Born in Laurens, he was the son of the late Horace Walker Gray and Addie Lou Sexton Gray. He was a former employee of Coca-Cola, retired co-owner of Midway Auto Supply, an employee of The Kennedy Mortuary and a driver for Smith Chevrolet Cadillac. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church of Laurens, the Wesley Sunday School Class and the Methodist Men's Club. Mr. Gray was a member of the Sons of the Confederate Veterans, Samuel McGowan Camp #40 and was a member of the Woodmen of the World. He was a retired volunteer fireman with the City of Laurens.

Terrier Tales Reading Program returns; Kick-off Party planned for Tuesday

The Wofford College athletic department and Spartanburg County Public Libraries have teamed up for the 5th straight year to bring children around Spartanburg a special incentive-based reading program - "Terrier Tales." **The SCPL will host a special "Kick-off Party" at the Headquarters Library in downtown Spartanburg on Tuesday, August 24, from 7:00 to 8:00 pm. The event will feature interactive games for the kids and a chance to meet several Wofford football players, light snacks and the opportunity to sign up for the program as well!**

Open to children age Pre-K through 8th grades in Spartanburg County, the program is designed to reward children for reading for enjoyment during the school year. Children who complete the program receive a free ticket to any home Wofford football game and all men's and women's home basketball games through December 31, 2010 (based on ticket availability).

A special promotional poster will be distributed to every elementary and middle school (public and private) in Spartanburg County and over 5,000 bookmarks will be available at all 10 SCPL locations beginning August 25, 2010.

To participate, children pick up a Terrier Tales bookmark at any of the ten SCPL locations. Upon completing five books and writing the titles on the lines provided, the child returns to the branch to have the bookmark validated by a librarian.

The validated bookmark becomes a free ticket to any home Wofford football or men's or women's basketball game between September 1 and December 31, 2010. Parents who accompany their child to a Wofford game also receive a special ticket discount. See the link below to view a Terrier Tales bookmark.

NASHVILLE, TN-- Cody Edgar Richardson, Sr. of Nashville, TN, age 92, passed away Friday, August 27, 2010. Cody was born in Williamson County, TN, the eldest child of Ellis L. and Flara Jones Richardson. His brothers, Elmer, Vernon, Gene, Leonard, and Leo preceded him in death. Cody was also preceded in death by his wife of 53 years, Thelma Elizabeth Brake Richardson.

Survived by his two sons, Cody E, Jr. (Marilyn) of Hendersonville, TN and William Eddie (Dee) of Spartanburg, SC; five grandchildren, Leslie Davis (Brian), Lindsay Walker (Greg), Jonathan "Jack," Anna, and Ellen Richardson; and four great-grandchildren, Jacob and Wyatt Davis and Blake and Amberly Walker; sister, Virginia Smith; brother, Randall Richardson (Fay).

Cody was educated in Nashville city schools and was a graduate of Watkins Institute. An active member of McKendree United Methodist Church for over 60 years, Mr. Richardson taught Sunday School at the Metro Nashville Fire Department Engine Company 13 for over forty years. He was recognized for his service to the Fire Department in recent years by the naming of a fire engine in his honor. Cody was a 32nd degree Scottish Rite member of Claiborne Masonic Lodge 293, and was an eighteen-year member of Gideon's International.
