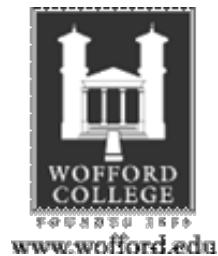

History will come alive at Wofford starting Saturday and continuing for three additional evenings of Chautauqua performances featuring George Washington, Abraham Lincoln, Franklin Roosevelt and Rosa Parks.

Chautauqua: America in Crisis will take place June 20-23 in Leonard Auditorium. The event is free and open to the public. All members of the Wofford community are invited to attend with their families, friends and neighbors. Each performance will begin at 6:30 p.m. with live period-style music in the auditorium.

Chautauqua is an improvisational theatrical program in which costumed scholar-actors portray historical figures. Each performance is broken into three acts. In the first act, the performer represents a historical figure in the first person. In the second, the performer invites audience questions and answers them in character. In the final act, the performer steps out of character to answer questions that the historical figure could not (or would not!) have been able to answer.

Yesterday Clemson University reported that one of their students has contracted the H1N1 virus. Please know that Wofford College is continuing to monitor the local, state and global situation surrounding H1N1 also known as swine flu. The Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) stated South Carolina has seen 120 cases of H1N1, but there have been no deaths in the state from the illness. Some of the cases have been in Spartanburg County.

Health Services would like to remind you that if you have any of the following symptoms report to Health Services immediately:

- Fever over 100
- Cough
- Dizziness
- Nausea or Vomiting

If it is after hours, you may contact the Resident Assistant on call or Campus Safety at 597-4911. Our summer hours are 8:00 a.m. -1:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. On the weekends and in the evenings, Campus Safety or your RA can assist you in seeking out the appropriate care.

### **How does swine flu spread?**

Spread of the swine influenza A (H1N1) virus is thought to spread in the same way as the seasonal flu virus. Flu viruses are spread mainly from person to person through coughing or sneezing by people with influenza. Sometimes a person may become infected by touching a surface or object with flu viruses on it and then touching their mouth or nose.

### **What can you do to help protect yourself?**

- **Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze.** Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it. If you don't have a tissue, cough into your elbow.
- **Wash your hands often with soap and water,** especially after you cough or sneeze. Alcohol-based hands cleaners are also effective. Bottles and dispensers can be found in the classrooms and around campus.
- **Use disinfectants on frequently touched surfaces.** Germs can also be spread when a person touches an infected surface and then touches their own eyes, mouth or nose
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs spread in that manner.
