Terrier women drop non-conference tennis match to Charlotte March 16, 2006

The Wofford women's tennis team dropped a non-conference match to visiting Charlotte 6-1 Thursday afternoon despite forcing the maximum three sets in four of the six singles matches and winning at the No. 5 singles slot and No. 2 doubles position.

The 49ers captured the doubles point by winning at the No. 1 and No. 3 seeds. The No. 3 contest came down to a tiebreaker, which the Terriers' Lauren Prickett and Cayley Wetzig lost a hard-fought 9-8 decision to Kathy Robey and Yana Stoeva.

Wofford was victorious at the No. 2 doubles slot, as Adriane Hodges and Ashley Page knocked off Koren Fleming and Ali Piacente, 8-3.

The Terriers garnered their lone point in the match at the No. 5 singles position, as Hodges tallied a 6-3, 6-2 victory over Michelle Alexander.

Singles matches at the No. 1, No. 2, No. 3 and No. 6 seeds all went to three sets. Charlotte rallied in each of the four contests to claim the victories after Wofford claimed the first-set wins.

The Terriers dropped to 7-6 with the loss, while the 49ers improve to 5-3.

Wofford will continue its season at Chattanooga in its second Southern Conference match of the season at 11 a.m. Saturday.

Rogers registers huge win to pace Wofford women's tennis March 18, 2006

Senior Ellen Rogers pulled off one of the largest victories of her career at the No. 1 singles position to help the Wofford women's tennis team earn a 6-1 Southern Conference win at Chattanooga Saturday afternoon.

Rogers, who returned to Chattanooga to play in her hometown for the final time as a Terrier, knocked off the Lady Mocs' top player, Anastasia Zhukova, 7-5, 1-6, 10-5. Zhukova was previously ranked No. 100 by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association and had held a 12-0 record, including not losing a set, this season before meeting Wofford's three-time All-SoCon selection.

The senior's performance was one of five singles wins for the Terriers. Freshman Cayley Wetzig posted a 6-0, 6-1 triumph at the No. 3 slot over Talita Bragato, while classmate Ashley Page garnered a 6-1, 6-3 victory against Maureen Parris at the No. 4 seed.

Sophomores Adriane Hodges and Lauren Prickett also posted wins on the afternoon. Hodges won her No. 5 contest versus Bonnie Adams, 6-4, 6-0 and Prickett registered a 6-4, 6-4 triumph over Emily Harpe at the No. 6 slot. The victory for Hodges was her team-best ninth of the season, one ahead of Rogers and senior Tara Hartness.

Hartness played the maximum three sets before dropping a 1-6, 6-4, 10-8 decision to Lindsey Ballard in the No. 2 match.

In doubles play, Wofford received victories in the No. 2 and No. 3 contests. Hodges and Page posted an 8-5 triumph against Beata Knizat and Harpe during the No. 2 match, while Prickett and Wetzig tallied a 9-7 win versus Adams and Parris at the No. 3 position.

The No. 1 doubles contest also went to the tiebreaker, as Chattanooga's Ballard and Zhukova pulled out a 9-7 triumph versus Hartness and Rogers.

The Terriers improve to 8-6 overall and 2-0 in the Southern Conference with the victory, while the Lady Mocs drop to 5-8 overall and 0-3 in league play.

Wofford will return home for a 2 p.m. Monday meeting with league foe Elon at the Reeves Tennis Center. Local radio station ESPN 1400 AM will do a live remote broadcast of its "Open-Mic" show from 3-6 p.m. at the match.

Wofford women's tennis falls at Furman March 23, 2006

The Wofford women's tennis team was defeated 7-0 at Furman Thursday afternoon at the Mickel Tennis Center in Greenville, S.C., in Southern Conference action.

The host Lady Paladins won all three doubles matches and each of the six singles contests for the victory.

The Terriers closest doubles score was an 8-4 loss at the No. 2 slot by sophomore Adriane Hodges and freshman Ashley Page against Jacqueline Eckert and Lauren Osborne.

Hodges also provided the team with its strongest effort in singles play, losing in three sets 4-6, 6-1, 10-7 to Bonnie Baird at the No. 5 position. Hodges was in search of her 10th win of the season.

Furman improves to 8-6 overall and 3-0 in league play with the triumph, while Wofford drops to 8-7 overall and 2-1 in SoCon action.

After playing their last two matches on the road, the Terriers will return home to the Reeves Tennis Center for a pair of league contests this weekend. Wofford will host Appalachian State at 1 p.m. Saturday and then welcome Georgia Southern to Spartanburg for a Noon Sunday affair.

Bottom half of lineup pushes Wofford over Appalachian March 25, 2006

Wins from the bottom three positions coupled with a thrilling triumph at the No. 1 slot in singles play were enough to give the Wofford women's tennis team a 4-3 Southern Conference victory over Appalachian State Saturday afternoon at the Reeves Tennis Center in Spartanburg, S.C.

The Mountaineers claimed an early 1-0 lead in the contest by winning the doubles point. The Terriers were able to garner an 8-2 triumph at the No. 1 doubles seed as seniors Tara Hartness and Ellen Rogers posted the win against Frances Blanton and Monica Thomas.

Rogers also earned a victory in singles action, coming from behind to defeat Anja Gugger 5-7, 6-1, 6-2 during the No. 1 match. The win was the ninth of the season for the current TIAA-CREF SoCon Student-Athlete of the Week and also was the clinching contest.

Wofford then picked up triumphs at the No. 4, No. 5 and No. 6 singles slots to clinch the victory. Freshman Ashley Page posted a 6-1, 6-1 decision against Salem Kirven at the No. 4 seed.

Sophomore Adriane Hodges tallied a 6-1, 6-4 win at the No. 5 position for her career-best and team-leading 10th victory of the campaign. She is the first Terrier, men's or women's, to garner double-digit wins this season.

Classmate Lauren Prickett registered a 6-3, 6-3 triumph versus Blanton during the No. 6 contest as she add to her career-best six victories.

With the win, the Terriers snap Appalachian State's five-match winning streak and improve their record to 9-7 overall and 3-1 in SoCon action. The Mountaineers drop to 9-3 overall and 3-1 in league play.

A weekend of home matches will conclude at Noon Sunday when Wofford hosts Georgia Southern at the Reeves Tennis Center.

Rogers guts out victory for second-straight day as Wofford wins March 26, 2006

Senior co-captain Ellen Rogers pulled through for the second-straight match for Wofford as the Terrier women's tennis slipped past Georgia Southern, 4-3, Sunday afternoon in Southern Conference action at the Reeves Tennis Center in Spartanburg, S.C.

Rogers, the reigning TIAA-CREF SoCon Student-Athlete of the Week, won her singles match at the No. 1 position 3-6, 6-2, 7-6 against Szilvia Zsakay in what was the deciding contest for the second-straight day. Rogers defeated her opponent from Appalachian State Saturday in the clincher, also in three sets.

The victory is Rogers' 10th of the season, tying her with sophomore Adriane Hodges for the team lead. The three-time All-Southern Conference honoree has now reached the double-digit win plateau in each of her four seasons.

Classmate and co-captain Tara Hartness garnered a 6-3, 6-4 triumph at the No. 2 slot versus Molly Maddox, while freshman Cayley Wetzig captured Wofford's other singles win with a 6-4, 6-2 victory over Lauren Wolken at the No. 3 seed.

The Terriers tallied the doubles point via wins at the No. 1 and No. 3 contests. Hartness and Rogers posted an 8-5 triumph at the No. 1 match versus Maddox and Wolken. Wetzig paired with sophomore Lauren Prickett during the No. 3 contest and the duo topped Jessica Matlosz and Kimberly Wollett, 8-4.

Wofford improves its overall record to 10-7 and Southern Conference mark to 4-1 with the victory, while the Lady Eagles drop to 4-11 overall and 1-4 in the league. The Terriers have won at least 10 matches for the fifth time in six seasons under head coach Rod Ray.

A trip to Cullowhee, N.C., for a meeting with Western Carolina at 2:30 p.m. Wednesday is next on the docket for Wofford.

Terrier women's tennis garners road win at Western Carolina March 30, 2006

The Wofford women's tennis team garnered its third-straight victory, all in Southern Conference action, with a 7-0 decision at Western Carolina Wednesday afternoon in Cullowhee, N.C. The Terriers claimed wins in each of the two doubles and five singles matches that were contested.

Seniors Tara Hartness and Ellen Rogers won their third-straight league contest at the No. 1 doubles slot, knocking off the Lady Catamounts' Trish Hanson and Mariona Trilla Jane, 8-2.

Sophomore Adriane Hodges and freshman Ashley Page paired for an 8-0 triumph at the No. 2 seed, handing Susanna Sjkqvist and Holly Stocks the loss.

The No. 3 doubles match was not contested.

In singles action, Rogers improved her SoCon ledger to 5-1 with a 7-5, 6-0 win vs. Hanson at the No. 1 position in what was the final contest to finish. The three-time all-league performer improved her overall record to 11-6 with the victory.

Hartness also was victorious, with a 6-4, 6-2 triumph against Sjkqvist at the No. 2 slot. Freshman Cayley Wetzig tallied a 6-3, 6-3 win over Jane during the No. 3 singles meeting, while classmate Page earned a 6-0, 6-0 decision playing against Stocks.

With no contest being played at the No. 6 position, sophomore Adriane Hodges posted a 6-0, 6-0 win at the No. 5 slot vs. Carley Abbott to keep pace with Rogers for the team lead with 11 singles victories on the campaign.

Wofford improves to 11-7 overall and 5-1 in the Southern Conference with the triumph, while Western Carolina falls to 3-14 overall and 0-6 in the league.

The Terriers will return home to face Campbell at 11 a.m. Saturday before heading to California for a pair of matches next week over spring break.

Wofford tennis teams to play at home Saturday March 31, 2006

The Wofford men's and women's tennis teams will host a combined three matches, including two men's and one women's, Saturday at the Reeves Tennis Center starting at 11 a.m.

Both teams will face Campbell in the early start and then the men's squad will battle Belmont later in the day at 3 p.m. All three contests will be both teams' last before heading to California Sunday for a pair of matches each over spring break.

Head coach Rod Ray commented on the men's team, which enters the contests with a 6-9 record: "As we head into spring break, I must say the players are ready for a break from school. Thus far, they have done a great job balancing academics and athletics, but a week off will do them some good.

Saturday we play two good teams in Campbell and Belmont and both matches will be close. We are excited about the opportunity to play a doubleheader because we still need more match play in most of our positions. The guys will rise to the occasion and make the most out of the day."

Leading the men's team are the top-two singles players, No. 1 sophomore Andrew Stubbs and No. 2 senior Chris Barlow. The pair have posted eight singles victories each and have combined for six doubles wins at the No. 1 slot.


Juniors Michael Barber and Alex Fridzon, the Terriers' No. 2 doubles pair, has posted a team-best eight triumphs.


Ray also had remarks concerning the women's squad, which enters its match with an 11-7 mark: "We are looking forward to playing Campbell. We have not played in recent years, but we know that it has a good team. We anticipate a close match.

Right now, our team is doing great. They are playing hard and we are continuing to improve. The team is excited about its upcoming trip to the West Coast, so a challenge will be for us to focus on playing well against Campbell on the first day of spring break. We play four matches over the break, and it is important for us to keep our focus on the match in front of us. I think we can do it, but it will not be without challenges."

A trio of women's players, including seniors Tara Hartness and Ellen Rogers and sophomore Adriane Hodges have reached the double-digit singles win plateau. Rogers and Hodges each have 11 victories, while Hartness has tallied 10.

Hartness and Rogers have also collected a team-high 11 doubles triumphs while playing at the No. 1 position.

Freshman Ashley Page rallied at the No. 4 singles position for a win to clinch a 4-3 triumph by the Wofford women's tennis team against visiting Campbell Saturday afternoon at the Reeves Tennis Center in Spartanburg, S.C.

Page, who dropped the first set, won the next two sets and held serve in the third frame to garner a 5-7, 7-6, 6-3 victory vs. Liza Bensimon. The win proved to be the clinching point, as the match was tied 3-3 with the decision pending in the contest.

Senior Ellen Rogers also picked up a singles triumph for the Terriers, recording a 6-1, 6-2 victory over Scarlet Alfonzo at the No. 1 slot.

The Wofford women's tennis team, in California on spring break, lost 5-2 at Cal State-Northridge Wednesday afternoon in its lone match of the trip in Northridge, Calif. The Terriers were slated to face Azusa Pacific Tuesday, but the contest was cancelled due to rain.

Senior Ellen Rogers matched her career-best total for victories and the Wofford women's tennis team garnered two more wins in singles action but dropped a hard-fought 4-3 loss to College of Charleston Saturday afternoon at the Reeves Tennis Center in Spartanburg, S.C.

Rogers tallied a 6-1, 6-2 triumph over Maxine Capewell at the No. 1 position to equal her sophomore season's effort of 14 wins. The victory also improved Rogers' SoCon record to 6-1, giving her at least six league wins in each of her four seasons with the Terriers.

Rogers nets career high as Wofford wins regular-season finale April 12, 2006

Senior Ellen Rogers tallied her career-best 15th singles victory of the campaign in Wofford's 6-1 triumph over Elon Wednesday afternoon at the Reeves Tennis Center in the Terriers' regular-season finale.

Rogers, who was playing in her final home match, used a three-set tiebreaker to knock off Kelly Fleck at the No. 1 singles slot, 6-7, 6-1, 10-6. The three-time All-Southern Conference selection and March 22 TIAA-CREF SoCon Student-Athlete of the Week eclipsed her previous career high for wins of 14, set during her sophomore campaign in 2003, with the triumph.

Freshman Cayley Wetzig became the fifth Wofford player this season to reach the double-digit win plateau with a 6-1, 6-0 victory against Melissa Holland at the No. 3 position. Her 10th singles win also pushed her final league ledger to above .500 at 5-4.

Sophomore Adriane Hodges kept pace with Rogers for the overall team lead in victories with 15, as she handed Whitney Butcher a 6-1, 6-2 defeat at the No. 4 seed. She also finished the league season with six wins, one shy of Rogers' team-best seven.

Freshman Ashley Page tallied a 6-0, 6-1 triumph at the No. 5 position vs. Alli Benton to also record an above-.500 mark in league action at 5-4.

Rounding out the Terrier singles wins was a 6-0, 6-1 victory at the No. 6 slot by sophomore Lauren Prickett over Katie Nicholson.

Senior Tara Hartness, who also was playing in her final Reeves Tennis Center contest, battled hard at the No. 2 position before falling 3-6, 6-3, 10-12 to Elizabeth Kernodle.

The two seniors, Hartness and Rogers, helped lead a Wofford sweep in doubles action with an 8-2 triumph at the No. 1 slot vs. Butcher and Kernodle. It was the pairs' team-leading 13th victory of the season.

Hodges and Page registered a 9-7 win against Fleck and Holland at the No. 2 seed, while the Terriers' Prickett and Wetzig posted an 8-6 triumph over Benton and Nicholson during the No. 3 match.

Wofford ends its regular season with a 13-10 overall record, including a 6-3 mark in SoCon play. Elon drops to 7-12 overall and 2-7 in the league.

The Terriers will await to find out their final seeding and opponent for the upcoming Southern Conference Tournament, slated for April 20-23 in Charleston, S.C.

The Wofford men's and women's tennis teams have concluded their respective regular seasons and are in preparations for the upcoming Southern Conference Tournaments, slated to begin Thursday in Charleston, S.C.

Because of their league records, men (5-4) and women (6-3), both teams have secured opening-round byes and will start competition Friday.

The men's team is the No. 5 seed and will face No. 4 seed Chattanooga at 10 a.m. Friday, while the women play at the same time as the No. 4 seed against No. 5 seed Appalachian State.

The men's team enters the league tournament winners in four of their last five matches to end the regular season with a 10-10 overall mark. The five Southern Conference victories are a program-high tying total, matching the effort from the 2005 squad.


Senior Chris Barlow paces the Terriers with a career-high 12 singles wins, one ahead of sophomore Andrew Stubbs. Stubbs, along with classmate Richard Cahi, also reached career-high singles win tallies.

Barlow and Stubbs formed the top doubles team with 10 triumphs, while the other top two Wofford doubles tandems registered nine wins apiece.

On the women's side, senior Ellen Rogers and sophomore Adriane Hodges have collected 15 singles victories each. Both totals are career highs and lead a group of five Terriers with double-digit wins.


Rogers paired with fellow senior Tara Hartness to give the Terriers a team-high 13 doubles triumphs.

The Wofford women have tallied a Division I program-best 13 wins on the campaign as part of their 13-10 overall mark. The team captured a Division I program-high five-match winning streak from Feb. 8 to March 4 and later won four-straight matches, including three straight in league action.

**Rogers becomes first four-time All-SoCon honoree
April 20, 2006**

Wofford senior women's tennis player Ellen Rogers was named to the All-Southern Conference first team singles squad it was announced by the league at the tournament banquet Thursday night in Charleston, S.C. She becomes the first Terrier tennis player, men's or women's, to earn all-league honors four times.

Rogers concluded the regular season with a 15-7 record, matching sophomore Adriane Hodges for the team lead in victories. The 15 wins are a career-high for Rogers, while she also finished within one victory of her career-best effort for a SoCon mark with a 7-2 ledger.

When she returned to her hometown for the final time March 18, she knocked off previously undefeated, nationally ranked and eventual SoCon Player of the Year Anatasia Zhukova of Chattanooga. The three-set victory marked the first set losses by Zhukova on the year and was her only defeat on the campaign.

Rogers was named the March 22 TIAA-CREF SoCon Student-Athlete of the Week for her efforts. She also has helped guide the Wofford program to a Division I-best 13 triumphs this season, including a 6-3 mark against Southern Conference foes.

The Lookout Mountain, Ga., native has garnered all-conference singles accolades in each of the past three seasons after being named all-league for doubles as a freshman. Her honor marks the fifth-straight season in which a Terrier has been tabbed All-Southern Conference.

Wofford begins play at 10 a.m. Friday in the quarterfinal round of the Southern Conference Tournament after receiving a first-round bye. Wofford, the No. 4 seed, will face No. 5 seed Appalachian State in the first matchup.
