MORNING SESSION

The Ninth Annual Session of the South Carolina Conference of the Methodist Church, One Hundred forty-third as Legal Successor of the Methodist Episcopal Church, Central Jurisdiction, opened at Anderson, South Carolina, November 19, 1947, Bishop Edward W. Kelley, St. Louis Area, presiding.

Devotions were led by Reverends H. B. Jones and R. B. King. Reverend R. E. Bethea, District Superintendent of the Greenville District presented Bishop Kelley.

The Holy Communion was administered by the District Superintendents and the Pastors, after which Hymn 140, "There is a Fountain Filled With Blood" was sung by the choir.

The Roll of the Conference was called by the Secretary, Reverend F. H. Grant. The organization of the Conference was effected as follows:

F. H. Grant was elected Secretary and named his assistants. R. G. Lawrence was elected Statistician and named his assistants. J. C. Gibbs was elected to write for the Christian Advocate and N. W. Greene was elected to write for the secular papers.

The Bar of the Conference was fixed at the gallery. L. W. Curry was elected Postmaster. The Committee on Courtesy

President J. J. Seabrook of Claflin College was presented and read letters from the Accrediting Committee of the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, in which was stated that the College was being recommended for Class "A" rating. President J. W. Heyward of Gammon Theological Seminary was presented. The Benediction was pronounced by Bishop E. W. Kelley.

WEDNESDAY EVENING SESSION

Rev. G. S. Sawyer, Presiding—7:45

After selection by the choir and invocation by Rev. A. P. Sumter, Dr. E. A. Love of the Board of Missions and Church Extension, Dr. J. A. Green of the Board of Education, and Dr. J. W. Golden of the Board of Evangelism were presented and spoke in interest of their respective boards. The conference stewards received an offering of \$25.00.

Solo was rendered by Rev. L. C. Gregg. Dr. A. R. Howard, of the Board of Temperance was presented and took an offering for the Board. Benediction was given by Rev. A. P. Sumter.

THURSDAY MORNING SESSION

In the election of delegates to the Jurisdictional Conference, A. R. Howard received 73 votes of 127 cast and C. F. Furgeson received 66 of 127 cast. On the fifth ballot, I. D. Newman received 72 of 134 votes cast.

Bishop Kelley asked the Secretary to read a memorial asking the General Conference to change the boundaries of the Central Jurisdictional Conference and the boundaries of the Northeastern Jurisdictional Conference in order that the New York and New York East Annual Conferences might be able to promote Negro work within its boundaries. One hundred sixty-three members of the Conference were present and voted unanimously in favor of the memorial.

A memorial was read by the Secretary in which it was requested that the General Conference repeal Paragraph 368 of the Disciplines which makes it mandatory that a minister retire at the age of 72.

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

Devotions were led by J. R. Norwood and G. S. McClarey. The journal was read and approved with the necessary corrections. Pres. J. W. Haywood was presented and spoke in interest of Gammon Theological Seminary. Dr. R. Gammon Morris, pastor of Calvary Methodist Church and Area Secretary

A letter was read by Mrs. V. Dickerson from Dr. J. Manning Potts, associate director of the Crusade for Christ, concerning the Conference deficit of \$11,849.

REPORT OF THE TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE

To the South Carolina Conference held at Anderson, South Carolina,
November 18-23, 1947

There is in the making a new advance movement against alcoholic liquors and the foundation for this aggressive and progressive movement was laid at the meeting in Chicago, held last January 29-30, 1947.

The people called Methodist and the Christians of America can no longer delay, the battle must be waged. An irresistible conflict is at hand. The report of the Committee on Findings at the Chicago Meeting was rather significant, we quote: "The Christian people of America are in danger of losing their moral and spiritual leadership by allowing secular and commercial forces to fix the pattern of human behavior. It is time the Christian Leaders begin calling the "plays" in the destiny of our civilization rather than accept the mores of society created by immoral and non-oral forces.

Believing that "the time is now" for a positive, unfaltering advance against the increasingly devastating evils of alcohol, we, the officially designated representatives (lay and clerical) of the Annual Conferences of the Methodist Church, assembled in January, 1947 Meeting of the Temperance Movement, join in sending the following call to the people of Methodism: The Temperance Advance Movement shall be made an annual conference issue and a project for each district in the church, through Seminars, District Conference Organizations, Board of Lay Activities, Woman's Society of Christian Service, District Youth Groups, and Boards of Education, a program of continuous training be promoted."

Therefore in harmony with this pronouncement, your Committee on Temperance, submits the following resolutions:

I. That we adopt the principles and program of this report with such additions, emphasis and adjustments as to details necessary to meet our conference, district and local church needs.

II. The members of this conference both ministers and laymen, do here and now recommit ourselves to the Temperance cause and the Advance Movement.

III. That we pledge ourselves to promote Temperance Education throughout the church on a conference, district and local church level during the ensuing conference year.

IV. We recommend that special study courses, literature, lectures and visual aid where possible be offered for our high school age group and that special emphasis be placed on Temperance Education in all groups.

V. That we commend those radio stations, newspapers and magazines which refuse to advertise alcoholic drinks.

VI. That we express our appreciation of the leadership of the Council of Bishops in issuing the "Call to Prayer" for a cessation of the Wave of Drunkenness with all its attending evils and launching of this program of Advance.

The time of Action has come. We sincerely hope that these resolutions will not be forgotten as soon as read and voted on, but that we move forward in our battle for a Christian Social Order wherein shall dwell Righteousness.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF EVANGELISM

That Evangelism may be carried on throughout the Conference during this year, the last of the Quadrennium, we make the following recommendations and suggestions:

1. That we intensify our program of visitation and assimilation by dividing our Local Church Committee on Evangelism or our Local Church Fellowship of Evangelism into three groups, that one-third may be responsible for winning new members for Christ and the Church by visitation, one-third for reclaiming inactive members, and one-third for the assimilation of new members.

2. That we lay the ground work for our Annual Conference to place in the field sufficient special workers to establish and shepherd new church schools and churches.

3. That we pledge our support to the Conference Boards of Education in the emphasis on church school enrollment and attendance.

4. That during this year of Crusade we emphasize the importance of winning the parents of children enrolled in our schools as well as all pupils of the church schools.

5. That our Annual Conference hold a School of Evangelism in each district, and that where possible, this be held in a church where visitation evangelism was not carried out during the year of Evangelism. Visiting pastors and laymen should be in these schools.

6. That a Workshop on Evangelism be held for ministers in our Annual Conference, and that instructions and practical demonstrations be given in visitation, public and educational evangelism.

7. That district and sub-district meetings be held so that laymen of each district may receive instruction in visitation evangelism.

8. That the invitation to Christian Discipleship be given at the close of each preaching service.

9. The community-wide surveys continue to be made annually and kept up-to-date during the year, as far as possible, and that we seek to win each prospect revealed by the survey.

10. That our Conference Board of Evangelism take steps this year to inaugurate the Christian Family Movement by using the District and Sub-District Workshop plan.

11. That our Annual Conference make a planned effort to recruit ministers and other full-time Christian workers.

12. We further recommend the reelection of Rev. H. J. Kirk chairman of the Board and Rev. T. H. Fisher, Jr., Conference Secretary of Evangelism.

BOARD OF EDUCATION

Recommendations

1. That special attention be given to Race Relation Sunday, Methodist Student Day and Church School Rally Day.
2. That Race Relation Sunday funds, total amount as per paragraph 198 of the discipline be sent to our conference treasurer to be sent to the General Board of Education for Claflin College.
3. That Methodist Student Day funds be sent to the conference treasurer to be sent to the General Board of Education for Student Loan Fund as per paragraph 197.
4. That Rally Day be observed and funds sent to the treasurer of the Board of Education as per paragraph 196.
5. That world service Sunday, the fourth Sunday in each month, be observed in the church schools and the funds be used for world service.
6. That our students in high school be encouraged to attend Claflin College; the names and addresses of those in the senior classes be sent to the Executive Secretary.
7. That all District Superintendents submit the names of the district educational staff to the Executive Secretary.
8. Whereas, there has been an overwhelming demand from time to time for scholarships for worthy students from various charges over the conference. Whereas, these requests have reached a proportion beyond which the College is able to absorb. And whereas, we feel that these worthy young people should not be denied an opportunity for a college education. Therefore, be it resolved that each local church be encouraged through its youth organization and church school to raise necessary funds to supplement the expenses of worthy students. This money should be sent directly to the college as a scholarship for the student from that charge. This will encourage the young people of the charge to get an education and also return to the local community and render service.

REPORT OF CONFERENCE DIRECTOR OF CHILDREN'S WORK

The Children's Work of the conference was a grand success with special emphasis on Vacation Bible Schools. Every District responded. From the Beaufort District comes this statement, "The Vacation Bible Schools were of great value to the churches because they encourage the

children to attend the regular church school and also stimulate more interest for Bible study." Mrs. M. E. Norman, District Secretary.

The Florence, Charleston, and Sumter Districts report over one thousand pupils each in attendance on their achievement days. From all Districts come a total report of 5,272 children in Vacation Bible School between June and September 15th.

The District Secretaries have done a great job in getting at least a partial report of the work done in their districts. The student teams under the supervision of Rev. Warren M. Jenkins, Executive Secretary, were at their best in putting over a very good job. They conducted 18 schools.

As a result of the fine work done through the Vacation Bible Schools, the Children's Division of the South Carolina Conference Board of Education is answering the call to increase church school attendance.

REPORT OF CONFERENCE YOUTH WORKER

MISS ELLA M. HUMPHRIES

The emphasis of "Crusade for Christ" was taken by the Youth of the South Carolina Conference and they have worked unceasingly to achieve the desired goal, that of creating a better world and making better people to live in it. We, the Youth have been through the year preparing ourselves for more effective work by attending (1) Christian Workers Schools, (2) Leadership Training Schools, (3) District and Conference Institutes. Literature has been distributed to those who desired it and sent without asking to those who needed it.
