MINUTES.

FIRST DAY—FIRST SESSION.

Sumter, S C., November 23rd, 1911.

The one hundred and sixth (106) session. Since re-organization the Forty seventh of the South Carolina Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, convened in annual session at Immanuel Methodist Episcopal Church, Sumter, S. C., on the above date at 9 A. M. Bishop Luther B. Wilson, D. D., LL. D., Presiding. The Bishop led the devotions, the Hymn "Rock of Ages" was sung heartily by the conference. The 40th Chapter of the Prophecies of Isaiah and the Holy communion was celebrated in due form, the Bishop and the District Superintendents being the celebrants. The Conference and visitors partook of the consecrated elements with expressions of joy and gladness. It was a season of spiritual refreshment to devout souls. The Hymn "When I survey the wondrous cross" was sung at the close of the service.

The business session was then entered upon. The Secretary, J. B. Middleton, called the roll of conference by request of the presiding Bishop. There were 144 members present, 43 absent and 6 have died during the year. J. B. Middleton was nominated for the Secretaryship by quite a number of the members led by B. G. Frederick and he was unanimously elected by acclamation. (The Secretary accepts this unanimity as a tribute of love and confidence; with highest appreciation.) J. C. Martin was elected Statistical Secretary and G. J. Davis, Conference Treasurer. By vote these officers were given the privilege of choosing their assistants. The following nominees by J. B. Middleton were concurred in as his assistants: N. T. Bowen, Jr., R. L. Hickson, B. C. Jackson, N. S. Smith, W. S. Thompson, W. H. Jones, V. S. Johnson, J. A. Glenn. The assistants of the Statistical Secretary, are J. C. Gibbs, I. Myers, L. L. Thomas, C. H. Harleston, W. B. Romans, I. L. Hardy, B. C. Jackson, C. C. Scott, A. D. Brown, L. G. Gregg. The assistants to the Treasurer, are B. S. A. Williams, L. L. Thomas, J. P. Robinson, Concurred in. E. B. Burroughs reported the list of Special Committees, which was concurred in. See list. Reporters for the following named Periodicals were appointed, viz:

The S. W. C. Advocate, W. S. Thompson. The Southern Reporter, J. L. Dart. The Charleston News and Courier, B. B. Burroughs. The Columbia State, I. E. Lowery. The Columbia Record, I. E. Lowery.

By motion the bar of Conference was fixed so as to include the main auditorium; the Sunday School room being allotted

to visitors and lay delegates. By motion the hours of meeting and adjourning was fixed at 9 A. M. and 1 P. M. respectively. By motion it was voted to hold a session at 3 P. M.

By vote of conference C. C. Scott was appointed to confer with the Railroad Authorities relative to reduced rates for the Ministers, delegates and visitors.

The 14th Question was announced. The Bennettsville District called and H. C. Asbury, the District Superintendent was passed in character and he reported the temporal and spiritual condition of the District.

J. W. Moultrie, District Superintendent passed and he reported the Charleston District.

I. H. Fulton, District Superintendent passed and he reported the Florence District.

Touching references to the departure from time to eternity of several of our veterans of the cross of Christ, led to the singing tenderly of the Hymn "Asleep in Jesus" etc.

The Rev. D. M. McLeod, D. D., Pastor of First M. E. Church South, Sumter, S. C., was introduced and he was somewhat electrical in his fraternal greetings to conference.

Greenville District was called and J. F. Page, District Superintendent, passed and reported.

The Sumter District was called and J. E. Wilson, District Superintendent passed and he reported.

Spartanburg District was called and C. R. Brown, District Superintendent was passed and he reported.

The Orangeburg District was called and E. B. Burroughs, District Superintendent passed and he reported. The hymn "Servant of God well done" etc, was sung, led by S. S. Lawton.

Resolutions by C. R. Brown and J. B. Middleton relative to the Conference Claimants Fund were adopted. See resolutions. By motion it was voted that 11-30 on Friday next, the special order shall be the election of delegates to the ensuing General Conference.

The 14th Question was resumed, the Beaufort District was called, D. J. Sanders, District Superintendent passed and he reported the condition of the District.

Notice of meeting to the class of 3rd year by J. L. Grice was given. On motion of D. H. Kearse, it was voted that on Friday after the reception of the class into full membership, the special order shall be the consideration of the division of the conference into the conferences.

The 14th Question resumed, the Bennettsville District was taken up and the following effective elders reported:

The following preachers wives have passed away. Mrs. Janie L. Hickson, Mrs. D. M. Minus, Mrs. J. E. C. Jenkins, Mrs. H. L. Roper. The Speakers—See report of committee on Memoirs. The Rev. H. H. Matthews presided with great dignity. The papers read, and the addresses delivered deserves and should have a place in the archives of conference. The singing during the exercises were appropriate and helpful. The benediction was pronounced by the Rev. H. H. Matthews.

SUNDAY, 8 P. M.

The Anniversary of the Board of Home Missions and Church Extension, J. A. Brown presiding, was celebrated. A collection amounting to \$27.71 was taken by W. B. Romans, B. C. Jackson, I. L. Hardy. The first hymn on the program prepared by this Board was sung by the choir and congregation. Responsive readings were conducted by W. G. Valentine and N. T. Bowen. The battle hymn of the republic was sung, and I. E. Lowery lead in prayer. The presiding officer J. A. Brown introduced J. B. Taylor, who in choice and fitting language introduced the speaker of the hour, the Rev. I. L. Thomas, D. D., Field Secretary of the Board of Home Missions and Church Extension. Williams and others relative to division of Conference was adopted. A collection amounting to \$10.00 for relief of B. G. Frederick in connection with the Orangeburg District Conference minutes was lifted. By motion a collection for the sexton was taken up. Result \$6.00. Voted to adjourn to meet at 3 P. M. It was voted on motion of A. G. Townsend and others that the secretary be authorized to edit and publish the minutes. By motion \$60.00 was appropriated for detailed missionary information.

A neat purse expressing the love and affection of the Preachers of the Greenville District for the retiring District Superintendent. J. F. Page was presented by W. G. Valentine on behalf of the preachers. The response by Dr. Page was felicitious and hearty.

The Bishop resumed the chair. Mr. E. B. Holloway, Secretary of Laymen's Convention reported the results of the elections by that body. The Lay Delegates elected. See list. He also reported the action of the Laymen's convention for division of conference as being unanimous and as being equally so in opposition to two additional Districts. He also reported the vote on the constitutional proposition as follows: Ayes 0, Noes 131. An additional purse by E. B. Holloway, was presented to J. F. Page as a token of highest esteem by the laymen of the Greenville District. Conference adjourned after notices and announcements. The benediction was pronounced by Bishop Wilson.

FIFTH DAY—SECOND SESSION.

Conference met pursuant to adjournment at 3 P. M. The devotions were led by C. C. Robinson. Dr. L. M. Dunton presiding by appointment of the Bishop. The Conference Treasurer reported. See Report. Adopted. The chairman of the Board of Conference Stewards reported. See Report. Adopted. Rev. I. L. Thomas, D. D., Field Agent of the Board of Home Missions and Church Extension was introduced and he manifested great interest in the cause and he cited conference to many instances, of needy Churches.

The Bishop resumed the chair. The Standing Committees were nominated and concurred in. The Triers of Appeals and the Trustees of Conference were appointed. The report was accepted and approved. By motion a collection was ordered for the local Church expenses. Results \$9.

Bishop Wilson then addressed the Conference expressing his non concurrence in the vote for division of Conference and his disapproval of said action, while conceding all rights, personal and general. Resolutions by C. C. Scott and D. H. Kearse affecting division of Conference and taking the matter to General Conference, were adopted as a substitute for resolutions by C. C. The Bishop made a short exhortation and read the appointments. "God be with you" etc., was sung with great effect and the conference adjourned with the benediction by Bishop L. B. Wilson.

Claffin University, Orangeburg, S. C. Annual Report of L. M. Dunton, President.

To the President and Members of the South Carolina Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church:

Dear Brothers:—The years come and go in such quick succession that I find it difficult to accomplish more than a tithe of the work I plan and that needs to be done. While we are living instrenuous times and every man seems to have his hands more than full, I am anxious to learn whether the work we have in hand, as a Conference and as School, has the share of attention that its importance demands. As I see the situation, there is no interest quite so important and which is so much neglected as the proper education and training of our youth, in the home. in the Sunday School, and in the day school. We, as a Conference and as a people in South Carolina, can not hope for much of a future until some reforms are instituted, and these reforms are within easy reach.

While we are profoundly thankful to Almighty God for the many blessings He has given us, we trust that greater usefulness and fuller consecration on our part will win for us greater achievements in the future. Claffin University during the past school year enjoyed about her usual prosperity.

There are always a few changes, a few cases of discipline, and a few complaints incident to school life everywhere, and it should not be deemed strange if we have some of these burdens to bear.

The University Senate of our Church has undertaken to fix certain financial and literary standards for our Methodist Seminaries and Colleges, so that credits and degrees gained in any one of our Schools shall be recognized and accepted by any other Methodist School, and, not only so, but in any other College in the country. In other words, no Methodist institution shall be known as a College in the future unless it does Standard College work. Now, in order to meet the requirements of the University Senate, the Freedmen's Aid Society, in co-operation with the Presidents of our Colleges and Universities, has introduced into our schools in the South a uniform course of study, which, if carried out, will standardize our school. We can not say that they will be equal to our best Colleges in the North, because they have buildings, laboratories, museums, libraries, lecture courses and a corps of high grade and high priced teachers that we in our poverty can not command. The poor man is at a disadvantage everywhere and I am coming to think its a disgrace to be ignorant and a disgrace to be poor. Within the past three or four years the courses of study have been crowded up about two years. That is to say, that a student at Claflin is now required to do about two years more of work than in former years. This high literary standard is already causing us some trouble. Students can go to the State College and to some other institutions and be classed two, or even three years higher than they can be at Claflin. It is a strong temptation to a student to go to a school that will put him thru in a short time and with but little to do, but there is a growing class of people in the State who appreciate the advantages of a good school and a thorough course of study, and that is the class of patrons we are seeking.

The work at the University is so closely associated with that of the common schools that this Report would hardly be complete without some reference to the common schools. That some thing must be done speedily to improve the condition of the common school must be apparent to anyone who has given the matter the slightest consideration. Our need is for better school houses, better trained teachers and longer school sessions. If the Trustees can not be persuaded to provide a suitable school building, then the Community should take up the matter with the same zeal and enthusiasm that would characterize them in building a Church. If the people were at all earnest in their purpose to educate their children the school house could easily be built.

The selection of a teacher should not be left entirely to a Board of Trustees. They can not have the interest in the school you ought to have. Some competent person should look up a good teacher and then go the Trustees and get the

teacher appointed. Again, the sessions should be at least six or seven months long. To be sure, there is no uniform or fair distribution of the School Fund, but, in some cases at least, the colored schools would be better taken care of if the patrons would take a greater interest in the schools. It was reported not long ago that a teacher was employed and the day fixed for the opening of the school, and when the time came not a single pupil was present.

The lack of interest on the part of the people in the education and training of their children is really alarming. I do not know of any one who is so likely to succeed in improving conditions as yourselves. May I suggest that we have a great Educational Rally and shake the State from one end to the other? I wish that every minister in the Conference would open a day school in his Church and superintend it and teach it, if necessary, himself. In the early history of our Conference this was done, and we got much better returns than we are now getting. Let me give you a few figures that I am sure will impress you with the fact that something needs to be done without delay.

Professor W. T. B. Williams, Field Agent of the John F. Slater Fund, in a paper read before the National Association of Teachers at Colored Schools, says that South Carolina pays annually for the education of each white child \$10.34 and for the education of each colored child \$1.70.

With such a meager appropriation the wonder is that we can do anything at all in the education of our colored youth. Let me give you some figures still more startling. In 1906 Massachusetts raised \$26.42 for the education of each child,

ENDOWMENT FUND.

The University Senate requires in addition to a high literary standard for all our Methodist Colleges, an Endowment Fund of at least \$100,000.00 by the end of 1912, and an additional \$100,000.00 by the end of 1916. This requirement the South Carolina Conference, the Alumni, students, teachers and friends of Claflin University have determined to meet. I want to commend the District Superintendents and ministers of the Conference for the splendid work they have done. There is no one thing that has come to us as a Conference that is likely to awaken such a widespread interest in education as this Endowment Movement. If a man has \$25,000.00 in the Bank drawing 4 per cent interest, his money will earn \$1000.00 per annum, which is a very good support for an average family. If Claflin University can have \$200,000.00 invested at 4 per cent, this money will earn annually \$8000,

which will be no small assistance in meeting the current expenses of the University. Then again, when we really get started on an Endowment Fund, I have no doubt we will all be surprised to see how fast it will grow.

In addition to the plans already adopted for raising this Fund, it has been suggested that our farmers set apart a half acre of land or a half dozen rows in their field for the Endowment Fund. I would further suggest that in each of our Churches the Sisters be organized into Clubs, to be known as "The School Improvement League," the object of the organization to be to devise ways and means to raise the Endowment Fund. When you get the Sisters interested, then things go.

We deprecate the fearful conditions obtaining in our public school systems in this state, and throughout the south, so far as our public are concerned, and pledge our earnest efforts to their improvements as far as we are able to do so.

We rejoice in the great work Gammon Theological Seminary has done, is doing and is destined to do, in training young men for our ministry and urge upon all of the undergraduates and those anticipating coming into the Conference to take advantage of the opportunities offered by this excellent Institution.
