FIRST DAY—WEDNESDAY.

---

The South Carolina Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, convened in its One Hundred and Fifth Session in the Methodist Church at Anderson, S. C., Wednesday morning, November 26, 1890, at 9:30 o'clock, Bishop W. W. Duncan, D. D., presiding.

The opening religious exercises, including the administration of the Lord's Supper, were conducted by the Bishop, assisted by Revs. Samuel Leard, John M. Carlisle, Henry M. Mood and C. H. Pritchard.

After an address by the Bishop, the Secretary of the last Conference called the roll, and 137 clerical and 19 lay members answered to their names. [See Conference Register and Directory. Absentees are marked with an asterisk (\*).]

Hilliard F. Chreitzberg was re-elected Secretary, with E. Olin Watson, T. Charlton Ligon and Samuel Lander assistants.

The bar of the Conference was fixed within the transept of the building. Wm. C. Power presented the report of the Presiding Elders nominating the Committees to serve during the present Conference session, and the Boards to serve for the next four years, which was adopted:

On motion, the Committee on Memoirs was instructed to note the death of Rev. J. S. Mattison, late Missionary to Brazil.

Dr. Morton, Secretary General Board Church Extension, was introduced.

Communications from the Board of Church Extension, the Publishing House, General Sunday School Board and Board of Missions, were presented and referred to the respective Conference Boards and Committees.

H. N. McTyeire, of the Publishing House, was introduced.

The examination of character and official administration was entered upon, and the names of the Presiding Elders were called and passed. The Supernumeraries and Superannuates were passed and referred to the Committee on Conference Relations for continuance in their present relations, excepting S. B. Jones, P. B. Jackson and A. H. Lester, who were left effective.

Communications were received from Dr. Whitefoord Smith, Wm. Hutto, and W. H. Moore, Presiding Elder of the Statesville District, North Carolina Conference.

Bishop Duncan was unanimously requested to preach the Thanksgiving Sermon to-morrow (Thursday) morning, at 11 o'clock; at the instance of the Bishop the Conference substituted Dr. Morton.

Leave of absence was refused Dr. Lander from to-morrow morning's session.

Announcements were made, and Conference adjourned with the doxology, and the benediction by the Bishop.

## SECOND DAY—THURSDAY.

NOVEMBER 27, 1890.

Conference convened at the appointed hour, Bishop Duncan in the chair. The opening devotional service was conducted by R. P. Franks.

The Minutes of yesterday's session were read and approved.

Roll was called and 15 clerical and 7 lay members absent at yesterday's session answered to their names. On motion, the calling of the roll was to be discontinued after to-day.

Ten traveling and six local preachers were duly elected Deacons. (See Condensed Minutes.)

W. S. B. Ford was discontinued at his own request.

The transfer of B. D. Lucas, of the class of the second year, to the China Mission Conference was announced.

Rev. D. E. Frierson, of the Presbyterian Church, was introduced.

The application of Jasper Bartelle, local preacher, for the restoration of his credentials to Deacon's orders was granted.

The hour for the Thanksgiving service having arrived, Dr. Morton delivered an appropriate sermon from Matth., vi, 9; after which the regular business of the Conference was resumed.

Six applicants were in due form admitted on trial. (See Condensed Minutes.)

Announcements were made, and Conference adjourned with the doxology, and the benediction by the Bishop.

## THIRD DAY—FRIDAY.

NOVEMBER 28, 1890.

Bishop Duncan called the Conference to order at 9:30 A. M. W. T. Capers conducted the opening service.

The Journal of yesterday's session was read and approved.

Five traveling and three local preachers were duly elected Elders. (See Condensed Minutes).

The transfer of Preston L. Kirton from the Alabama Conference to this Conference was announced.

The characters of J. L. Shuford, J. J. Workman and G. W. Gatlin were passed, and they were referred to the Committee on Conference Relations for the superannuated relation, as was also A. W. Jackson to the same Committee for the supernumerary relation.

Dr. E. E. Hoss, Editor *Christian Advocate*, (Nashville,) was introduced.

Reports from the Columbia Female College, Wofford College and Cokesbury Conference School were presented and referred to the Board of Education.

A paper from the Board of Directors of the Williamston Female College was presented and referred to the Board of Education.

Rev. W. H. Potter, D. D., Missionary Secretary, and Prof. D. A. DuPre of Wofford College were introduced.

The examination of character was resumed, and several traveling preachers rendered their reports, and their characters were passed.

The following resolution was adopted:

*Resolved*, That the Preachers in Charge be earnestly requested to collect as much as one-half of the assessments for foreign and domestic missions within four months from the adjournment of the Conference, and forward the same to the Treasurer of the Board of Missions.

The name of Dr. E. J. Meynardie was referred to the Committee on Memoirs.

On motion, the following paper was referred to the Conference Board of Missions:

*Resolved*, 1. That the Constitution of the Board of Missions be so changed as to have one layman from each District on the Board.

*Resolved*, 2. That the Constitution of the Board of Missions be so changed as to make the Presiding Elders corresponding members instead of members *ex officio*.

*Resolved*, 3. That the Board of Missions render to this Conference a full and itemized report of all appropriations of the domestic missionary funds and the settlement of the same, and also the appropriations for the coming year, before the adjournment of Conference; and that hereafter these reports be published in full in the Minutes.

Thirteen were duly admitted into full connection. (See Condensed Minutes.)

On motion, it was resolved that Conference convene to-morrow morning at 9 o'clock in order to give the Legal Conference an opportunity to hold its annual session.

The application of Rev. Warren Parker, of the Free Methodist Church, for admission and recognition of orders was rejected.

The applications of Rev. James A. Givens, from the Baptist Church, and Rev. T. A. Blakeley, from the Methodist Protestant Church, for recognition of Local Elder's orders were granted.

Rev. T. H. Law, D. D., Superintendent A. B. S. for North and South Carolina, was introduced.

Announcements were made.

Conference adjourned with the doxology, and the benediction by Rev. Dr. Hoss.

#### FOURTH DAY—SATURDAY.

NOVEMBER 29, 1890.

Conference met pursuant to adjournment, Dr. Samuel B. Jones, President of the Legal Conference, in the chair. Opening devotions were conducted by the President. The business of the Legal Conference having been disposed of, the body adjourned *sine die*, and Bishop Duncan took the chair.

The Minutes of yesterday's session were read and adopted.

Twelve candidates, duly examined and approved, remain on trial. (See Condensed Minutes.)

Rev. T. H. Law, D. D., addressed the Conference on the Bible Cause.

Examination of character was continued.

Report No. 1 Board of Missions was read, and pending its consideration Dr. Potter addressed the Conference on the necessities of the mission work of the Church. The Conference resolved to raise an amount sufficient to pay the salaries of Rev. J. W. Tarboux, now in Brazil, and a single man in Japan. The sum of \$2,250 was asked for, and a collection was made amounting to \$2,283.50, of which \$689.25 was in cash. On motion, H. F. Chreitzberg was made Treasurer of this fund.

Dr. Hoss, Editor *Christian Advocate*, addressed the Conference in the interest of that journal.

Announcements were made, and the Conference adjourned with the doxology, and the benediction by the Bishop.

#### SUNDAY.

The Conference Love Feast was held at 9:30 A. M. in the Methodist Church, and was conducted by Samuel Leard.

At 11 A. M. Bishop Duncan delivered a practical and pointed sermon in the Methodist Church, after which he ordained ten traveling and six local preachers to the office of Deacon. (See Condensed Minutes.)

W. R. Richardson preached in the same church at 3:30 P. M. At the close of the sermon Bishop Duncan ordained five traveling and three local preachers to the office of Elder. (See Condensed Minutes.)

Geo. W. Walker preached at 7:30 P. M. At the close of the sermon a memorial service in memory of Rev. E. J. Meynardie, D. D., was held. Henry M. Mood read a suitable memoir.

W. L. Waite read a memoir of Rev. J. S. Mattison, formerly a member of this Conference, who died in Brazil. Touching tributes were paid by several of the brethren.

The pulpits of the evangelical churches of the city were filled by members of the Conference.

#### FIFTH DAY—MONDAY.

DECEMBER 1, 1890.

Conference assembled at the appointed hour, Bishop Duncan in the chair. Religious service was conducted by Samuel B. Jones.

The Minutes of Saturday's session were read and confirmed.

Leave of absence was granted J. W. Necley, N. K. Melton and J. L. Sifly during the remainder of the Conference session.

The Bishop gave answers to Questions IX, XI, XIII, XV. (See Condensed Minutes.)

The following certificate was filed :

The passage of character was continued.

Mrs. E. E. Wiley, representing the Woman's Parsonage and Home Mission Department of the Church Extension Board, addressed the Conference, and a cash collection was raised amounting to \$175.

On motion, the following resolution was adopted :

*Resolved*, That we have heard the address of Mrs. Wiley with reference to the Parsonage Aid and Home Mission work with great satisfaction and appreciation, and we hereby pledge our support in the cause for which she is working.

A telegram was read announcing the death of Rev. Wm. Thomas, which occurred in Florence, this morning, at 9:50 o'clock. The Conference, led by the Bishop, joined in singing two stanzas of "Rock of Ages."

The examination of ministerial character was continued. The official character of R. C. Oliver was arrested, and, after considerable discussion, a committee of investigation, consisting of Sidi H. Browne, Samuel B. Jones and R. P. Franks, was appointed to consider the case.

On motion, an afternoon session to meet at 3:30 o'clock was ordered.  
After the usual announcements, Conference adjourned with the doxology, and the benediction by the Bishop.

## FIFTH DAY—MONDAY.

### AFTERNOON SESSION.

DECEMBER 1, 1890.

Conference met at 3:30 o'clock, Bishop Duncan presiding. Samuel A. Weber conducted the opening service.

The Minutes of the morning session were read and approved.

The examination of ministerial character was continued throughout the greater portion of the afternoon.

Three preachers were readmitted. (See Condensed Minutes.)

John A. Wood was referred to the Committee on Conference Relations for the supernumerary relation.

An evening session was ordered to meet at 7:30 o'clock.

Conference adjourned with the doxology, and the benediction by the Bishop.

### EVENING SESSION.

Conference met pursuant to adjournment, Bishop Duncan in the chair. Opening service was conducted by P. F. Kistler.

The Minutes of the afternoon session were read and adopted.

The examination of ministerial character was continued.

The Committee of investigation in the case of R. C. Oliver reported that after a careful examination they find that a trial is unnecessary.

On motion, the character of R. C. Oliver was passed, and he was referred to the Committee on Conference Relations for the supernumerary relation.

Reports Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 of the Joint Board of Finance were read and adopted. (See Reports.)

A special collection of \$102.69 was made for Mrs. A. Nettles, whose case was overlooked by the Board.

Reports Nos. 1, 2 and 3 of the Board of Education were read and adopted. (See Reports.)

On motion, it was resolved that the Board of Education nominate the Board of Trustees for Wofford College.

Committee on Publication of SOUTHERN CHRISTIAN ADVOCATE made its report, which was adopted. (See Reports.)

On motion, it was ordered that \$200 be assessed upon the Conference for the Guarantee Fund for the Second Ecumenical Conference, and the Joint Board was instructed to divide the same among the Conference Districts.

A motion to adjourn was lost.

*Resolved*, That the Board of Missions render to this Conference a full and itemized report of all appropriations of the domestic missionary funds and the settlement of the same; that hereafter the appropriations for the coming year be read before the adjournment of Conference, and that these reports be all published in full in the Minutes.

*Resolved*, That the Constitution of the Board of Missions be so changed as to make its members to consist of as many ministers as there may be Presiding Elders' Districts, and of one layman from each District; and that seven constitute a quorum.

Report of the Joint Board of Finance was, on motion, amended so that \$100 which had been overlooked could be added to the Bishops' fund.

The Joint Board of Finance for 1891 was announced. (See Conference Officers, Boards, etc.)

At the instance of Mr. Wm. Laughlin, some friends of the city, through J. A. Clifton, begged to add \$43.25 to the special collection for Mrs. Nettles.

J. A. Clifton, in behalf of the Conference, in well chosen remarks, presented a beautiful jewel to Bishop Duncan. The Bishop replied, thanking

the brethren for the cordial reception they had given him, and assured them of his continued affection for them.

S. A. Weber was chosen to make the annual address before the Historical Society at its next meeting.

The following resolutions were adopted by a rising vote :

*Resolved*, That the thanks of this body are eminently due, and are hereby tendered, the kind people of Anderson and vicinity for the elegant hospitality so heartily extended to the members of this Conference during its session now closing.

## Report No. 3.

The year now closing has been one of eminent success in our educational work. The Faculties of Wofford College and Columbia Female College have exhibited zeal, energy and ability in presenting the claims of their institutions to public support; they have received the hearty co-operation of the preachers, and the result has been a considerable increase of patronage.

This prosperity, however, should not tempt us to relax in any wise the efforts by which it has been attained, but rather it should incite us to renewed and ever-increasing interest in the great cause which affects so decisively the welfare of Church and State.

## Wofford College

opened its 37th collegiate year October 1, ult. To the present date one hundred and thirty-five students have matriculated in College, and ninety-seven in the Fitting School. The Freshman class numbers fifty-four. It has been found necessary to divide it into two sections and add to the teaching force of the College by employing Mr. J. T. Wrightson of the class of '89 to take charge of the entire class in English. There has lately been a little more than the usual amount of sickness, but at present the usual good health prevails among all the classes. All things point to a profitable and pleasant year's working of the College machinery.

## Columbia Female College,

the only institution of its kind owned and controlled by the South Carolina Conference, is in a condition of prosperity unprecedented in its history since the war. Ninety-three boarding pupils are now in the building, and there is room only for a few more. The curriculum under the new management has not been changed, except that the new method of teaching Old English has been introduced and is showing marked results in improving that department.

The standard of graduation has been raised considerably, and with a *bona fide* faculty of four male professors and six female teachers this institution is prepared to do, and the Board feels satisfied is doing, as good work as any female college in the State. We heartily commend it to the continued and increasing patronage of the people, especially the Methodist people, of South Carolina. It is more than probable that steps will be taken to enlarge the capacity of the building.

## Cokesbury Conference School

seeks to prepare boys and girls for college and the ordinary business pursuits. Its situation is healthful, low rates of boarding prevail, and the Rector invites correspondence and patronage from all parts of the State.

## REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON THE BIBLE CAUSE.

The work of that noblest of our institutions—the American Bible Society—lives and expands. Its far-reaching, world-embracing operations entitle it to our respect, our gratitude and our support. In foreign fields it furnishes missionaries with the Word of Life, printed in the languages of the heathen, and in Christendom proposes to put a Bible, not only in every home, but, in our own country, in the hand of every child that can read it. To the poor it gives the food of the soul, and to the blind the light of celestial day. The issues of this Society amount to 52,736,975 copies, in forty different languages.

And now the Society calls on all the Churches to do their duty, and in these United States see that every child has its own Bible. Pastors, parents, Sunday school superintendents and teachers must co-operate with the Society, and distribute throughout this great and growing government a million more copies of the Bible.

The Committee present the following resolutions :

1. That, *of course*, we pledge ourselves to co-operate with the American Bible Society.
2. That, as pastors, we will be more diligent in supplying our people with Bibles, and in urging upon all, adults and children, the daily reading and study of the Scriptures.
3. That we consider no Sunday school properly furnished without a Bible and a Catechism in the hand of every scholar.
4. That it is our duty cheerfully to collect from our congregations, once a year, donations to be forwarded to Rev. T. H. Law, D. D., District Superintendent of North and South Carolina, at Spartanburg, S. C.

2. That we endorse the action of our last General Conference that did not scruple to put us on record as a prohibition Church.
3. That the saloon is an unmitigated evil, a public nuisance, repugnant alike to morals and religion.
4. That in line with our Discipline, we denounce the license system as an immorality, and call upon our people to work and pray for the removal of this reproach to our Christian land.

## REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON BOOKS AND PERIODICALS.

The sentiments and morals of society are menaced and endangered by a corrupt press to a most alarming extent. The press, which should be the instrument to advance good morals and pure sentiments, has been converted by a profligate world into an engine of evil, which is injuring society from centre to circumference. It demoralizes by a pretentious claim to morals superior to Christianity, by holding up the miracles of the Bible to contempt and ridicule, and by scattering broadcast a vitiated cheap literature. It breeds skepticism by questioning the inspiration of the sacred Scriptures, and by presenting scientific theories which are claimed to antagonize, and which are believed will destroy, the very foundations of Christianity.

We are glad to know that the Church is waking up to this dangerous condition of things, and is developing writers of profound thought and argument, together with a pure religious literature cheapened to meet the condition of all classes of the reading public, and is rescuing the press from its unhallowed work, and turning its formidable batteries against wickedness in high and low places, and achieving distinguished success in this work of faith and labor of love.

For several years past the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, has been attempting by her Publishing House to scatter a pure literature broadcast over these lands, but her publishing interests became greatly crippled and hampered by the late war, heaping upon her a great debt, which modified its efforts and threatened it with total bankruptcy; but by the liberality of her membership and the wise management of these great interests, she has been delivered from these embarrassments, which enables her to show an increase last year of \$83,396.22 and making a net gain in assets of \$82,944.28, enabling the Committee to increase the appropriation for the benefit of the disciplinary claimants specified in the sixth restrictive rule of the Discipline \$5,000, making the whole amount appropriated \$17,500, the portion falling to this Conference being \$999.60.

Our preachers should patronize our own Publishing House because it is our own and it is worthy of our support. The mechanical make-up of its publications is equal to the best, and books not made there can be procured there by our preachers at publishers' rates. The Book Committee has also increased the appropriation for the benefit of our Sunday schools from \$1,500 to the sum of \$3,000, and elected an Assistant Sunday School Editor as the General Conference directed. J. L. Kerly, an educated, cultured layman and eminent journalist, was chosen for this position.

It is very desirable that the *Quarterly Review* should be self-sustaining by paying the expenses of its production. The cost per annum to the subscribers is only \$2.50, preachers receiving it for \$2.00 and a commission of fifty cents on every new subscriber. There ought not to be less than one hundred and fifty subscribers from the members of this Conference.

The *Christian Advocate* is under a new editorial corps: the Rev. E. E. Hoss, D. D., of the Holston Annual Conference, and the Rev. E. M. Bounds, D. D., of the St. Louis Annual Conference. This connectional weekly is springing into fresh life, and the hope is entertained during the present quadrennium of swelling its number of subscribers to 100,000. The paper cannot be regarded in any sense as the rival of any local organ and should be prized and patronized by all.

Among the new books published the past year, special attention is called to "Letters from the Orient," by Mrs. Bishop A. W. Wilson. If you wish to have a fresh missionary inspiration, get this book and read it. If you desire your friends to receive a like benediction, scatter this book among them. Another book meriting the special attention of the preachers of this Conference is the "History of the Revision of the Discipline," by Rev. P. A. Peterson, D. D. This book notes all the modifications which the Discipline has undergone to its present condition of perfection.

THE SOUTHERN CHRISTIAN ADVOCATE, the special and only organ of this Conference, needs no commendation of ours. Its gifted editor gives us a fresh, crisp issue each week, every page of which reflects industry, enterprise and intellectual capability. Let us with renewed effort extend its circulation until all the families of our Conference shall feast weekly upon the intellectual and religious pabulum it affords.

#### REPORT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD.

The scope of Sunday school work has been often defined, and it is not the purpose of this report to repeat it; nor shall we bring charges of neglect as to interest felt in the work. Year by year our numbers, appliances and spheres of usefulness are enlarging. In all that goes to constitute thorough organization and efficiency, we are, perhaps, better prepared for work than ever before. Class organization is improving. We are better prepared to

officer our schools. Our literature improves. Our libraries are better and better selected than formerly. Mission work is going on in communities contiguous to older churches and charges, and the Sunday school worker is blessing and being blessed, while the nuclei of future churches are thus being formed. So, for encouraging prospects, the day is bright and grows brighter.

But a work so vast, so far-reaching, demands Divine planning and Divine methods. "Except the Lord build the house they labor in vain that build it." It is to be feared that the Divine purpose, the salvation of souls, does not possess us as it should, as the *one* object of this work; and that growth in piety and experimental knowledge of God and the things of God do not keep pace with our enlarged advantages; and that the number of genuine conversions is not increasing in proportion to our growing opportunities. Let us not lose sight of this, that the object of Sunday school work is the salvation of souls and the enlightening of the mind as to the meaning of the Word of God. As to intelligent conceptions of the nature of the general work of the Church in advancing our Lord's cause at home and in giving the Gospel to the world, the Sunday school furnishes the best fields of instruction. Let our children be trained intelligently and made to realize their privileges and obligations under the Gospel and the future is already secure. Our County Sunday School Conventions are being made, wherever thoroughly organized, efficient agencies in the practical development of Sunday school work. Let brethren not forget the obligation upon us to see that these organizations are perfected in each County of the State. The Children's Day offerings have been good and are accomplishing vast good in destitute regions. The offerings this year amount to \$473.63 from the districts as follows:

#### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CONFERENCE JOURNALS.

The Committee charged with the duty of reviewing the Journals of the ten Districts of the South Carolina Conference have undertaken that work and beg leave to submit the following report :

The Committee would make the general statement, before referring to the Journals separately, that they have found but little to do in the way of adverse criticism, owing to the excellency of the clerical work which has passed under their inspection. So careful have been the scribes in doing that work, and so uniform is its excellency, that reports on the different Journals must prove somewhat monotonous.

In our review we begin with the *Columbia District*—and report that its Record, in the main, has been kept in a beautiful manner. About the only fault to be found is with the fact that a few names appear on the roll in pencil instead of ink.

The *Florence District* Journal is well kept, the resolutions and reports being made in a neat and careful manner.

A close examination of the *Sumter Conference* Record has discovered nothing that deserves adverse criticism. It might be held up as a model of its kind.

While the *Orangeburg District* Journal exhibits careful work, and while it shows a marked improvement over the Record of last year's Minutes, yet the Committee suggest that it could be still further improved by arranging the roll of membership by charges instead of in separate lists.

We find that, in the general, the *Chester Conference* Record is free from criticism. But we are compelled to animadvert upon the fact that one of the pages is disfigured by blots.

The *Cokesbury Conference* Journal is well kept in every way, and there is nothing in it that *warrants the censure of the Committee*.

The Journal of the *Spartanburg District* is neat and accurate.

The *Charleston District* Record is written in a legible hand, with no defects in orthography. The reports of the committees are fully set forth.

The *Greenville Conference* Journal is generally free from blemishes.

The Committee has reserved the best for the last, and desire to say that special commendation is deserved by the scribe of the *Marion District* Record. This Journal is remarkable for the neatness with which it has been kept. No single blot or erasure appears on any of its pages. Its chirography is not only legible but beautiful, and its punctuation is perfect. The *data* are given in a condensed and elegant form. We have nothing but the very highest praise for this Record.

In conclusion, the Committee beg leave to express their gratification over the fact that their work has been made so easy and pleasant by the painstaking and care of the Secretaries whose duty it has been to transcribe the proceedings of the several District Conferences.

#### REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

The Board of Missions held its annual meeting in the Methodist Church in Anderson, S. C., Tuesday, November 25, 1890. Rev. J. B. Traywick, First Vice President, presided in the absence of the President, Rev. W. D. Kirkland, D. D. The reports from the different mission fields of the Conference make the following excellent showing:

*Cumberland* (Charleston): The work here is in good condition, perhaps better than ever before. The financial report is the best that has ever been made from the charge. A parsonage has been secured, which is another step towards the firm establishment of the mission. A decrease in the membership is accounted for by the leaving of quite a number of workmen of the city for other fields of labor. Thus, indeed, much of our work often seems lost, but we cherish the hope that these scattered disciples, as did those of old, carry and spread the "good news" far and wide.

*Columbia City Mission*: This charge holds its own, though there is much of fluctuation in the population reached. There are other peculiar difficulties that cannot be detailed here. The Pastor has done good work, and the outlook is hopeful. A parsonage has been built, worth seventeen hundred dollars, but a debt of seven hundred and fifty dollars still rests upon it.

*Parksville*: For several years, perhaps from its establishment, this charge has made a most creditable showing. Again it sends up a good report. The spiritual condition is good, and the collections are all full, with a surplus.

*Scranton*: This is purely missionary ground, and a most promising field. We alone occupy it. The reports are good. There has been an advance in financial matters.

*Society Hill*: The Society Hill Mission is an extensive field. The churches are poor. There is marked advancement, however. The collections, a good general index of prosperity, are in advance of last year.

*Effingham*: The work was in very poor condition at the beginning of the Conference year. The record of the year is remarkable, showing advance all along the line.

*Little Pee Dee*: As has been perhaps before reported to this body, there are some peculiar conditions that stop large development of this work. It is all-important, however, that the people here be served. They appreciate the Gospel and do what they can.

*Upper Edisto*: The outlook here is more hopeful. The Pastor has done a faithful year's work. There has been an increase in the membership. A good church has been completed the present year.

All of these were continued as missions in the care of the Board.

*Pickens*: A good work is being done in this charge. There is evident development. A noticeable feature is the building of churches, showing that we are driving down our stakes to stay and hold this section for Christ.

*Oconee*: This work is in good condition. Here also the building of churches is a remarkable feature of improvement.

These two missions were continued provisionally, subject to possible readjustment of circuit lines by the Cabinet.

*Aiken*: The church at Aiken is in comparatively good condition. There is little growth, and no immediate prospect of the charge becoming self-sustaining. The small band of members here are liberal and every way worthy of our fostering care.

*Spartanburg City Mission*: The reports show advance over last year. A new church at the Spartan Mills has been organized, and the membership will reach between two and three hundred. The outlook is quite promising.

These missions were continued.

The following new missions were established:

*New Brooklyn*, in and near the city of Columbia, across the Congaree in New Brooklyn, and also bordering on the East bank of the river. Here it is hoped to reach a large number of operatives in already established and prospective factories.

*Blackstock*, stretching for a number of miles through parts of Chester and Fairfield Counties, in what is known as the Monticello country.

Besides these missions proper, the Board grants aid to a number of weak charges, with a good return for our investment of the Lord's money. We realize the obligation to preach the Gospel to *every creature*, at home and abroad, in Carolina and China, entering every open door, and claiming nothing less than the world for Christ.

Through the eye gate no less than through the ear gate comes the freight of spiritual food. In these hurrying, hardening times many people receive their information from the printed page.

To better secure the entrance of words that give light to the human heart and conscience, we must put into the homes and hands of our people a distinctively religious literature, pure and wholesome, supplying a deeply felt want, and measurably counteracting the baneful effects of the tide of corrupting literature flooding the land and threatening to fill our homes.

The deliberate conclusion of the fathers composing our last General Conference was that in the bounds of every Annual Conference of the connection there should be operated a system of colportage looking to this end.

As a Board, we are convinced that the time has come for the South Carolina Conference to make a beginning in so important a department of Church work.

We therefore nominate Rev. John C. Chandler as General Colporter for this Conference agreeably with the provisions made in the Book of Discipline.

We further recommend the establishment of a Book Depository, to be under the control of the General Colporter: *Provided, however*, That the South Carolina Conference shall not be responsible for the financial obligations involved.

## VI.

## MEMOIR.

## REV. E. J. MEYNARDIE, D. D.,

Was born in Charleston, South Carolina, May 25th, 1826, and died in Columbia, July 1st, 1890.

He received a liberal education in the schools of his native city. When quite a youth his sprightliness and promise attracted the attention of General James Simons, of the Charleston bar, who offered him a situation and induced him to enter his office as a law student. When about twenty-one years old he attended a camp meeting near Charleston, at which he was converted. His call to preach was distinct from his conversion, but came soon after, and he never entertained a doubt as to where to him lay the path of duty. It cost him no little conflict to forego the flattering prospects of his chosen profession, but through grace he prevailed, and then cheerfully went to the work to which he knew God had called him. He was licensed to preach in the Summer of 1848, and at the close of the year was admitted on trial into the South Carolina Conference as a traveling preacher. His advancement to the different orders of the ministry was regular. In the long term of his ministry he never sustained any other than an effective relationship. A favorite expression of his was: "If it please God, I want to die in my boots." So, almost literally, it was. During his long ministerial life he was eight years on circuits, twenty-three on stations, most of them the most important in our Conference, eight on districts, and one as Chaplain in the Confederate army. He closed his useful life and ministry on the Camden station, having commenced his forty-second year as an effective preacher. From the first Doctor Meynardie gave promise of a brilliant career, and very soon became an unusually attractive preacher. With strong convictions, a highly cultivated, classical taste, a mind well stored with scientific and Biblical truths, elegance of diction and great forcefulness of utterance, he was everywhere regarded as a polished and accomplished pulpit orator. The Gospel was to him the "power of God unto salvation," and he preached with the earnestness born of his own experience. He was a brilliant preacher and an excellent Pastor. His finely wrought nature made him capable of the deepest emotions, and his sympathies were easily stirred. He wept with those that wept and rejoiced with those that rejoiced. He was an aggressive worker. It was under his ministry that the Tryon Street Methodist Church of Charlotte, North Carolina, was built. The church in Greenville was completed and furnished during his pastorate.

Dr. Meynardie was honored and appreciated by the Church to whose service he gave his life. He has gone from among us. After a long and trying affliction, in which he suffered as few suffer, on the afternoon of July 1st, at about five o'clock, he found rest. The weary wheels of life stood still, the tired hands were folded on his now peaceful bosom, the storm was hushed into a sweet calm, the liberated soul returned to its God. Loving hands laid his remains to peaceful sleep beside the sacred dust of Rev. S. W. Capers, whom he greatly loved, in the beautiful Quaker Cemetery, near Camden, while was sung the appropriate hymn:

"Jesus, lover of my soul."


