## **Hatters top Terriers in men's tennis season opener January 21, 2006**

Wofford picked up points in doubles action and in the No. 1 singles match but could not gain any more ground against Stetson Saturday afternoon in falling, 5-2, in the men's tennis season opener for both schools in DeLand, Fla.

The Terriers started by winning two of the three doubles contests to claim the point. At the No. 1 slot, sophomore Andrew Stubbs and senior Chris Barlow combined for an 8-6 victory over Sergei Boulanov and Marcus Echtler. The doubles point fell in Wofford's favor when the No. 3 pairing of juniors Alex Fridzon and Michael Barber defeated Peter Dzuba and Birger Soiland, 9-7.

Three of the six singles matches went the maximum three sets with Stubbs claiming the lone Terrier triumph. He handed Echtler a 2-6, 6-1, 7-5 loss at the No. 1 position.

Other three-set decisions took place in the No. 2 and No. 5 singles matches, which featured Barlow and freshman Scott Collins, respectively. Collins was making his collegiate debut in today's action.

Wofford will continue its season-opening weekend in Florida with a meeting against Embry-Riddle Sunday afternoon in Daytona Beach, Fla.

## **Men's tennis falls to Embry-Riddle Sunday January 22, 2006**

In its second match in as many days, the Wofford men's tennis team fell to Embry-Riddle, 7-0, Sunday afternoon in Daytona Beach, Fla. The Eagles are ranked No. 4 in the NAIA.

The lone match win for the Terriers came at the No. 3 doubles slot where freshman Scott Collins and junior Jeff Muthig registered a 9-8 triumph over Carlos Bes and Konstantin Lazarov.

In singles action, sophomore Andrew Stubbs lost 6-2, 6-2 at the No. 1 position to the top-ranked NAIA singles player Mislav Hizak.

Junior Alex Fridzon fell in three sets at the No. 2 seed to Bes, 4-6, 6-2, 6-4. Classmate Michael Barber also went the distance in his singles contest before losing, 6-1, 4-6, 6-1 to Lazarov in the No. 5 match.

Wofford drops to 0-2 on the young season, while Embry-Riddle improves to 1-0.

## **No. 12 Gamecocks hand loss to Terrier men's tennis January 28, 2006**

The Wofford men's tennis team dropped a 7-0 decision Saturday afternoon against No. 12 South Carolina in Columbia, S.C. The match versus the Gamecocks represented the highest-ranked opponent the Terriers have faced in their history.

Wofford earned the victory in the No. 3 doubles match. Freshman Scott Collins and junior Jeff Muthig paired for an 8-0 win against Joe Veeder and Kazuya Otani.

In singles action, the Terriers lost five of the six matches in straight sets. Collins forced a three-set contest with Adam Adler at the No. 5 position before falling, 5-7, 6-4, 10-7.

USC improves to 2-0 with the win, while Wofford drops to 0-3.

The Terriers will next play Feb. 8 at Gardner-Webb in Boiling Springs, N.C.

## **Wofford men's tennis wins first match of the season February 8, 2006**

A sweep in doubles play followed by wins in four of the six singles matches propelled the Wofford men's tennis team to its first victory in 2006 with a 5-2 victory at Gardner-Webb Wednesday afternoon in Boiling Springs, N.C.

The Terriers captured triumphs in all three doubles contests, including an 8-3 victory at the No. 1 slot by Andrew Stubbs and Chris Barlow over the Bulldogs' Taylor Ferrier and Kern Phillip. In the No. 2 match, Scott Collins and Jeff Muthig handed Gabe Veiga and Roberto Vasques an 8-6 loss.

With an 8-6 win at No. 3 by Michael Barber and Alex Fridzon against Kim Ellis and Brad Clinard, Wofford completed the sweep.

In singles action, Stubbs knocked off Vasques at the No. 1 seed, 7-5, 6-0, while Barlow also captured a straight-set Terrier victory with a 6-1, 6-2 decision over Ferrier at the No. 2 slot.

Collins posted a 6-3, 7-6 triumph versus Clinard at the No. 4 position and Richard Cahi garnered a 7-5, 6-1 win against Ellis during the No. 5 match.

The other two matches went to three sets with Fridzon dropping a 6-1, 5-7, 12-10 contest to Veiga at the No. 3 slot. Jeff Muthig also went the distance with Phillip during the No. 6 match before falling 0-6, 6-2, 6-2.

Wofford improves to 1-3, while Gardner-Webb drops to 0-5.

At 2 p.m. Saturday, the Terriers will return home to the Reeves Center to face Mercer.

Sophomore Richard CahI rallied to win his match at the No. 5 singles position, which proved to be the clincher, as the Wofford men's tennis team topped High Point, 4-3, Saturday afternoon at the Reeves Center in Spartanburg, S.C.

**Stubbs tabbed SoCon Player of the Week  
February 21, 2006**


Sophomore Andrew Stubbs of the Wofford men's tennis team was named the Southern Conference men's tennis player of the week it was announced today by the league office.

Stubbs posted a 2-0 record on the week with wins over opponents from Mercer and High Point while playing at the No. 1 position. He started the week with a 6-2, 6-1 victory over Warren Woolfolk of Mercer. He then tallied a 7-5, 3-6, 6-4 triumph against High Point's Mike Tolman for his third-straight win.

The 2005 All-Southern Conference selection has registered a 4-2 mark thus far this spring. The four wins in singles action are a team best.

The Wofford men's tennis team was victorious in five of the six singles matches Friday afternoon on its way to claiming a 5-2 triumph over Appalachian State in Southern Conference action at the Reeves Center in Spartanburg, S.C. The Mountaineers had won the doubles point and also garnered one singles win in the contest.
