## Men's Basketball Wins 91-77 Over The Citadel

CULLOWHEE, N.C. – The Wofford College men's basketball team picked up a 91-77 win over The Citadel on Saturday night at Benjamin Johnson Arena. The Terriers had six players score in double figures, including seniors Drew Gibson with 20 and Shane Nichols with eleven on senior night.

Wofford is 15-15 overall and 8-12 in SoCon play. The Citadel is 6-23 overall and 1-19 in conference play. The Terriers were led with double-doubles by Drew Gibson with 20 points and twelve assists and Noah Dahlman with 17 points and 14 rebounds. The Citadel was led by Cameron Wells with 28 points and Zach Urbanus with 23 points. Wells added eight boards to lead the Bulldogs.

The Bulldogs took an early 4-0 lead, but a three-pointer by Drew Gibson started a 13-0 run for the Terriers to go up 13-4 at 15:03. After a basket by Cameron Wells to cut the lead to 16-8, Matt Estep hit back-to-back three pointer. Cameron Wells scored a layup, but Matt Estep answered with his third three to give Wofford a 25-10 lead at 11:21.

Wofford built a 17-point lead at 8:39 with a three-pointer by Shane Nichols. The Terriers were able to hold the advantage at 17 when Matt Estep hit two free throws at 4:42 for a 37-20 lead. The Bulldogs chipped away and at the half the Terriers had a 43-30 lead.

In the second half, the Bulldogs started strong and cut the lead to ten points at 45-35 after a three-pointer by Zach Urbanus at 18:34. The Terriers were able to add to the lead over the next three minutes and took a 55-39 lead after back-to-back baskets by Tim Johnson.

After a bucket and the free throw at 10:44 by Drew Gibson, the Terriers had their largest lead of the night at 69-51. The Citadel fought back and put together a 13-5 run over three minutes to cut the lead to ten at 74-64. Wofford then scored the next six points to nush the

lead back to 80-64 with 6:03 on the clock. Over the last five minutes of play, the Terriers were able to keep the lead and won 91-77.

Wofford shot 55.2% from the floor and 44.4% from three. The Terriers were 79.2% from the line. The Bulldogs were 49.2% from the floor and 45.0% from behind the arc and 66.7% from the free throw line. Wofford had a 39-26 lead on the boards.

Wofford was without Terry Martin due to injury. For The Citadel, Matt Clark fouled out. The last time Wofford had six players score in double-figures was on February 19, 2003 against Toccoa Falls. The double-double by Drew Gibson was his third this season, while Noah Dahلمان also had his third of the year. Matt Estep scored 13 points, ending a seven-game scoring drought. The 91 points scored by Wofford were the most this season in a game. The Terriers next game will be in the Southern Conference Tournament, which begins on March 7 in Charleston. Wofford will be the eight-seed and will play either Furman or Western Carolina based on the results of Monday night's WCU and UNC Greensboro game. Wofford will open the tournament at 3:00 pm on Friday.

Drew Gibson Honored By Southern Conference

SPARTANBURG, S.C. – Wofford College men's basketball student-athlete Drew Gibson received several All-Southern Conference honors this week. He was named to the Coaches All-Southern Conference team and named All-Southern Conference third-team by the Southern Conference Sports Media Association.

Gibson, a senior guard from Los Angeles, California, leads the Terriers with 6.0 assists per game and is second on the team with 11.9 points per game. Among the Southern Conference, he is third in assists (6.0 apg), third in assist/turnover ratio (2.15), fourth in minutes played (33.07), fourth in free throw percentage (79.7%), ninth in three-point percentage (41.5%), and 16<sup>th</sup> in scoring (11.9 ppg).

At Wofford, he is second all-time in assists with 395. His 211 steals are third all-time in school history. Gibson has scored 995 career points, five shy of becoming the 38<sup>th</sup> player in school history to reach the 1,000 point mark.

Wofford finished the regular season 15-15, the most wins since the 1994-95 season. The Terriers will open the Southern Conference Tournament on Friday, March 7 at 3:00 pm against Western Carolina. The winner of the game will face top-seeded Davidson on Saturday at 2:00 pm.

#### Men's Basketball Wins 58-49 Over Western Carolina

NORTH CHARLESTON, SC - The Wofford College men's basketball team defeated Western Carolina 58-49 in the opening round of the Southern Conference Tournament at the North Charleston Coliseum. The Terriers advance to play Davidson at 2:00 pm on Saturday.

Wofford is 16-15 overall and 8-12 in SoCon play. Western Carolina is 10-21 overall and 6-14 in conference play. The Terriers were led by Noah Dahlman with 16 points and Corey Godzinski with Corey Godzinski with 13 points. Tim Johnson had eleven rebounds for Wofford. Western Carolina was led by Jake Robinson with 14 points and Blake Gallagher with seven rebounds.

"Nothing is easy in our league and we knew going in that this would be a tough one," said head coach Mike Young. "It was another grind it out affair and it was tough in the second half. Our senior guards were outstanding. Drew Gibson was superb and Nichols and Salters made some big shots to get us the win."

The Terriers scored first on a basket by Tim Johnson and were up 9-5 at the first media timeout at 15:42. The Catamounts tied the game at 9-9 with a basket by Jake Robinson, but Wofford regained the lead with a jumper by Corey Godzinski at 11:24. A lay-up by Noah Dahlman gave the Terriers a five-point lead at 16-11 with 7:02 on the clock.

Western Carolina pulled within two, but Noah Dahlman gave the Terriers an 18-14 lead with 4:54 left in the first half. A three-pointer by Corey Godzinski pushed the lead to 23-14 just a minute later. Junior Salters added a bucket at 1:45 for a 25-17 advantage, however the Catamounts scored the final four points of the half to go into the break 26-21 Wofford.

To start the second half, the Catamounts scored on a basket by Arnold Gore to cut the lead to three. Wofford responded with a dunk by Corey Godzinski. After a basket by Terry Martin at 14:32, the Terriers had a 33-27 lead. The lead quickly evaporated and a three-pointer by Jake Robinson at 12:28 tied the game at 34-34. The game stayed tied at 36 each, then the Catamounts took a 38-36 lead after a basket by Negus McKenna at 10:30.

Wofford then went on a 7-0 run that began with a three-pointer by Junior Salters at 10:12 to go up 43-38. The run was answered by the Catamounts with their own 7-0 run, including five straight points by Jake Robinson, to go up 45-43 at 7:04. The run ended with back-to-back three pointers by Corey Godzinski to regain the lead at 49-45 with 4:02 on the clock.

After a basket by the Catamounts to cut the lead back to two points at 49-47 at 3:35, Wofford added a three by Shane Nichols and a lay-up by Noah Dahلمان to take a 54-47 lead with just 1:22 left. Wofford hit 4-of-6 free throws in the final minute to secure the 58-49 victory.

Wofford shot 41.7% from the floor and 26.3% from three. The Terriers were 56.5% from the line. The Catamounts were 36.5% from the floor and 15.8% from behind the arc and 61.5% from the free throw line. Wofford had a 38-30 lead on the boards.

Drew Gibson entered the game five points shy of 1,000 for his career; he hit his 1,000th point on a lay-up at 16:14 in the first half. The win was the first for the Terriers in the conference tournament since an 85-82 win over UNC Greensboro in 2004. Eric Wilson fouled out for the Catamounts with 29 seconds left in the game.

The Terriers next game will be against #1 seed Davidson at 2:00 pm on Saturday afternoon. The Wildcats were 20-0 in conference play this season and won both games against the Terriers earlier this year.

## Men's Basketball Falls 82-49 To Davidson

NORTH CHARLESTON, SC - The Wofford College men's basketball team was defeated 82-49 by Davidson in the quarterfinals of the Southern Conference Tournament at the North Charleston Coliseum. Drew Gibson led the Terriers with 24 points in his final game for Wofford.

Wofford ends the season 16-16 overall and 8-12 in SoCon play. Davidson is 24-6 overall and 20-0 in conference play. In addition to Gibson's 24 points, the Terriers were led by Noah Dahlman with ten points. Tim Johnson pulled down 13 rebounds. Davidson was led by SoCon Player of the Year Stephen Curry with 19 points and Bryant Barr with 17 points. Andrew Lovedale had eleven rebounds.

"I wish we could have made a better showing today," said head coach Mike Young. "We did not play well. I admire a lot about Davidson. They have a tremendous pressure to win and they came out today just like any other game and were exceptional. We were less than exceptional and I am glad we do not have to play them again this year."

The Wildcats scored first, but Tim Johnson tied the game with a basket. At 14:35, Davidson was up 11-3 after a three-pointer by Jason Richards. Back-to-back lay-ups by Noah Dahlman cut the lead to 11-7 at 13:30, but Stephen Curry hit a three to go up 14-7. Shane Nichols responded with a three-pointer of his own and after a basket by Junior Salters the Terriers were down 15-12 at 11:36.

Davidson extended the lead to 22-13 before Drew Gibson hit two free throws with 8:17 left on the clock. Noah Dahlman hit two free throws and then a lay-up for a 27-19 Wildcat lead. The Terriers were outscored 16-4 over the final 6:41 of the second half, as Wofford's only points came from four free throws by Drew Gibson. Davidson took a 43-23 lead into the break.

In the second half, Wofford opened with a three-pointer by Drew Gibson, but it was matched by Stephen Curry with a three. Drew Gibson added a jumper at 17:12 to cut the lead to 46-28. Stephen Curry answered with a three as the Wildcats as they began an 8-2 run to extend the lead to 54-30.

Davidson pushed the lead to 58-30 until Terry Martin had a dunk at 11:35 in the second half. Drew Gibson added a bucket to make it 58-34, but then the Wildcats went on a 13-2 run over the next four minutes to extend the lead to 71-36 with 6:48 on the clock.

Tim Johnson scored a couple big baskets for the Terriers to get the lead back to 73-42, then Drew Gibson made two free throws at 3:52 to make it a 73-46 game. But the Wildcats continued to score in the final minutes, taking the 82-49 victory.

Wofford shot 28.1% from the floor and 13.3% from three. The Terriers were 57.7% from the line. The Wildcats were 46.2% from the floor and 44.8% from behind the arc and 69.2% from the free throw line. Davidson had a 50-36 lead on the boards.

Drew Gibson and Shane Nichols ended their careers at Wofford. Gibson leaves with 1,027 career points and Nichols has 1,176 career points at Wofford. Noah Dahlman ended the season with 10+ points in seven of the final eight games. The game was the third this season against a team ranked in the top #25. The Terriers' 16 wins on the season were the most since the 1994-95 season and the most in Wofford's Division I-era.

A native of Wheeling, West Virginia, Prosser is the son of the late Skip Prosser. He graduated from Marist College in 2002, where he worked with the program as a student assistant coach. Prosser earned Street and Smith honorable mention All-America honors at Lawrenceville Prep.

Jay McAuley has spent the last season as a graduate manager with the University of Georgia men's basketball program. He handled a variety of tasks, including film exchange with opposing teams, video editing and assisting in preparation of scouting reports.

“Jay comes to us highly recommended from Coach Dennis Felton, who is a personal friend of mine,” said Young. “He is a native of Georgia and it is important to have a person on our staff who knows that state well. He will do a nice job for us.”

A native of Marietta, Georgia, McAuley won a roster spot on the Georgia team through open tryouts. He kept his place in the program for the four seasons as a walk-on. As a junior he
