presentation speech by C. C. Scott of a fine gold watch and chain on the part of the ministers, followed by a good and timely speech by Prof. E. J. Sawyer presenting a fine silver set in behalf of the Sunday School and Epworth League convention of the Bennettsville district in well chosen words, the retiring District Superintendent responded with thanksgiving.

The Sumter District was called and W. G. Valentine, District Superintendent was called, passed in character and reported the work of his district.

His report was equal to the masterpieces preceeding his in learning, eloquence and retiring pathos. Brother W. H. Jones held the District Superintendent by the Bishop's permission and presented in fitting speech a fine solid gold watch of the best make in behalf of the ministers of the Sumter district.

W. B. Romans followed presenting a silver service in behalf of the local preachers of the district and was disturbed by Bro. Jones coming forward with a purse of \$25.00. Brother Romans resumed presenting a \$50 silver service on the part of the laymen. Brother Valentine responded in a masterly way.

The Orangeburg district was called and brother G. W. Cooper the District Superintendent, passed in character and read his report the last of four retiring successful District Superintendents. The effort was equal to each one of the foregoing. He was detained by the scholarly eloquence of brother C. K. Brown who presented to him a 19k. Howard gold watch with a chain, total costing \$120.00 on the preach-

ers and a silver mounted fountain pen by the North Charge also a present by the Junior Epworth League of the Trinity Station. Major Fordham arrested the further attention of the conference, and in an eloquent speech spoke to the congregation of the District Superintendent and at the conclusion presented on the part of the laymen of the Orangeburg District a silver tea service. Prof Thad. H. Pinckney followed in a neat speech also a \$40.00 suit of clothes on the part of St. George charge. The District Superintendent responded in a neat speech. Thus ends up a veritable stream of gifts and eloquence of three hours length, a collection of \$6. 89 was taken after which the benediction was pronounced by Bishop J. W. Hamilton.

THIRD DAY MORNING SESSION.

The Conference opened at 9 a. m. with Bishop J. W. Hamilton in the chair. Singing and prayer by W. H. Jones followed by J. B. Middleton leading out in a very fervent prayer.

The Statistical Secretary was asked to call the delinquent brethren. This was done by the Assistant Treasurer and many reported, see list. On motion of G. W. Cooper, T. J. Clarke's case was referred to the committee of conference relation. On motion of W. G. Valentine, T. Sims, J. D. Whitaker, were also referred to the same committee. On motion of J. B. Taylor, S. Simmons, W. R. Jervay were referred to the same committee. On motion of I. H. Fulton, F. E. McDonald. On motion of J. A. Brown, G. W. Beckham and G. W. Murphy were also referred to the committee on Conference Relation. B. S. Jackson offered resolutions relative to the District Parsonage located at Florence, S. C. See resolutions. By motion a committee of five was named and appointed to dispose of the present site and to reinvest the avails of sale at some other place in the corporate limits of the city of Florence.

The 14th Question was called and J. F. Page, D. S. of the Greenville District passed in character and he reported the spiritual and temporal condition of the District in glowing terms. The District has steadily advanced along all lines under his administration and wise counsel.

I. H. Fulton D. S. of the Florence District was passed in character and reported the District as being in excellent condition along all lines. There were many improvements on Church and Parsonage property and increase financially and numerically. The outlook for another year is bright and hopeful.

The Rev. J. L. McLees, D. D. of the local Presbyterian Church and I. H. Hairston of the North Carolina Conference were introduced. They expressed pleasure at being present and addressed fraternal words of good cheer to the body of ministers which were heartily appreciated.

J. A. Brown D. S. of Spartanburg District presented his report of the District; he having succeeded the late B. F. Witherspoon. He reported the district as being in fine form for all good work and progressive. A preamble and resolution by D. J. Sanders touching an endowment fund for Claflin University was adopted. See resolutions. The class for full membership was called before the chancel: the Bishop led in an appropriate prayer. He then addressed the Class and the Conference upon the importance of a knowledge of the rules of the church as laid down in the Book of Discipline. By request Dr. Ward Platt of the Home Mission and Church Extension Board, read the rules governing a preacher's conduct from the Discipline. Bishop J. W. Hamilton then addressed the class in fraternal terms of love and kindness and yet with an elevated style which touched the sublime. Here was food, both for mental and spiritual aptitudes. He propounded the disciplinary questions which were answered affirmatively. The class was then received De facto. The Hon. Thomas E. Miller President of the State Agricultural and Mechanical College for colored youth, was introduced. He spoke words of appreciation for the kindness shown and the timely assistance rendered by the President, Faculty and students of Claflin University in coming so nobly to the rescue of the young women from the burning building on the memorable night of Nov. 23rd, 1909. "Let brotherly love continue," is the watch word. Notices were given and announcements made. Resolutions by H. H. Matthews relative to Bishop and Mrs. J. W. Hamilton were adopted. By motion C. C. Robinson was appointed to the Board of Conference Stewards instead of J. McLeod, who is quite ill. Conference adjourned with the benediction by Dr. Ward Platt.

EVENING SESSION.

Third day evening exercises, 8:20, began with singing, followed with prayer by J. L. Grice. The Trinity choir then rendered a beautiful selection with organ and cornet. Dr. L. M. Dunton then introduced Bishop J. W. Hamilton, who delivered his famous lecture—Subject, "Mexico, Its Marauders, Miracles and Men." The undivided attention of the large and appreciative audience was held from beginning to conclusion. The lecture was a classical, historical and literary treat of rare quality that will doubtless linger in the memory of the hundreds of hearers. "My country 'tis of thee," was enthusiastically rendered by choir and audience and the benediction was pronounced by the Bishop. The proceeds of the lecture financially, were \$75.50

FOURTH DAY MORNING SESSION.

Conference convened pursuant to adjournment at 9 a. m. The devotions were led by F. D. Smith. The business session began at 9:30 a. m., Bishop J. W. Hamilton presiding. The minutes of the previous session were read and adopted. Question 8 was called and

The appointments for the Lord's Day were announced by A. E. Quick. By motion conference adjourned, with the benediction by Dr. Ward Platt.

FOURTH DAY—SECOND SESSION.

Conference convened at 3 p. m. Rev. J. E. Wilson presiding by appointment of the Bishop. The devotions were led by George Gray. The call for reports from the special

committees resulted in reports from the following—viz Books and Periodicals, Auditing, Education, Sabbath Observance, Temperance, W. H. and W. F. Missions, A. B. Society, State of Church and Country and tentatively District Conference Minutes. Excepting the last named, they were adopted. The Rev. L. M. Dunton, President of Claflin University presented his annual report—an able document. By motion of C. C. Scott it was voted to extend thanks for the same, that the document be published in pamphlet form and a committee of five be appointed to make provisions for the items recommended therein. Dr. D. M. Mious, President of Sterling Industrial College, Greenville, S. C., read his report showing marked progress. Received as information. The Bishop resumed the chair. J. E. Wilson for the committee in the case of J. H. Witherspoon. reported recommending his location. See Report, adopted.

The 22nd question was called and G. W. Williams, R. C. Campbell, B. J. Boston, M. V. Gray, B. F. Miller, A. J. Robinson, John Burroughs, H. H. Matthews, P. Witherspoon, T. J. Clark, J. W. Brown, A. Cooper, B. Robinson, M. F. Black, S. S. Lawton, F. E. McDonald, G. W. Beckham, S. Simmons were placed in the superannuated relation. Thomas Sims, W. R. Jervay, and A. G. Townsend were by motion, made effective in their relation to the conference. J. D. Whitaker was passed temporarily. Question 32 was called and Greenville extended through her pastor R. L. Hickson the hospitalities of John Wesley M. E. Church and the citizens at large, as the seat of the next conference. The tender was unanimously accepted by vote of conference. The Statistical Secretary submitted his report, showing a comfortable increase financially and numerically. A collection for the local church was taken up. Result, \$4.75. STERLING INDUSTRIAL COLLEGE.

This institution is in the Piedmont belt of South Carolina just outside of the city limits of Greenville, which is the third city in the state in population and importance and is at the terminus of the Greenville and Columbia, the Laurens and the Greenville and Knoxville Rail roads, and on the great Southern system being 160 miles from Atlanta Ga., and 587 from Washington D. C., three miles from Pine Mountain, ten from Paris and in full view of the Blue Ridge Mts., in which city the white people have three large graded schools, several industrial, three colleges and one great University, which shows that it is a central point for the development of that race, and as the Negro population is about one third of that of the White race and this is the only school of the kind for the Industrial, the Normal, the Licentiate and College preparatory instruction of the Negro race, it goes to show how important it is to have such a school here for the training of our people.

It was Established in 1896 with fifteen students, one teacher and no property or money; in the lecture room of John Wesley Church. This old church property was purchased by the school for \$1600 and Mrs. Emmaline R. Sterling of Pough Keepsie New York for whom the school was named and who educated the writer gave the first \$500.

It remained there in the city eight years after which the president and trustees decided to sell out the property in the city and buy a small farm out of the city limit where farming, brick masonry, carpentry, stock raising, cooking, sewing, millinery and all kinds of industrial work together with literary work could be done. This was done and a seven room two story building was erected for the president, a stable, a barn and a buggy house. A College chapel and dormitory for girls, a dining hall and kitchen and a dormitory for boys. Our enrollment ranges from 165 to 180 with eight teachers. We have sent out 125 graduates who can teach school any where in the State without an examination, the school having been chartered according to the laws of the State and having been placed on the recognized list of colleges by the State Board of education. We have three courses of studies, the four years Normal, the Licentiate of Instruction and the College preparatory. Its support comes from tuition, board, donations from churches and individuals and from the John F. Slater fund and the United States Department of Agriculture. Our property is now worth \$20,000. A southern white gentleman of Greenville has just presented to the school a fine two story industrial building with kitchen, dining hall, president's office reception room, sewing, millinery department, bath room, store room and pantry for \$2500 and besides a fine farm mule for \$225 and \$100 worth of the best farming implements and bought \$3,500 worth of farm land joining the college land and placed it under our control.

This gentleman has donated to the college first and last directly and indirectly \$6,600, and the U. S. Department of Agriculture employs and pays a man to give instruction to the students in the college and the farmers in the county, and the said Department of Agriculture has decided to make a demonstration and experiment station for the colored farmers of the state.

The ministers of our church and of other churches have aided the work nobly. And the people of the Piedmont belt white and colored are proud of the work that is being done for the uplift of our people. I wish to say that some of the best friends the negro has in this great country are among the best white people of the south. Our Board of Trustees consists of the best white and colored citizens in the state who make annual donations to the institution and give their time and talent to help the president plan for its running expenses. Our teachers and students are of all denominations yet there is perfect harmony both in our Board of Trustees and in the faculty of the institution.

MEMOIRS.

Rev. B. F. Witherspoon, D. D.—The Rev. B. F. Witherspoon, A. M., D. D., was born in Lancaster County, South Carolina 55 years ago. He was educated in the common and high schools of the state. He was also a graduate of Gammon Theological Seminary.

He was converted in early life and brought up under Christian influences, which influences helped to make him the man—the great man that he was.

He joined the Methodist Episcopal Church at Yorkville, S. C., in the year 1875. A few years later, in the year 1880, he joined the South Carolina Annual Conference, where he soon came to the front, and where he distinguished himself as an earnest, successful, gospel preacher, and a great church builder.

He served acceptably many of the leading charges in the conference. He was appointed Presiding Elder of the Beaufort district and served a full term. After eight years of successful work in the pastorate he was again appointed presiding elder, and placed upon the Spartanburg district where he was serving at the time of his death. He was also a member of the General Committee on Benevolences.

On the night of April 19, 1909, while preaching at Blacksburg, S. C., he was taken suddenly ill. He hastened home, took his bed, where he lingered, hanging between life and death until Saturday night, the 24th. Surrounded by his family, he asked for a drink of water. He took the glass in his hand, being supported by his daughter's arm. He preached a short sermon upon the water of life while holding the glass. He closed by saying, “daughter, I may not get well,

I must go. Tell the brethren I have fought a good fight."
He went to sleep as softly as a child.
