Wofford wins twice in singles but falls at Charlotte

March 17, 2006

Senior Chris Barlow won his third-straight singles match of the week despite the Wofford men's tennis team dropping a 5-2 decision at Charlotte Friday afternoon in non-conference action.

Barlow knocked off Ryan Johnson 0-6, 6-1, 6-1 at the No. 2 singles slot for his eighth win of the season, tying sophomore Andrew Stubbs for the team lead.

Junior Alex Fridzon posted the other Terrier point on the afternoon, as he topped Dorian Host 6-4, 3-6, 6-1 at the No. 3 position.

Stubbs won the first set before falling to No. 83-ranked Roy Sichel during the No. 1 contest, 4-6, 6-3, 6-2.

The doubles pair of Barlow and Stubbs was victorious in their No. 1 doubles match, earning an 8-3 triumph versus Host and Sichel.

Wofford drops to 6-7 with the loss, while the 49ers improve to 7-9.

After playing their last five matches on the road, the Terriers will return home for a 2 p.m. Monday contest against Southern Conference foe Elon at the Reeves Tennis Center. Local radio station ESPN 1400 AM will do a live remote broadcast of its "Open-Mic" show from 3-6 p.m. at the match.

Terrier men fall to nationally-ranked Paladins March 22, 2006

The Wofford men's tennis team fell 7-0 to No. 67 Furman Wednesday afternoon at the Mickel Tennis Center in Greenville, S.C. The meeting against the Paladins was the second against a nationally-ranked opponent this season, following a Jan. 28 match at then No. 12 South Carolina, and the sixth-straight road contest for the Terriers.

Furman claimed victories in all nine matches for the win. In doubles action, Wofford lost at the No. 1 and No. 3 positions by identical 8-6 scores. Senior Chris Barlow and sophomore Andrew Stubbs lost 8-6 during the No. 1 contest to Greg Maarschalk and Ben Pauluhn, while junior Jeff Muthig and freshman Scott Collins also were defeated 8-6 by Andy Juc and Scott Kahler at the No. 3 seed.

The six singles matches were decided in straight sets, with junior Alex Fridzon forcing a tiebreaker in the second set before falling 6-3, 7-6 against Maarschalk at the No. 3 position.

The Paladins improve to 9-9 overall and 1-0 in the Southern Conference with the victory, while the Terriers drop to 6-8 overall and 3-3 in league play.

Wofford will return to the Reeves Tennis Center for its next match, a rescheduled date with Elon slated for 2 p.m. Tuesday.

Elon tops Wofford in men's tennis action March 28, 2006

A doubles sweep and wins in the top four singles positions sparked a 5-2 victory by visiting Elon over Wofford Tuesday afternoon in Southern Conference men's tennis action at the Reeves Tennis Center in Spartanburg, S.C. The contest was rescheduled from the original date of March 20.

The Phoenix took control of the match early by winning all three doubles contests. Juniors Michael Barber and Alex Fridzon provided the Terriers with their closest score, a 9-7 loss at the No. 2 slot to Sebastian Bredberg and Kevin Colin.

Wofford's two points came in singles action, as freshman Scott Collins and junior Jeff Muthig captured victories. Collins rallied to earn a 0-6, 6-3, 6-4 triumph at the No. 5 position versus Austin Feen. Muthig registered a 6-3, 6-3 decision against Colin during the No. 6 match in his first singles action since March 8 at Winthrop.

Elon's Damon Gooch topped the Terriers' Andrew Stubbs in a hard-fought No. 1 singles meeting, 4-6, 6-3, 6-4.

The loss drops Wofford's record to 6-9 overall and 3-4 in Southern Conference play. The Phoenix improve to 11-4 overall and 5-1 in league competition.

A pair of matches Saturday is next on the docket for the Terriers, as they will battle Campbell at 11 a.m. and then Belmont at 3 p.m. before heading to California next week over spring break.

Wofford tennis teams to play at home Saturday March 31, 2006

The Wofford men's and women's tennis teams will host a combined three matches, including two men's and one women's, Saturday at the Reeves Tennis Center starting at 11 a.m.

Both teams will face Campbell in the early start and then the men's squad will battle Belmont later in the day at 3 p.m. All three contests will be both teams' last before heading to California Sunday for a pair of matches each over spring break.

Head coach Rod Ray commented on the men's team, which enters the contests with a 6-9 record: "As we head into spring break, I must say the players are ready for a break from school. Thus far, they have done a great job balancing academics and athletics, but a week off will do them some good.

Saturday we play two good teams in Campbell and Belmont and both matches will be close. We are excited about the opportunity to play a doubleheader because we still need more match play in most of our positions. The guys will rise to the occasion and make the most out of the day."

Leading the men's team are the top-two singles players, No. 1 sophomore Andrew Stubbs and No. 2 senior Chris Barlow. The pair have posted eight singles victories each and have combined for six doubles wins at the No. 1 slot.


Juniors Michael Barber and Alex Fridzon, the Terriers' No. 2 doubles pair, has posted a team-best eight triumphs.

Ray also had remarks concerning the women's squad, which enters its match with an 11-7 mark: "We are looking forward to playing Campbell. We have not played in recent years, but we know that it has a good team. We anticipate a close match.

Right now, our team is doing great. They are playing hard and we are continuing to improve. The team is excited about its upcoming trip to the West Coast, so a challenge will be for us to focus on playing well against Campbell on the first day of spring break. We play four matches over the break, and it is important for us to keep our focus on the match in front of us. I think we can do it, but it will not be without challenges."

A trio of women's players, including seniors Tara Hartness and Ellen Rogers and sophomore Adriane Hodges have reached the double-digit singles win plateau. Rogers and Hodges each have 11 victories, while Hartness has tallied 10.

Hartness and Rogers have also collected a team-high 11 doubles triumphs while playing at the No. 1 position.

Collins puts Wofford past Campbell in men's tennis action April 1, 2006

Four singles wins, including the clincher at No. 5 singles by freshman Scott Collins, capped a 4-3 Wofford men's tennis victory Saturday afternoon over visiting Campbell at the Reeves Tennis Center in Spartanburg, S.C.

With the Terriers ahead 3-2 and needing a point during either Collins' match or junior Jeff Muthig's contest at No. 6 singles, Collins pulled through for the victory. The rookie was on top 4-2 in the third set before finding himself down 40-15 in game seven. He rallied to win that game to go up 5-2, before finding himself in the same situation the very next game. Once again, Collins came-from-behind after trailing 40-15 and capped a 6-3, 5-7, 6-2 triumph against Artoym Starkov at the No. 5 slot for the clinching point in the match.

The other three Wofford singles victories were all in straight sets, including a 7-5, 6-2 decision by Andrew Stubbs vs. Florent Wilpotte at the No. 1 position for his team-best tying ninth triumph of the season. Senior Chris Barlow is keeping even with Stubbs following his 6-1, 6-2 victory at the No. 2 seed against Vasja Gorjup.

Sophomore Richard Cahil tallied a 6-1, 6-4 win at the No. 4 slot against Carlos Campo for the final Terrier singles victory.

The Fighting Camels earned the doubles point, but Wofford received a win at the No. 3 doubles position from Collins and Muthig. The tandem registered an 8-5 triumph over Starkov and Marc Sifre in the match.

The Terriers improve their record to 7-9 with the victory, while Campbell drops to 8-10 overall.

Wofford will head to California this week over spring break for a pair of matches, beginning with a 4:30 p.m. (EST) Tuesday meeting against Azusa Pacific in Azusa, Calif. The Terriers will also face Loyola Marymount in Los Angeles at 4:30 p.m. (EST) Wednesday.

Campbell returns to action at 1 p.m. Monday at home vs. South Carolina State.

Terrier men's tennis caps doubleheader action with victory April 1, 2006

The Wofford men's tennis team earned its second 4-3 victory of the day Saturday as it knocked off Belmont in non-conference action at the Reeves Tennis Center in Spartanburg, S.C. The Terriers also posted a 4-3 decision vs. Campbell in earlier action.

"Today was a good day for us," said head coach Rod Ray. "To win two 4-3 matches on the hottest day of the year was a good effort. Our guys did what we asked them to do and had a great team effort. Certainly, we improved today, which will help us as we head down the stretch. I am proud of our effort."

Against Belmont, Wofford posted wins in three singles contests after earning the doubles point. Senior Chris Barlow and sophomore Andrew Stubbs tallied an 8-5 win at the No. 1 doubles slot against Fausto Rocha and Javier Rodriguez.

Juniors Michael Barber and Alex Fridzon also garnered a doubles win, at the No. 2 position, with a hard-fought 9-8 triumph over Iguacio Gesto and Felipe Lima.

Stubbs and Barlow were also victorious in singles play, tallying their team-leading 10th singles wins each. Stubbs earned a 6-3, 4-6, 10-6 victory against Lima at the No. 1 position, while Barlow posted a 6-2, 3-6, 10-5 triumph over Rocha during the No. 2 contest. Barlow has now reached the double-digit win plateau in three of his four seasons with the Terriers.

Barber registered Wofford's other singles victory, a 6-1, 6-1 effort against Marshall Lipman at the No. 6 seed. Sophomore Richard Cahí fought hard in his singles match before falling 6-2, 4-6, 10-6 at the No. 4 slot to Gesto.

The Terriers improve to 8-9 with the triumph, while the Bruins fall to 3-7. Wofford will return to action at 4:30 p.m. (EST) Tuesday when it travels to California to face Azusa Pacific in Azusa, Calif. The Terriers will also play at 4:30 p.m. (EST) Wednesday at Loyola Marymount in Los Angeles on the spring break road trip to the West Coast.

The Wofford men's tennis team could not garner any additional scoring after earning the doubles point Wednesday afternoon in falling to Loyola Marymount, 6-1, in Los Angeles as part of the Terriers' spring break trip to California. Wofford was also slated to face Azusa Pacific on the trip Tuesday, but the match was cancelled due to rain.

Against the Lions, the Terriers posted wins at the No. 1 and No. 3 doubles positions to garner the point. Senior Chris Barlow and sophomore Andrew Stubbs registered an 8-6 triumph at the No. 1 slot against Linas Cicenias and Mike Wojnarowicz. Terriers top Cougars behind three-set victory by Fridzon April 10, 2006

A three-set victory by Alex Fridzon was the deciding point for the Wofford men's tennis team in its 4-3 triumph over Southern Conference co-leader College of Charleston Monday afternoon at the Reeves Tennis Center in Spartanburg, S.C.

The Terriers evened the contest at 3-3 when senior Chris Barlow registered a 6-3, 6-2 win at the No. 2 singles slot against Marcus DiGliodo. Barlow, who was playing in his final home match and was recognized prior to the contest as part of Senior Day activities, improved his league record to 6-2 and overall mark to 11-7, setting a career best for victories.

Fridzon then tallied the clinching point with a 7-6, 2-6, 6-4 triumph over Justin Malina at the No. 3 position. Fridzon trailed in the final set and overcame cramps to his forearms and legs to gut out the victory.

Wofford received its third singles win, a 6-4, 6-0 decision, by freshman Scott Collins vs. Mike Reynolds at the No. 5 seed.

The Terriers also posted victories in two of the three doubles contests to earn the doubles point. At the No. 1 slot, Barlow and sophomore Andrew Stubbs garnered an 8-5 triumph against DiGliodo and Or Dekel, the SoCon's top doubles tandem.

Collins paired with junior Jeff Muthig for an 8-4 win over Reynolds and Ashok Ramachandra during the No. 3 doubles match.

"After the doubles matches were over, we met and knew it would take a courageous effort to win today," said head coach Rod Ray. "And, that is exactly what happened.

"We had a solid effort overall as this was a total team effort. Five different guys contributed wins, including some great victories in singles action by Chris, Alex and Scott. Our doubles teams also played very well."

Wofford, winners in three of its last four outings, improves its overall mark to 9-10 and evens the SoCon slate at 4-4. Charleston drops to 16-5, 7-2 in the league.

A 10 a.m. Saturday meeting with Georgia Southern in Statesboro, Ga., will close the regular season for the Terriers before they head to Charleston, S.C., April 20-23 for the Southern Conference Tournament.

The Wofford men's and women's tennis teams have concluded their respective regular seasons and are in preparations for the upcoming Southern Conference Tournaments, slated to begin Thursday in Charleston, S.C.

Because of their league records, men (5-4) and women (6-3), both teams have secured opening-round byes and will start competition Friday.

The men's team is the No. 5 seed and will face No. 4 seed Chattanooga at 10 a.m. Friday, while the women play at the same time as the No. 4 seed against No. 5 seed Appalachian State.

The men's team enters the league tournament winners in four of their last five matches to end the regular season with a 10-10 overall mark. The five Southern Conference victories are a program-high tying total, matching the effort from the 2005 squad.


Senior Chris Barlow paces the Terriers with a career-high 12 singles wins, one ahead of sophomore Andrew Stubbs. Stubbs, along with classmate Richard Cahi, also reached career-high singles win tallies.

Barlow and Stubbs formed the top doubles team with 10 triumphs, while the other top two Wofford doubles tandems registered nine wins apiece.

On the women's side, senior Ellen Rogers and sophomore Adriane Hodges have collected 15 singles victories each. Both totals are career highs and lead a group of five Terriers with double-digit wins.


Rogers paired with fellow senior Tara Hartness to give the Terriers a team-high 13 doubles triumphs.

The Wofford women have tallied a Division I program-best 13 wins on the campaign as part of their 13-10 overall mark. The team captured a Division I program-high five-match winning streak from Feb. 8 to March 4 and later won four-straight matches, including three straight in league action.

Two Wofford men's tennis players, sophomore Andrew Stubbs and senior Chris Barlow, garnered All-Southern Conference accolades it was announced at the league's tournament banquet Thursday night in Charleston, S.C., as the teams are preparing for the SoCon Tournament.

Stubbs received his second-straight first-team singles nod after an 11-8 overall and 5-4 SoCon season. The 11 triumphs are a career high, while he matched his previous career-best effort in league action.

He also earned his second career SoCon Player of the Week honor for the week of Feb. 21 after defeating his opponents that week from Mercer and High Point.

The Wofford men's tennis team won the doubles point but could not hold on before falling 4-2 to No. 4 seed Chattanooga in the quarterfinal round of the Southern Conference Tournament in Charleston, S.C. The Terriers were seeded fifth and won the doubles point against the Mocs.

Juniors Michael Barber and Alex Fridzon tallied an 8-6 victory at the No. 2 position against Ryan Fitzgerald and Michael Hangstefer.

Classmate Jeff Muthig and freshman Scott Collins matched their efforts with an identical 8-6 triumph at the No. 3 slot over Badr Bouabdellah and Artyom Vlasenko.

Each doubles pair registered its respective 10th win of the season giving Wofford double-digit victories by its top-three doubles tandems.
