"May" Your Hearts Always Be Joyful By Dr. Peter Brewitt

Spring course selection may be upon us, but if you look out to the horizon of the academic year, two wondrous opportunities for environmental studies students shimmer on the horizon, after graduation, in May.

The first is in Copenhagen, Denmark. Along with being a gorgeous fairy tale of a city, Copenhagen, and Denmark overall, is one of the world leaders in sustainability. If you want a glimpse of the near future, of green urban living, of stately old grandeur with bike lanes beneath it, of surprising hyper-local delicious food, you will find it there. Drs. Telligman and Salley are leading the course. Check it out.

The second opportunity, a totally different but equally rich experience, is in Patagonia, Arizona. Dr. John Simmons, working with Borderlands Restoration, is running a course in the high desert of southern Arizona. This

area, known as the Mountain Empire, is one of the wilder regions of the United States – they have jaguars there – but has been impacted by grazing and other development. Restoring natural function and habitat connectivity are important everywhere, but few places have more ecological potential than these mountains. Check it out.

I would be remiss here if I did not note that on Saturday Dr. Simmons was honored with Wofford's Distinguished Citizen award. A medical doctor for most of his professional life, he chairs the Lifelong Learning Advisory Committee, teaches meditation, helps run interim internships at the Tom Yawkey Wildlife Center, and (the way you probably know him) teaches our Health and the Environment course. In addition, he's just a wonderful guy. Environmental Studies and Wofford are lucky to have Dr. Simmons.

Middlebury Institute of International Studies – MA in International Environmental Policy

Middlebury Institute of International Studies, located in Monterey, California, is affiliated with the Graduate School of Middlebury College. It offers a Master of Arts in International Environmental Policy (IEP), which focuses on an international scope instead of just on U.S. policy issues. Four specialized tracks are offered in Natural Resource Policy & Management, Ocean & Coastal Resource Management, Intercultural Competence, and Sustainability Management.

Along with the core course and elective specialization course work, there is also a language of study and/or intercultural course work requirement.

This area of California is home to marine and ocean conservation and policy as well as the "greentech" revolution and other environmental groups and there are many opportunities to collaborate with these environmental institutions.
